### Stewardship

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A man went to the pastor and complained: "Life is unbearable. There are nine of us living in one room. What can I do?"

The priest answered: "Take a goat in the room with you." The man is incredulous, but Father insists, "Do as you are told and come back in one week."

A week later the man comes back, looking half dead. "We cannot stand it," he exclaims "the goat is dirty, eats everything, and is constantly noisy." The priest replies, "Go home and let the goat out. Come back in a week's time."

A week later the man arrives at the rectory door, beaming. Through his broad smile he proclaims, "Life is beautiful, Father we enjoy every minute. There's no goat, only the nine of us."

The appearances of a goat may not do much for us, but the appearance of the Messiah should. St. Paul in today's Second Reading implores the Thessalonians to "Rejoice always." The prophet Isaiah boasts, "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." Today, on this Third Sunday of Lent, the Church celebrates Gaudete Sunday, Gaudete being Latin for rejoice. As the celebration of the Birth of our Lord draws near, the Church assures us that we have reason to rejoice.

Too often, especially in these days of a pandemic, we can feel like the guy who lives with eight other people in one room. We're anxious, uncomfortable, wary. An upheaval that began in March continues still. The wondrous atmosphere found in gatherings of family and friends seem like smoke, ready to be blown away. It's like we have a goat in our house. Everything is messed up.

Yet, faith demands that we lift up our heads and allow our eyes to behold the coming of the Lord, travelling to us on highways that we have prepared, on roads we've made straight. Currently, this is not the easiest thing to do. But Isaiah was speaking to a people who had been forced into exile, and Paul was writing to new Christians who had been mistreated by their fellow countrymen. Nevertheless, both urged believers to rejoice - heartily and always. We do the same as we travel through Advent, even in a topsy-turvy world. Following St. Paul's admonition, we pray without ceasing, we don't quench the Spirit, we test everything and we retain what is good. And we know, of course, what is best - Jesus Christ, coming to save us all. Thus, we could mimic the man above standing at the door, beaming, "Life is beautiful, we enjoy every minute. The Messiah is with every one of us."

May God bless all of you.





### Ite Ad Joseph: Go To Joseph



### From Our Seminarian Jake Braun

On December 8, 1870, Blessed Pope Pius IX proclaimed St. Joseph to be Patron of the Catholic Church. Now, one hundred and fifty years later, on the anniversary of this proclamation, Pope Francis has declared that this liturgical year (2020-2021) will be the Year of St. Joseph. While many who drink in the milieu of our modern world tend to view masculinity as toxic and fatherhood as superfluous, St. Joseph stands out as a strong father to imitate and a powerful patron to implore. For a world that needs good men – good fathers – more than ever, there is no better saint than St. Joseph to ask for help.

The picture included in this article is of the ciborium (also referred to as a baldacchino) that stands above the altar of the St. Joseph Chapel at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary. Inscribed on the front of the structure is the Latin phrase, "Ite ad Ioseph," which translates, "Go to Joseph." The phrase is actually a quote from the Old Testament, referring to the son of Jacob who was sold as a slave into Egypt, before eventually becoming the head of Pharoah's household. Joseph's journey from the shackles of slavery to fortune and freedom are evocative of Jesus' foster father, Joseph. Just as Joseph was chosen by God to be a wise and prudent custodian for the household of the King of Egypt, so St. Joseph was chosen by God to be the leader of the household of the King of Kings. Just as the Old Testament

Joseph used his freedom and wealth to feed a people starving for food, so St. Joseph freely became foster father of God's Incarnate Son in order to provide a redeemer for a world starving for salvation. Now, the Church provides us with a new encouragement to go to St. Joseph, our spiritual father, to ask for his intercession and to imitate his holiness, courage, and love.

To these ends, many opportunities for plenary indulgences are given by Rome for various acts of devotion to St. Joseph. Next week, I will elaborate on some of these opportunities. For now, I will just leave you with a prayer to St. Joseph, from Pope Francis' document *Patris Corde [With a Father's Heart]:* 

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

The trees have shed their leaves, the wind blows cold, and the sky is often cloudy and gray. Welcome to the season of Advent. But, don't despair. God has a special gift for you that He wants you to unwrap right now. That gift is hope.

Many of us recognize the Merriam-Webster definition of hope which is to cherish a desire with anticipation or to expect with confidence, to trust. In these uncertain times with COVID, political, and social uncertainty, this version of hope is hard to grasp. But, there is a more genuine and transformative hope. It is a hope that is a gift from God and an act of the will. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes it this way:

The virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every man; it takes up the hopes that inspire men's activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of heaven; it keeps man from discouragement; it sustains him during times of abandonment; it opens up his heart in expectation of eternal beatitude. Bouyed up by hope, he is preserved from selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from charity (CCC 1818).

St. Paul expresses his gratitude for the gift of hope by saying, "...and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Rom 5:5 RSV, SCE). This is a selfless, theological virtue we know as hope. And, while it comes with joy, the rejoicing is over suffering "knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces

character, and character produces hope" (Rom 5:3-4). St. Paul's rejoicing recognizes that his hope is in the Lord and the anticipation of everlasting happiness with God.

Some may ask, "Well that's wonderful and lofty but what about me today?" "My parents are sick. My children are driving me crazy. My eldest son won't talk to me, and there are grandchildren I have never met. I don't know how to stretch my paycheck this thin. I am losing hope. I am losing faith. Why doesn't God answer my prayers?" With a hope that leads us to Christ, step back and ponder from God's perspective. Am I asking for the wrong things? Am I asking for God to take free will away from someone else? Am I forgetting the times God has answered my prayers both big and small? And, perhaps, is God already working on answering my prayers and I am simply having a hard time being patient? We say 'Lord your will be done' but we want God to see things the way we do and give us what we want when we want it. As Fr. Corey Cole, SM said, "Let God transform us to be more like God, not God more like us."

This Advent season, let's unwrap and use the free gift of the Spirit, to have a real and genuine hope for what truly matters. Remember the words of Pope Francis, "Hope is God's gift that draws us towards life, towards eternal joy." What are you hoping for? Unwrap your gift today!
