**STEWARDSHIP
FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come." MATTHEW 24:42

The rest of us usually take for granted that we will be around tomorrow. But when you start to look at each day as a gift, you realize all the little miracles that happen daily and you begin to see God's active presence in your life. You grow in gratitude, each day, for all that we have been given.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

You may remember me speaking of Croagh Patrick, Ireland's holy mountain in County Mayo. Recall how I said last summer that when I went to Ireland for vacation my brother, sister, brother-in-law, and I intended to go to that sacred spot in Irish spirituality and climb its 2700 feet, remembering how St. Patrick once did so in order to pray to God before he obeyed God and brought the Gospel and the Catholic faith to the Irish people. Sixteen centuries later people come from all over Ireland and the world to imitate the climb of the saint and to gaze on the beauty of the land and the ocean visible at the top, realizing the presence of God in all that is seen.

It was in 2022 far, far more difficult than the last time I climbed Croagh Patrick in 1991. Age had slowed my body down and made my steps upon the rocks unsteady. I found the climb up very tiring and I was forced to stop several times to rest. I found the trip down unsettling as I had acknowledge that my balance was not as sure as it once it been. Spiritually, it was a fantastic day and I felt a kinship with my patron saint. Physically, the day was hard and punishing. And we drove a car to Croagh Patrick!

Yes, we woke up in a hotel that morning, had a leisurely breakfast, and then hopped in a car for the nearly thirty mile drive. We didn't ride a bike, like my father had done when he climbed Croagh Patrick. It's hard for me to imagine that. My dad and his friends riding bicycles through the Irish countryside, sometimes on unpaved roads, arriving at the holy site already tired. Then beginning the arduous journey to the top, followed by the skittish descent to the bottom. What an incredible undertaking. We drove there in a car. They rode on bicycles. What stamina they must have had.

Still, they were always in the same county; it wasn't like they travelled from six counties away. Which makes the line in today's First Reading even more astounding, "All nations shall stream toward it; many people shall come and say, 'Come let us climb the Lord's mountain'." Wow, if I was tired after driving to and then climbing a mountain, and my father would have been exhausted after bicycling to a mountain from within the same county, how tired would these people have been after walking to a mountain from a different country? What a journey they were willing to make. How they must have put aside their fatigue as they began their ascent. What determination they possessed as they made their way to the top, convinced they would be awestruck by the beauty of God they would see and the presence of God they would behold on the Lord's mountain. Physically whipped, sure, but what joy to be "instructed in his ways so we may walk in his paths."

Today is the First Sunday of Advent and a similar enthusiasm should be found in us as we seek the peak of God's goodness, not found now at the top of a mountain but in the person of God's Son, Jesus Christ. Now we travel by way of prayer and sacrifice to behold the love of God made manifest, first in the baby at Bethlehem, who became the preacher from Nazareth. Jesus is the one who travelled about doing good works. He is the one who would offer salvation for all who believe. He would be the one who died, and rose, to make it possible.

St. Paul urges us via his Letter to the Romans to know that this Advent Season is the time; "it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep...the day is at hand." An old poem puts it like this:

Listen to the Exhortation of the Dawn

Look to this day....

For yesterday is but a dream,

And tomorrow is only a vision:

But today, well-lived, makes

Every yesterday a dream of happiness,

And every tomorrow a vision of hope.

Look well therefore to this day!

Such is the salvation of the Dawn!

Truly, may we be awake as we begin this Season of Advent. Awake so we may pray. Awake for the vision of hope. Awake and ready to climb the mountain of the Lord, there to encounter the glory of the Lord.

May God bless all of you.




BLANKETS OF HOPE


