There are two important lessons here. First, we are called to be generous with our encouragement and hope with others. As God shows us mercy, we must be merciful to others. Second, joy is contagious! The joy we receive from doing good works not only strengthens us, it encourages others as well. Share the joy of living your faith whenever you can.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing this on the morning of All Saints Day and I'd like to share with you some words I came across as I prepared to celebrate this great Solemnity. It's a reflection on saints written by New York Times columnist David Brooks in his book <u>The Road to Character</u>.

"Occasionally, even today, you come across certain people who seem to possess an impressive inner cohesion. They are not leading fragmented, scattershot lives. They have achieved inner integration. They are calm, settled, and rooted. They are not blown off course by storms. They don't crumble in adversity. Their minds are consistent and their hearts dependable...

"Sometimes you don't even notice these people, because while they seem kind and cheerful, they are also reserved. They possess the self-effacing virtues of people who are inclined to be useful but don't need to prove anything to the world: humility, restraint, temperance, respect, and soft self-discipline.

"They radiate a sort of moral joy. They answer softly when challenged harshly. They are silent when unfairly abused. They are dignified when others try to humiliate them, restrained when others try to provoke them. But they get things done. They perform acts of sacrificial service with the same modest everyday spirit they would display if they were just getting the groceries. They are not thinking about what impressive work they are doing. They are not thinking about themselves at all. They just seem delighted by the flawed people around them. They just recognize what needs doing and they do it.

"They make you feel funnier and smarter when you speak with them. They move through different social classes not even aware, it seems, that they are doing so. After you've known them for a while it occurs to you that you've never heard them boast, you've never seen them self-righteous or doggedly certain. They aren't dropping little hints of their own distinctiveness and accomplishments.

"These are people who have built a strong inner character, who have achieved a certain depth. In these people, at the end of this struggle, the climb to success has surrendered to the struggle to deepen the soul."

I am blessed to know a lot of people like those described by Mr. Brooks, aren't you? The grace of Jesus Christ, so obvious in the saints of history, continues to beat in the hearts of the extraordinary people who pass in and out of our lives. We are blessed to "feel funnier and smarter" and holier when we're around them.

Tuesday and Thursday of this week are the Listening Sessions at Queen of All Saints for the Archdiocesan program, All Things New. More than half of the parishes in the archdiocese have had their session and my priest friends have told me they have gone well. In some places, sure, there has been angst and disappointment. In other places, parishioners knew changes were coming. One only has to look at all the empty pews on Sundays to realize that things can't stay as they are.

As we have done in the Archdiocese for several years, all the worshipers were counted at the Masses on Oct. 1 & 2, Oct. 8 & 9, and Oct. 15 & 16. Our counts were 1,077, 1,177, and 1,147 respectively. To compare with other years one finds that in 2019 - pre-pandemic - QAS averaged 1,476 per weekend. In 2021, while still coming out of the pandemic, we averaged 958 per weekend. So, obviously, we're better than last year but really not close to our numbers before Covid. We need to work on this!

The results of the surveys nearly 1,000 of you took earlier this year brought us an expected good news - bad news scenario. Queen of All Saints scored very high in our belief in the Eucharist, the Scripture and willingness to recommend QAS to others. We scored close to 90% in all three categories. That's very good! However, we scored poorly in our outreach to others. Nearly 75% invited someone to come with them to Mass less than twice a year. It was 76% of you who only once or twice a year invited someone to a parish activity. Worse, 81% have never invited a young man to consider the priesthood and 79% of you have never invited a young woman to consider the religious life. One of the reasons we have to have a program like All Things New is because of a shortage of priests. Where do you think future priests will come from if you don't ask them?

Please keep praying for All Things New. We've already seen the turbulence caused by decisions on two Catholic High Schools. We need the guidance of the Holy Spirit as we continue this process. We need your prayers.
