# FROM OUR PASTOR

### Dear Parishioners,



There is an old Jewish-Christian tradition which says:

God sends each person into the world with a special message to deliver, with a special song to sing for others, with an of act love to bestow.

No one else can speak my message, or sing my song, or offer my act of love.

These are entrusted only to me. According to this tradition, the message may be spoken, the song sung, the act of love delivered only to a few, or to all the folk in a small town, or to all the people in a large city, or even to all those in the whole world.

It all depends on God's unique plan for each person. To which we might add:
The greatest gift of God,
one would think,
is the gift of life.
The greatest sin of humans,
it would seem, would be to return that gift,
ungrateful and unopened.

Within a week we will be celebrating the birthday of God's greatest gift, His Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ. Surely the players in today's Gospel story of the Visitation had no idea that their words and actions in that small unnamed village in the hill country would echo through the centuries to the present day. Fame was not on the mind of Mary and Elizabeth. Gifts from God were.

Elizabeth, thought to be barren, too old to deliver a child, rejoices at the sight of Mary entering her house. Her unborn son, soon to be named John, leaps in the womb, an obvious recognition of a gift from God. Mary, likewise, is cognizant of God's blessings. Having been told by an archangel that she would birth the Savior of the world, she now stands in Elizabeth's house, her heart bursting with appreciation and her lips ready to shout "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God, my Savior." God's gifts to these two women would not be returned unopened.

As far as Mary and Elizabeth knew, I'm sure, all this happiness and excitement would stop with Elizabeth's husband, Zechariah, and Mary's betrothed, Joseph. That would be it - a "message delivered only to a few." God, of course, had other ideas, and the way these two women embraced God's gifts, loved God's gifts, and shared God's gifts - John the Baptist and Jesus - inspires us even now. The Nativity of Jesus Christ reminds us that the gift of the Father is still being delivered by the Son - to you. No one else, as the poem goes, can speak your message. No one else can sing your song. No one can share your act of love. This gift, this Child, is entrusted to you, and me.

While the gathering of family and the exchange of gifts are heartwarming and genuine, we cannot forget the responsibility we each have to share the love of the Holy Infant. Gratitude for Christ swells our hearts to the breaking point. Joy at His Birth causes us to leap in happiness. This is one Gift we can't wait to open. This is one Gift we will not return clouded in ungratefulness. That would be a great sin.

Know that I write on behalf of Fr. Detwiler, our deacons, and the staff of our parish, in wishing you and yours a safe, happy, and sacred Christmas. You will be in our prayers throughout these remaining days of Advent and Christmas. May the great miracle that is the Baby in Bethlehem penetrate deep into your hearts and cause joy to cry out with angels, "Glory to God in the highest."



I got up early one morning and rushed right into the day; I had so much to accomplish that I didn't have time to pray.


Problems just tumbled about me, and heavier came each task. "Why doesn't God help me?" I wondered. He answered, "You didn't ask."

Two opportunities are available with South County departures:



You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
