FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Nine young soldiers had received overnight passes from their base camp. When morning came, not one of the nine was present. An hour after their absence was noted, the first soldier straggled back into camp. He was immediately taken before the company commander. "I'm sorry to be late, sir," the soldier began, "but I had a date, lost track of time, and missed the last bus. I wanted to make it back on time so I took a taxi. About half way back to camp, the cab broke down, so I went to the nearest farm and bought a horse. As I was riding the horse and heading back to camp, the animal suddenly fell to the ground and died. So I did the last few miles on foot and here I am. I'm sorry sir."

Although he was quite skeptical about the chain of weird excuses, the company commander let the young soldier off with a stern lecture on the virtues of punctuality. Thereafter seven more stragglers reported for duty, one by one, all late, and all with the exact same story! They all had a date, lost track of time, missed the bus, and took a taxi. They all took a cab, all their taxicabs broke down, and they all bought a horse. Amazingly, all the horses collapsed on the road and died.

Finally, the ninth and last soldier arrived. Now totally exasperated, the company commander growled, "What happened to you?" The ninth man replied, "Sir, I had a date and I lost track of time and I missed the last bus. I hired a taxi...." "Hold it right there, soldier. Wait just a minute!" yelled the officer. "Are you going to tell me the cab broke down?" "No, sir," the soldier insisted. "The taxi was fine. The problem was that there were so many dead horses on the road, we couldn't get through."

Our Gospel for today's Solemnity of Christ the King begins thus: "The ruler sneered at Jesus and said, 'He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God.' Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself.'" Even one of the criminals hanging alongside Jesus taunted him.

Why not? The claim of Jesus to be the Messiah and King was as incredible as eight soldiers riding soon-to-be-dead horses. Where was the army of Jesus? Where was the strategy to oust the Romans and restore Israel to the Zenith of power? What kind of king doesn't sit on a throne, but instead is nailed to a cross? With the commander we cry out, "wait just a minute!"

Of course, if we take just a minute, or celebrate a solemnity, or offer the Sacrifice of the Mass, we will be amazed at what Jesus our King does for us. The same Jesus who comforted the afflicted, cured the sick, forgave the sinner, and blessed the worried, is here today, doing the exact same thing for us. The same Jesus who introduced an Eternal Kingdom and welcomed the faithful to enter it, is here today with the same Good News and the same generous offer. It really is incredible and it is a noble endeavor to take a minute to consider the majesty of Jesus our King.

And play to him. A furious acting coach once gave this blunt piece of advice to a group of young thespians: "Pretend the king sits in every audience. Play to the King." Our King, Jesus, is in every audience, every day, in all that is the theater we call life. Let us play to the King. Give our best to the King. Serve our King.

I encourage you to come to Mass Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, at either 7:00 or 9:00. Eucharist, as you know, is Greek for Thanksgiving, and what better way is there for us to begin that day of family, festivity, and food, than by coming to God's House and God's Table and thanking God. At the 9:00 Mass, in addition to thanking our Lord, we will have a chance to thank Sr. Mary Michael, OSC, from the Poor Clare Monastery. As we come to the end of our 50th year celebrations, we take this Thanksgiving Day to thank the nuns who opened their doors to this parish in 1972 and gave the parishioners a place to pray.

Enjoy your Thanksgiving Holiday.

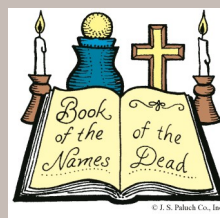
SVDP will be sponsoring our annual Thanksgiving Day Drive. This year the focus will be on paper and hygiene products such as:
