From our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

A family once planned a month's vacation to the West Coast. At the last minute, the father was unable to go because of work responsibilities. The mother insisted she was capable of driving and she and the children went ahead with their trip. Dad helped plan the route and arranged where they would stop each night.

As it turned out, the father was able to complete his work in two weeks. He decided to surprise the family, so he flew to a West Coast city without calling them. Then he took a taxi out of the city and asked to be let off along the highway on which, according to the travel plans, the family should be driving later that day. When he saw the family car, he stuck out his thumb like a hitchhiker. As mom and the children drove past, they did a double-take. One of the kids exclaimed, "Mom, wasn't that Dad?" The car came to a screeching halt and the family enjoyed a wonderful reunion.

When a friend later asked the man why he did such a crazy thing, he said, "After I die, I want my kids to be able to say, 'Dad sure was fun, wasn't he?"

It doesn't appear that there were gleeful exclamations or funny shenanigans in the reunion described in today's Gospel on the Feast of the Holy Family. But I'll bet that when Jesus went with Mary and Joseph back to Nazareth their house was filled with joy. Sure, Jesus was obedient to them. Yes, Mary kept all these things in her heart. No doubt Jesus "advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man." Certainly, Joseph worked hard to provide for his family. All of that must have happened. Jesus, Mary and Joseph would have prayed, shared their love, and cherished their blessings. But I'll bet they also had a lot of laughs. I'll wager that years later Jesus would look at Mary and say, "Life in Nazareth sure was fun, wasn't it?" After all, holy people are fun, aren't they? Aren't we?

And generous. Contributions attributed to the super-wealthy John D. Rockefeller included \$2 million to the Cite Universitaire in France, along with the restoration of the Rheims Cathedral, the repair of the palaces at Versailles and Fontaine Bleu, and \$500,000 to the Shakespeare Memorial Theatre at Stratford-on-Avon in England , \$4 million for Acadia National Park in Maine, \$500,000 for Jewish farm development in Russia, 54 acres for a New York City park, \$3.5 million to the New York Public Library... the list goes on. John D. Rockefeller, however, did not decide how the money would be distributed. His son, J.D. Rockeffer, Jr., did. Shortly before his father's 94th birthday, J.D. wrote his father:

"I have tried to do what I thought you would have me do. I have endeavored to use wisely and unselfishly the means that you have so unselfishly placed at my disposal. In all these years of effort and striving, your own life and example have been to me the most powerful and stimulating influence. What you have done for humanity and business on a vast scale has impressed me profoundly. To have been a partner with you in carrying out these great purposes and benefactions has been the supreme delight of my life."

Words similar to those would have been addressed by Jesus, Mary and Joseph to the Heavenly Father. And words like that should be addressed by us to the Holy Family. They are a powerful and stimulating influence on us. They impress us profoundly. To imitate them and partner with them in this journey of faith is truly one of the supreme joys in life. And, sometimes, a lot of fun. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

I am grateful to all who made our celebration of the Birth of Christ so beautiful and inspirational. So many people contributed to the decorations before Christmas and to the Masses of Christmas Day. Queen of All Saints is blessed by your service.


