When you make a financial offering, is it from your "first fruits" or from what is "leftover"?



FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Catherine de Hueck Doherty was born to aristocratic parents in Russia in 1896. Barely escaping that country at the time of the Russian Revolution, Catherine and her husband settled in Canada. A convert to Catholicism, Catherine discovered a call from God to serve the poor. Part of her life's work would be in Canada, part of it would be in New York. Catherine died in 1985 and her cause for canonization has been accepted by the Vatican.

One time Catherine wrote: "When I think of all the people who have come through the Blue Door of our House of Hospitality in New York, my heart is full of gratitude. This is especially true when I think of God's little ones, the ones who are often known only to God.

"I remember only the first name of the person whose story I am going to relate. Maybe she never had a surname! Yet, I remember her very well. Every Saturday, rain or shine, cold or hot, she would come through the door. She would enter oh so softly and close the door gently behind her.

"Slowly, with tired step, she would walk up to my desk, and, after a few words of greeting, lay on top of it in a tidy row four dirty pennies. Then she would explain, almost in a whisper, that this is all she had left of her pay to give to Christ, present in the poor. Then, with a little smile and a bow, she would ask for our prayers. Slowly, bidding everyone present a soft goodbye, she would walk out through the door, closing it very gently as she had closed it coming in.

"She was a Negro, a widow. She earned her living by scrubbing a few offices at night. Her name was Martha.

"She brought her four pennies every week for four years. Then one Saturday, she did not come. I never saw her again. Months later someone along the street told me about a poor woman who was buried in an unmarked grave in a potter's field. I asked the woman's name. All they could remember was that her first name was Martha. Her surname? Nobody seemed to know."

At least this widow's first name was known. The poor widow in today's Gospel didn't even get that much recognition. Yet, she was complimented by Jesus Christ and, I'm sure, so would have been the widow Martha in the above story. Both widows were poor, but generous. Both quietly offered the best they could, and did it with dignity. Both gave tiny amounts, but built great treasures in heaven. Both cared for others before they cared for themselves. One impressed Jesus, the other impressed a future saint -and Jesus, too.

These widows provide for us sterling examples of generosity and trust. I've discovered many like them during my priestly ministry, including many here at Queen of All Saints. The goodness of so many, expressed not only in donations but also in service, inspires me to put similar trust in God and give not from my surplus but from my needs. Sadly, though, I have also encountered those who give only that they may have prestige, and, worse, those who give nothing at all. I pray that they hear God's command to be generous to others.

One wealthy man attended a parish mission and gave two dollars to the poor box as he left. On the way home he was caught in a storm and he crawled into a hollow tree for protection. The storm lasted longer than he thought, the tree began to swell from moisture, and the man couldn't extricate himself. Thinking he was going to be squeezed to death he began thinking of all the mean sins he had committed. Included in his list was the thought of the measly donation he had just made. Such miserliness made him feel very small - and he crawled right out.

Not quite the message the Gospel teaches. We don't want to be saved by the smallness of our generosity, but by the largeness. There are just too many examples of amazingly generous people for us to ignore, not the least of which is Jesus Christ, who emptied himself for our benefit. Let's pray to follow him, along with the aforementioned two widows, as we share the blessings God has given to us.

A special thanks to the men and women who have served our nation in the military. Your willingness to volunteer and defend our country has helped us all. Thank you for your service. Know that you will be in my prayers this Veteran's Day.

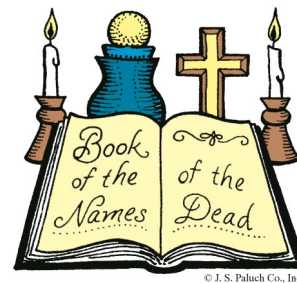

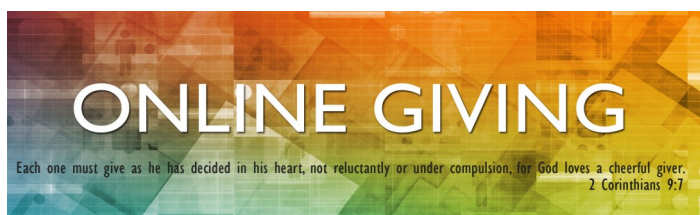
