FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The picture to the right is entitled, 'The Adoration of the Shepherds' and it was painted about 1608 by the Dutch artist Peter Paul Rubens. I found interesting an article about this painting penned by Jem Sullivan, Ph.D., an associate professor at Catholic University of America and an expert on Christian art.

Sullivan's article pays particular attention to the various people gathered around the Christ Child. In the background, on the right, stands a smiling St. Joseph. Isn't that typical of him? Ever the humble and righteous man, Joseph does not seek to interfere or dominate. He is the Lord's humble servant and here he stands, content to savor while gazing up at the four-angel choir, who hold before them a scroll of the words they sing, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rest."

Our Blessed Mother, of course, remains close to her newborn Son, leaning toward Jesus as if to shield him from the chill of a winter night. With great care, Mary fingers the blanket's edge, preparing to warm her baby.

Jesus, as he should be always, is in the center, peacefully sleeping while the adults gather. As Dr. Sullivan notes, Rubens, like many artists of this time, provides a stark contrast of light and darkness. All the figures in this painting are at least partially in the shadows. Darkness still affects them. But not Jesus. The light glows from within and encircles him, and does so with no effort from the Child. What a brilliant light it is that appeared that night in Bethlehem!

The painting, of course, was done to honor the shepherds, as its name implies. In this work, two shepherds have come to Jesus following the announcements of the angelic choir. One, to the left, stands, still holding the shepherd's staff. The other kneels and looks back at his pastoral companion. The painting begs us to take note of their appearance. Both wear tattered clothing, barely protecting them from winter's cold. Both have muddy, bare feet. Obviously, both are poor. Yet it was to them the angels came. They were the first to see the Savior of the World. The warmth coming from the sleeping baby first touched their hearts.

I am particularly struck by the face of the kneeling shepherd, the one looking back at his friend. To me, his face has that "can-you-believe-this-is-happening-to-us" look. He is amazed at his good fortune, he is inspired while being blessed.

This, also, should be the look on our faces as we celebrate the Nativity of Christ. "Can you believe this is happening to us? Happening for us?" God the Father in his mercy has sent the Incarnate Word, Jesus Christ. Now we have hope. Now the Light shines. Now we join voices with Heavenly choirs and adore with poor shepherds. Jesus Christ is born!

St. Louis de Montfort wrote: "How sweet the name of Jesus sounds to the ear and the heart of a chosen soul! Sweet as honey to the lips, a delightful melody to the ears, thrilling joy to the heart."

Along with Fr. Detwiler, Deacon Rich, and Deacon Joe, I pray that your heart may have thrilling joy this Christmas Day. May the glory of God that first appeared in a manger reside in each one of you, may the sweetness of Baby Jesus surround you.

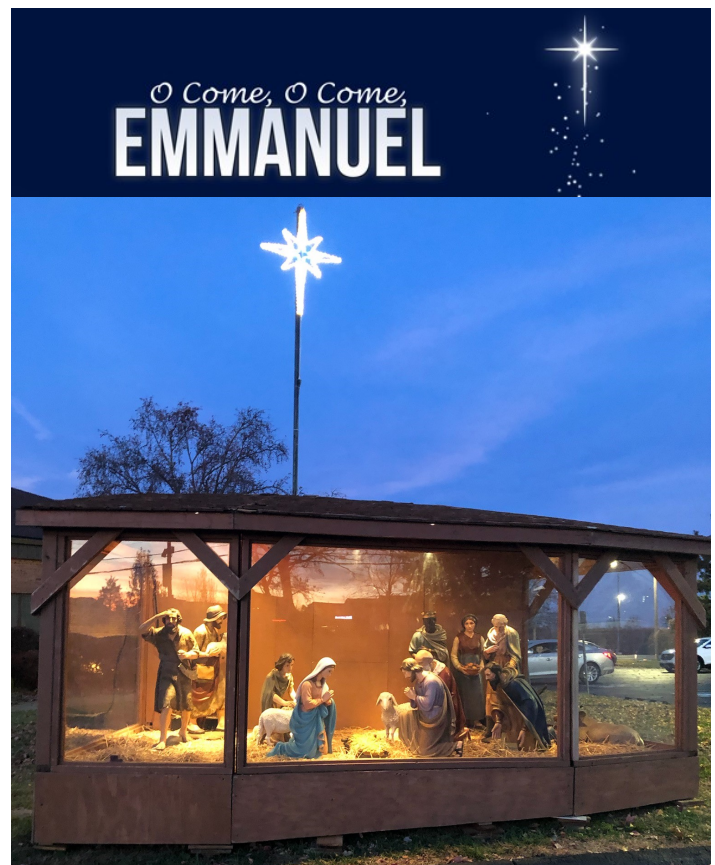

ALL THINGS NEW - SCHOOL SURVEY RESULTS

As part of *All Things New*, the Archdiocese of St. Louis is examining our parishes, schools, ministries and agencies, evaluating our effectiveness in proclaiming the Gospel. Our goal is to “make all things new” by Gospel renewal and to enhance our evangelization to secure a vibrant future for our current students, as well as their children and grandchildren, by creating an educational model that is accessible, affordable, strong in Catholic identity, and more equitable towards our teachers.

As part of this prayerful discernment, Archbishop Rozanski recently sought additional input and feedback from current parish school teachers, staff and school families about their Catholic school experiences. Nearly 1,900 teachers responded to their survey and more than 10,000 parents and guardians responded to their survey by answering both multiple choice and open ended questions.

You can see an overview of all the responses from across the Archdiocese of St. Louis, and results of each specific parish school at allthingsnew.archstl.org. The survey results from our specific school have been sent to our pastor and principal, and parts have been shared with our teachers, staff and school parents. They have provided excellent and important feedback to the Archbishop regarding your values and desires as they relate to the future of Catholic education in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Roses will be available during all the Masses on the weekend of 1/7 & 1/8. They should be filled in with your name and address, and returned at the end of Mass to a Knight, who will also gratefully accept whatever donation you are able to give.

The annual March for Life will take place in Washington DC on 1/20/23, and this year will mark the end of a U.S. Constitution-based right to abortion on demand. The Dobbs decision last summer corrected a mistake made by the Court's predecessors that any "right" to abortion cannot be and is not found in the Constitution. This does not mean that the struggle is over. In fact, now that each state's elected representatives can legislate their own specific regulations and laws concerning abortion makes it clear that we must continue to pray, witness, educate, and legislate our way forward to a time when all people can clearly see the truth that our Faith teaches us about the dignity of every human life from conception to natural death.

The Roses will be delivered in person to our elected officials in Washington D.C. by a Knight from our QAS Council. Please be generous toward this most worthy cause, continue to pray for God's mercy upon our nation, help us to support women, men, and families to choose Life, and thank you in advance!

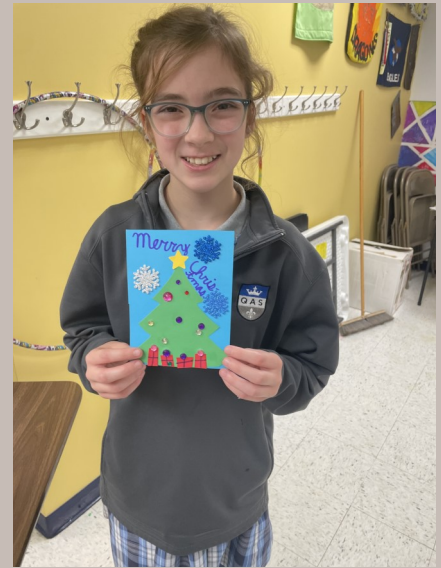
