

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In World War II a soldier was on duty during the night watch as the Eve turned into Christmas Day. Before the war he had always gone to Midnight Mass, and the chaplain was offering such a Mass on the base, but his duty prevented him from attending. Since the priest had to move on to other bases, the soldier would not be able to pray at any Christmas Mass.

Since they were stationed on the outskirts of London this soldier and his buddies decided to walk toward the city, just as dawn was breaking. Soon they came upon an old, gray, stone building over whose main door were carved the words, "St. Ann's Orphanage." They decided to knock and see what kind of celebration was taking place inside. In response to their knock, a nun came and welcomed them inside, explaining that the children were orphans whose parents had been killed in one of the many bombings that took place in London. The soldiers went inside just as the children were tumbling out of bed. But there was no Christmas tree to encircle, no presents to share, not this year, not this Christmas. The soldiers, some of them still teenagers, were moved at the sight of these precious orphans, as they went around wishing all a Merry Christmas and offering whatever they could find in their pockets as Christmas presents: a stick of chewing gum, a Life Saver, a nickel, a dime, a pencil, a pocket knife, a good luck charm.

The solider who had gotten his buddies together noticed one little fellow alone in the corner, around the same age as his own nephew back home. He approached the frail youngster and inquired, "And you, lad, what do you want for Christmas?" The boy replied, "Will you hold me?" The soldier, tears streaming down his cheeks, picked up the boy and held him very close in his arms.

Surely, tears streamed down the cheeks of Simeon as he took baby Jesus in his arms when the Holly Family visited the Temple in Jerusalem. Jesus, of course, was no orphan but he was the long-awaited Messiah. For so long Simeon had been coming to the Temple, guided by the Holy Spirit, in anticipation of beholding the Savior of the world. Now this Savior is present, the light for revelation to the Gentiles, the glory of God's people Israel. What a privilege for this righteous man.

Joseph and Mary, too, experienced the joy and excitement of taking the promised Savior into their arms, an honor bestowed upon them by God, yet an honor not limited to the Holy Family at Bethlehem or Simeon at Jerusalem. This privilege is passed down to us, people called by God to embrace the Christ Child, to behold the infant who will promise us salvation. In Christ is found the assurance of pardon and peace, the light that shines in darkness, the hope of many generations. "Will you hold me?" Jesus asks this day. As did Mary, Joseph, and Simeon, will we cradle Jesus Christ? As did a homesick soldier, will we hold Christ close in our arms?

As you did last year, the good people of Queen of All Saints amazed me with your generosity and our St. Vincent de Paul Society touched me with pride. What a blessed pastor I am to be surrounded by so many good people who do so much to help those undergoing difficult times.

I appreciate, too, the members of the Home and School Association who presented the Living Nativity scene two weeks ago. It was great to see many families walk by, pausing for a prayer, and then a photo. Thanks for a fantastic event.

Still appreciative, I thank all who gave up their time to decorate the church and/or set up the gym. Your service, along with that of our musicians, cantors, and readers certainly enhanced the praise we offered God for the gift of the Christ Child. Thank you.

Finally, a word of gratitude to the many who sent us in the rectory Christmas greetings or dropped off delicious foods and treats. We in the house appreciate your thoughtfulness.

May God bless all of you. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us.



From Our Seminarian Jake Braun

The Christological Heresies

Now that Christ is born, it seems a fitting time to ask the question, "Who is Jesus Christ?" In the history of the Church, this question has led men to much error and much Truth, as our feeble, fallen minds seek to grasp the mysterious reality of God made man. So, for the next few weeks, I will be explaining some early-Church heresies about Jesus that are never really gone for good. This week, I will focus on a heresy called Docetism, which denies the full humanity of Christ.

Docetism was the first major Christological heresy -i.e., heresy having to do with Christ -in the long history of the Church. The word "Docetism" comes from a Greek word that means "appearance," as Docetism's main claim is that rather than truly becoming man, the Second Person of the Trinity only appeared to be man. The chief motivation for this heresy is not to deliberately lead astray the faithful, but to try and preserve the dignity of the Godhead, Who is pure Spirit. A God who is pure spirit, as the Docetist logic would go, could not possibly be born, or suffer, or die. To the Docetist, the claim that God Himself was born, crucified, and died would be an insult and blasphemy against God. However, their errant assertion flies in the face of what is found in the Gospels, namely that "the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us." Or as Christ Himself says to His incredulous disciples in the Gospel of Luke, after the Resurrection: "Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." Sadly, human pride, when wedded to a fallen mind, would rather worship a mistaken idea of God – one easier to grasp – than to wonder in humility at the mystery of a Divine Person with two natures

So, to sum up: Jesus Christ is *fully God* and *fully man*. The Second Person of the Trinity possesses the Divine Nature from all eternity, but also took on a human nature at the Incarnation. This means that the Second Person of the Trinity, God the Son, possesses a human soul, with an intellect and will, as well as a human body, with all of its senses and powers. Because of that human nature, it can truly be said that God was born, suffered, died, and was raised from the dead for the Salvation of mankind. But as we will see in the weeks to come, there are many distinctions to be made and concepts to be clarified before it becomes clear how one Person can have two natures. Stay tuned!
