#### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

There was a college student who worked in the dormitory dining hall and who, on her way to work early in the morning, walked past the home of one of the professors. Through a window she could see the light on and the professor working at his desk, morning after morning.

At night, the student stayed at the library until closing, and on her way home she passed again by the professor's home and again saw him at the desk, poring over his books and examining his notes.

One day, the student and the professor crossed paths on the sidewalk and the student couldn't help herself. She applauded the learned man and asked, "Do you mind if I ask you a personal question?"

"Not at all," the professor responded.

So, the student said, "I'm up early to go to work because I need the money to pay my tuition. I'm up late at the library because I want to do well in my classes and earn my degree. But you, you're a tenured professor, your position on the faculty is secure, you've reached the top of your field. Why, then, do I always see you working every day, early and late?"

The professor answered, "Well, you see, I would rather have my students drink from a running stream than a stagnant pond."

Today's First Reading portrays Wisdom as a woman, always making her rounds, seeking those worthy of her. She is particularly pleased with those who watch for her at dawn or who keep vigil for her, pleased to find Wisdom sitting by the gate. She is gracious to all prepared to meet her.

Jesus in the Gospel similarly promises good things - the abundance and joy of a wedding reception - to those who are vigilant, ready and willing to do what's necessary to greet the Lord when He comes. In the Gospel, that meant making sure they had enough oil to keep their lamps burning so that the bridegroom easily could join his bride. For us, that means prayer, the Sacraments, especially Holy Communion and Confession, service to others, and a willingness to put forth the extra effort in imitation of Jesus, who did so much for us. Doing so enables us to have running streams of love, mercy, and generosity, rather than a stagnant pool of nothingness.

I am grateful to all who worked hard to make last Monday evening's All Souls Mass so beautiful and meaningful to the family members of our deceased parishioners. Many people told me after Mass how touched they were by our concern for their loved one and how appreciative they were of our prayer.

Speaking of prayer, please say one or more for the second graders of our parish. On Tuesday or Thursday they will receive their second sacrament as they make their First Confession. Ask God to bestow beautiful mercy upon them and to inspire them - and all of us - to seek his love in this sacrament often.

# The Effects of Anointing of the Sick

As mentioned in my last article, Anointing of the Sick has a number of effects that are often misunderstood. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists four specific graces that come from the sacrament, all of which help the Christian to remain steadfast in the midst of their suffering, as well as to enable them to unite their suffering more closely with Christ's own Passion. These four graces mentioned by the Catechism can help us to more clearly grasp the purpose of the sacrament.

The effects of Anointing of the Sick outlined by the Catechism have both an individual and an ecclesial dimension. First, the anointed person receives a "particular gift of the Holy Spirit," that provides the person with the "[strength], peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age." This grace enables the recipient to resist temptations to despair with the help of the Holy Spirit, who "renews trust and faith in God" in order to "lead the sick person to healing of the soul." (If physical healing is the will of God, then this also is given.) This sort of grace is absolutely crucial for sustaining in hope all who face suffering through illness or impending death. But Anointing of the Sick also expands human freedom with regard to suffering.

An additional aspect of the grace given by Anointing of the Sick is a gift of union with Christ's Passion.

According to the Catechism, the sick person is consecrated [i.e., set aside for a sacred purpose] "to bear fruit by configuration to the Savior's redemptive Passion." In other words, the suffering that we experience as a consequence of fallen human nature can be imbued with sacred meaning and reoriented as a participation in Christ's own saving mission. In this union of one's sufferings with Christ's, the third effect, a special ecclesial grace, emerges. This ecclesial grace is twofold: the whole Communion of Saints "interceding for the benefit of the sick person," and the sick person "contributing to the sanctification of the Church and to the good of all men for whom the Church suffers and offers herself through Christ to God the Father." Anointing of the Sick thus gives its recipients the opportunity to participate in Christ's saving mission at their weakest moments, even unto their final breath.

The last grace mentioned by the Catechism is that of a final preparation for death. As the Catechism states, the Anointing of the Sick, "completes the holy anointings that mark the whole Christian life: that of Baptism which sealed the new life in us and that of Confirmation which strengthened us for the combat of this life." Just as Christ's own suffering and death became prerequisite instruments of his Resurrection and Glory, so too does the death of the faithful Catholic undergo a radical transformation. Death and suffering no longer have the final say, as the tomb has become for us naught but a doorway to life eternal. We now participate in both the death and the resurrection of Jesus, through his sacraments. Anointing of the Sick prepares us for that final sprint into the house of the Heavenly Father.






#### NJHS LUNCHES FOR ST. PATRICK CENTER
