FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Armstrong Williams is an entrepreneur, TV and radio host, and a syndicated columnist. Born in 1962, he was one of ten children. His family was poor, squeaking by on whatever they could earn from a 200 acre tobacco farm in Marion, South Carolina.

Williams loves to tell the story about the summer day when his father sent him to town to buy wire and fencing for the farm. At age 16, and newly-licensed to drive a motor vehicle, Armstrong was excited to drive the family truck into town and

perform this important errand...until...until his father told him to ask for credit. Armstrong feared that what he had seen happen to other black men would soon happen to him. He would have to stand there in front of the owner, head bowed, embarrassed as the white customers stared. He would be grilled with a series of questions, probing questions that would determine whether or not credit would be given. He'd seen it before; blacks turned away, black people leaving the store dripping with shame.

When he took his purchases to the counter, he said cautiously, "I need to put this on credit." The middle-aged farmer standing next to him gave him an amused, cynical look. Armstrong wanted to melt into the floor. The owner's face, though, didn't change at all. "Sure," he said easily. "Your daddy's good for it." Then he turned to the white farmer and pointed at Armstrong, saying, "This here is one of James Williams' sons." The old farmer smiled and nodded in a neighborly way, and young Armstrong was filled with pride, James Williams' son. Those three words had opened a door to an adult's respect. It was that day, Armstrong recalls, when he discovered a good name could carry with it a capital of goodwill, and that keeping the good name of his family was an important responsibility.

Jesus says in today's Gospel, "I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist." Did you think such a statement went to John's head? Caused arrogance? Gave permission to stop proclaiming the advent of one "who is mightier than I?" Or did John, like the teenager Armstrong, feel a puff of pride and then get back to work? Surely recognition from the one whose sandal strap John felt unworthy to tie must have energized John to continue calling people to repentance, baptizing them with water, and imploring them to be on the watch for the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." It's great to have a special moment of recognition; it's better to do the work to which one has been called by God.

John the Baptist would agree with the words of an unknown poet:

If I can throw a single ray of light across the darkened pathway of another; If I can aid some soul to clearer sight of life and duty, and thus bless my brother; If I can wipe from any human cheek a tear, I shall not have lived my life in vain while here.

If I can guide some erring one to truth, inspire within his heart a sense of duty; If I can plant within my soul of rosy youth a sense of right, a love of truth and beauty; If I can teach one man that God and heaven are near, I shall not then have lived in vain while here.

John the Baptist did not live in vain. As Jesus said, John didn't have the fine clothing nor live in a fancy palace. But John's message was authentic. He was the messenger sent to prepare the way, the light to be extinguished so that the Light might shine forever. So are we. We also are sent by God. We also shine for a while so that Christ might shine always. This is our responsibility. We ought to be filled with pride. For a moment, for a little while. Then it's back to work, preparing to meet the Lord when he comes.

Last Wednesday the second graders from our Parish School of Religion made their First Confession. This week the students in our day school will do the same. Please keep these precious children of God in your prayers. May they always be aware of the Lord's mercy and seek it when they have done wrong. The love of the Father that comes through Jesus Christ is amazing. May these children always seek that love.

As you may notice elsewhere in this bulletin, my classmates and I celebrate on Wednesday our 37th anniversary of ordination. It's been a wonderful life and I thank God that you are part of it.





The Committee will be Co-Chaired by Mike Schaeffer and Terry Werner. They anticipate most work will be one Saturday morning per month plus other times as required.


Flock Note detailing tasks and number of volunteers needed will be sent out in advance.

The last clinic will be on December 30, 2022 from 10-11:30am at Assumption.




