STEWARDSHIP The Baptism of the Lord

"John answered them all, 'I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit...'" (Luke 3:16)

The Catholic Catechism states that *Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for* all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus - the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

FROM OUR PASTOR





Dear Parishioners.

Look closely at the Seal of the Archdiocese of St. Louis above. You will notice at the ends of both the horizontal and vertical parts of the cross a Fleurs-de-lis, that is, the flower called lily. There's an interesting story behind the use of lilies on coats-of-arm and seals.

In the early sixth century a man named Clovis was King of the Franks. Aware of God in his life, Clovis went to Bishop Remigius of Rheims to receive the sacrament of baptism. After baptism, the bishop took away Clovis' coat-of-arms, which showed three frogs, and replaced it with a coat of three lilies. The frogs, thought the bishop, were a symbol of ugliness, while the lilies were a symbol of beauty and purity. Clovis kept his new coat-of-arms as he joined other kingdoms together to create what we call today the nation of France. The Fleurs-de-lis has ever since been the coat-of-arms of French kings, including King Louis IX, for whom this archdiocese and metropolitan area is named. To show, then, the connection of our archdiocese to St. Louis, the French king, our Seal has the Fleur-de-lis attached to the cross of Jesus Christ. And that connection all started at the baptism of Clovis on Christmas Day, 508 A D

I'll bet King Clovis never forgot the date of his baptism. I found out mine when I had to get my baptismal certificate to enter the seminary. It's March 18th. I've not forgotten it since. What's the date of your baptism?

Catholic writer Mark Searle once wrote: "There was for many centuries the custom in the Roman Church of celebrating the anniversary of Baptism. It was sort of a 'class reunion' for the baptized, their sponsors, and the bishop who had administered the sacrament. At this celebration they gathered for the Mass on what might be called their Christian birthday. The sense of the occasion is well caught in the opening prayer of the Mass:

O God, by your providence, the memory of the things that happened remains, while all that we could hope for in the future has been promised. Let the solemn occasion which we recall be permanently effective in our lives, so that we may remain faithful in practice to what we commemorate now.

If ever the celebration of Christian initiation begins to play the role in Christian community life that it used to play in the past, when it was the great community festival of the year, perhaps such annual reunions of the baptized will revive also. In the meantime, a growing awareness of our baptismal identity may make it more common for Christians to know at least the date of their baptism and to give thanks to God for his mercy on each successive anniversary."

I know for me March 18th is a special day every year, a day of gratitude, joy, and rededication. It's a day when I remember what an honor it is to be a Catholic and what great blessings I have received through my Catholic faith.

So what's the date of your baptism? I encourage your to find out. If you know the church where you were baptized you may call and ask for a copy of your baptismal certificate. If the church is now closed, you may call the Archdiocesan Archives. If you were baptized outside the archdiocese, you may follow the same process - either the church itself or the Chancery of the diocese where the records of closed parishes are kept. Find out, and celebrate that day each year, making that day different from the rest - because it is.

I'm sure Jesus never forgot the day of his baptism. What a day that must have been. The Holy Spirit descended, the Father spoke, and God's favor embraced His Son. From this baptism Jesus went forth to save us from our sins and open for us the gates of Heaven. What a powerful, beautiful day that would have been for Jesus, just like our baptismal day was - and is - for us.



A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world. Through special initiatives and in daily prayer, may an impassioned plea arise to God, the Creator and love of life, from every Christian community, from every group and association, from every family and from the heart of every believer.

Evangelium Vitae

The over 60 million abortions since the 1973 decisions of *Roe v. Wade* and *Doe v. Bolton* reflect with heartbreaking magnitude what Pope Francis means by a "throwaway culture." However, we have great trust in God's providence. We are reminded time and again in Scripture to seek the Lord's help, and as people of faith, we believe that our prayers are heard.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children": "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion."

As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of <u>prayer</u>, fasting and/or giving alms. Another way to take part is through participating in special events to observe the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. Call your local diocese or parish to find out what events might be taking place in your area.


