FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Benedictine Sister Joan Chittister includes this story in one of her books:

Many years ago, there was a village synagogue served by a rabbi beloved by his congregation. But the villagers became concerned because the old rabbi began to disappear from the synagogue after the opening of the Sabbath. Some were afraid that he was forgetting his responsibilities; some even worried that he was actually breaking the Sabbath; but some insisted that their holy rabbi must be being spirited up

to heaven by the great prophet Elijah himself, to discuss holy books in the presence of the Holy One.

One Sabbath night the villagers dispatched one of their number to follow the rabbi.

No sooner had the Sabbath candles been lit when the rabbi slipped out of the synagogue, walked quietly down the path and through the woods and up a tall mountain. The villager followed at a distance, careful not to be seen. The rabbi finally arrived at a small cabin. The spy watched as the rabbi entered the cabin, illuminated by a dying fire.

From a small window on the side of the cabin, the spy saw an old Christian woman lying on a cot, her breathing slow and her face pale.

The villager was stunned by what he saw next. After greeting the sick woman, the rabbi swept the floor. Then he chopped wood and fed the fire. Next the rabbi drew fresh water from the well and gently helped her drink. Finally, the rabbi made a kettle of fresh soup and set it by the small table near the woman's cot.

As the rabbi was preparing to leave, the villager raced down the mountain and through the woods back to the synagogue where the congregation waited.

"Well," they asked, some with disdain, some with hope, "did our rabbi go up to heaven?"

Their spy stopped for a moment before answering. Then he said, with respectful awe, "The rabbi did not go to heaven. Our rabbi went much higher than that."

Christ our King says in today's Gospel, "my kingdom dues not belong to this world...., my kingdom is not here." nor would it be, as the story suggests, a place where souls gather to discuss holy books. No, for Jesus, our Servant and King, the Kingdom is found in our midst and in our future through the quiet service of others, the awareness of their needs, the addressing of their plight. The Kingdom expands on Earth as each of us imitates Jesus, who came not to be served, but to serve. Whether it be in a mountain cabin, a St. Vincent de Paul Society Christmas donation, a visit to an elderly relative, or a few minutes listening to the excitable voice of a five-year-old, we have the capacity to make the Kingdom present now, albeit imperfectly, so that we may grow in anticipation of being with Christ forever.

Knowing Jesus is our King stirs our hearts to gratitude, which is fresh in our minds as we celebrate Thanksgiving this week. So, another story: A little girl said to her father, "Daddy, I'm going to count the stars," and outside she went. The father could hear her counting, "Two hundred and twenty-four, two hundred and twenty-five," and then, "Oh my, I had to idea there were so many."

The father was moved to remember the prayer he uttered, "O Master, I am going to count your blessings, but soon my heart sighs, not with sorrow, but burdened with such goodness, and I say to myself, 'Oh my, I had no idea there were so many."

Thanksgiving Day is just one day in which we praise and worship God for all the Lord has given to us. God is so good, and I encourage you to come to Mass Thursday and tell God that in the best way possible - through the Mass. There's no better way to thank the Lord.

Like so many of you, I am thankful to God for the life and faith of Tom Knese, our parishioner who last week passed from death to life. There's a long list of things Tom did for others, but like the rabbi mentioned above, Tom was the quiet servant, humbly bringing a taste of heaven through his generosity toward others. He will be missed. May he rest in peace.

And may God bless you all. Happy Thanksgiving.

These tags will range from


clothing and toys to household items or gift cards. Boxes will be placed in the vestibule where Giving Tree gifts can be deposited as you purchase them.






