

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

God, as everyone knows, created the heavens and the earth and everything in them. And, as we are now aware, he created them through the use of words, for words, of course, are power. "Let it be done," God proclaimed, and it was done, and God saw how good it was.

The story goes, then, that God was especially proud and loving of the man and woman he made, because he had breathed into them a part of himself, that is, his spirit. But, not surprisingly, the

devil was jealous and angry. So one day when God was enjoying the man and woman, the devil casually happened to walk by. He sauntered up to God and asked him what he liked so much about these creatures. When God opened his mouth to speak, the devil craftily put a bond upon his tongue so that he could not speak! God could not talk! Since God's creative power was in his words, the devil had bound that power.

The devil laughed at God and quite had his way with the man and the woman. As the years went by, the devil would come back to mock God - the devil couldn't resist, it was his nature. He mocked God by scoffing at the silent deity and taunted the helpless God. God responded by holding up one finger.

"One?" asked the devil. "Are you trying to tell me that you want to say just one word? Is that it?"

Yes, God nodded, pleading with his soft eyes and urgent hands.

The confident devil thought to himself, "I don't suppose that even God could do very much harm with one word. Okay, God." And the devil removed the bond from God's tongue.

God spoke his one word, in a whisper. He spoke it for the man and the woman, and it brought them great joy. It was a word that gathered up all the love, forgiveness, and creativity God had been storing in his heart during his time of silence.

God spoke one word and the word he spoke was "Jesus."

This First Sunday of Advent urges us to prepare for that one person, that one who emptied himself of divinity so that he might save all humanity, including you and me. Jesus is that one born so tiny and frail in Bethlehem, yet, as today's Gospel informs, will be "coming in a cloud with great power and glory." This is the One for whom we wait, not only to celebrate his birth, but also to await his majesty, when Christ our King will rule triumphant.

Mindful of Christ's return, we do not, as the Gospel warns, let our hearts become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness, although for most of us those days are long in the past. But the Gospel also speaks of the "anxieties of daily life," this strikes closer to home. The pandemic is still here, along with inflation. Prices are rising, masks are still required in some places, the political world is a mess, and there's a looming difficulty with getting the supplies we need. Anxieties remain with us. But so does Christ, the one word God uttered to confound the devil.

The great fourth century bishop St. Athanasius wrote, "It was our sorry case that caused the Word to come down, our transgression that called out his love for us, so that He made haste to help us and to appear among us. It is we who were the cause of his taking human form, and for our salvation that in his great love Christ was both born and manifested in a human body."

Yes, this is the Christ who shares great love; Christ here for our salvation. Come, Lord Jesus!

Blood is amazing stuff. Did you know that adults have approximately 16 pints of Drive blood in their body at any given time? One collection unit of blood is about 1

pint. It takes roughly 14 hours for your body to replace a donated pint of blood. In the U.S. alone, 41,000 units of blood are used each day. Only about 5% of healthy Americans donate blood. Multiple donations account for over 80% of the blood used for transfusions.

There is no substitute for blood.

You have the power to help people you may not even know. All is takes is for you to roll up your sleeve and donate a pint of blood. Remember, whole blood and blood products such as platelets can't be manufactured; they can only be given freely through the compassionate generosity of donors.






