He expects us to grow our gifts, use them wisely and be generous with them. Unfortunately, many of us are not generous in proportion to all that God has given us.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Alice Walker, famous for writing the novel "The Color Purple" also penned a short story called "Meridian," in which a little girl in the South is playing in the yard when she finds a piece of metal. She recognizes that this piece of metal could be a bar of gold, and she proceeds to fully expose and then lift the incredible, heavy bar from the ground. She rushes home to her mother, who is sitting on the porch, shelling peas. She exclaims, "Mother, I found a gold bar," and she places the large, heavy gold in her mother's lap.

Her mother says, "Move that thing out of the way. Don't you see I'm trying to get supper ready?"

"But it's gold," the daughter insists. "Feel how heavy it is. Look how yellow it is. It's gold. It could make us rich."

The mother, though, is not impressed. The girl is rejected, and no one is interested in sharing her joy. She takes the bar of gold and she puts it in a shoe box, then she buries it under the magnolia tree in the backyard. Once a week she digs it up and holds the bar of gold in her lap. Then, she does it less and less often. Soon it's only once a month, until finally she forgets to dig it up at all. In the end, she acts like everyone else, not as someone possessing a bar of gold.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "Hell is full of the talented, but heaven, of the energetic." Jesus in the Gospel today points us to the energetic. Given gifts by God and entrusted with talents, we are called to use them to spread the Good News for the glory of God. Burying them just won't do. Hiding our gifts under the cover of selfishness or apathy or doubt will only make us, as Alice Walker, says like everyone else, unaware that we possess a treasure. That's unacceptable!

In today's parable compliments come to those who have the gifts, and used them wisely - <u>used</u> them. Punishment comes to the one who buries the gift and then gives it back unused. Wicked and lazy are two words we don't want our Master to speak about us. We pray today that those words are never used about us. The treasure that is the Kingdom of God is too valuable to hide.

In our Archdiocese, one of ways people share and invest their treasure is through the Annual Catholic Appeal. Through the years, area Catholics have given hundreds of millions of dollars to support the work of the Archdiocese and to help those who struggle with difficulties in life. From support for Catholic schools to the education of seminarians, from caring for our retired priests to caring for those living with addictions, and from extending a helping hand to urban, suburban and rural residents of the diocese, the ACA allows so many to share and receive the generosity of Christ.

Amazingly, in a time of pandemic, Catholics in the Archdiocese raised over \$16 million, surpassing the goal of \$14.5 million. Parishioners of our parish contributed over \$160,000 of that money. I offer my thanks to all of you who participated in this important and beautiful effort.

I will be leaving this afternoon for a retreat in the Ozarks, a time to pray, read, rest and reflect. I'll return Friday. Please know that I will be praying for you.



Every person deserves to feel **Secure**, to be **Warm** and to have **HOPE!**


This year has been an unusually challenging year, that's for sure. One thing that has not changed, though, is the need for warm blankets for our homeless neighbors in downtown St. Louis.

We are dedicated to continuing our annual Blankets of Hope donation to St. Patrick's Center. There will just need to be a few changes this year. Since we will not be able to gather together to make the blankets, we are asking you to consider making your blanket(s) on your own. If you are unable to make a blanket, perhaps you can donate fleece to have a blanket made for you (you need two 2 yards x 2 yards pieces of fleece for each blanket).

The finished blankets or fleece donations can either be dropped off at the QAS Rectory during business hours, dropped off at 2793 Brandenberg Lane, or picked up from your house prior to Sunday, November 29. You can also drop off your finished blankets on November 29 at the QAS Cafeteria between 11 am and 1 pm.

These donated blankets will then be delivered to St. Patrick's Center where we know they will be greatly appreciated and immediately handed out to those in need of warmth. These blankets give the homeless physical and emotional warmth; they are a tangible sign of hope and love from people who care.

JESUS, TAKE THE WHEEL

"Jesus, take the wheel. Take it from my hands 'cause I can't do this on my own..." testifies singer, Carrie Underwood. She continues with, "And save me from this road I'm on." This slippery and bumpy road of life for most of us is void of peace and joy. We are overwhelmed with anxiety, worry, and even fear about many things. It is said that fear does not stop death; it stops life. Worry does not take away tomorrow's troubles, it takes away today's peace. But through Christ there is good news. We must patiently and lovingly surrender to the will of God to find the only sure way to genuine joy and peace.

In his October 22, 2020 submission to the *St. Louis Review*, Archbishop Mitchell Rozanski has charged us to live with boldness and not fear. Paraphrasing Ephesians 6:12, our real battle is against principalities and powers - let faith conquer fear. So how do we live boldly?

Since the origin of Adam's sin, we all tend to think about our own concerns first. But we must keep our focus on Christ, not on ourselves. The place to start is in prayer. St. Paul wrote, "Have no anxiety at all, but everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests know to God.

Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7, NABRE). In practical sense, this also means doing our daily duty and taking care of others, showing them love, respect, and compassion. For example, call a lonely loved one. Forgive someone who has hurt you and seek reconciliation. Genuinely ask a stranger how they are doing. Be good stewards and share the gifts that God has given you.

Do you want even more peace? Try living your Catholic faith ever more boldly. Receive the sacraments, the peace from Reconciliation, the intimacy of Christ in the Eucharist. Talk to God in prayer, meditate on the mysteries of the rosary, and put Christ first in all your plans. Seek His will.

Once we turn to Jesus in trust, we are ready to follow the advice of St. Francis de Sales, :If you earnestly desire to be delivered from some evil, or to attain some good, above all things, calm and tranquil your mind, compose your judgement and will; then quietly and gently pursue your aim, adopting suitable means." Jesus offers us His peace; if we accept it and use His grace, nothing shall overcome us.

How about letting your chauffeur and Savior, Jesus Christ, take it from here?






