## FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

A company of pilgrims were on the road, all carrying a burden of some sort, yet bearing them cheerfully, and thinking more of their journey than of its hardships, they went along together singing. An angel joined the little band of travelers, and passing from one to another threw into each of the burdens a couple of little white seeds. Soon the seeds began to sprout, until they became a glorious pair of wings which carried each traveler, burden and all, along the dusty road.

Later on, a similar party were making their way along the same road, with downcast faces. They greatly complained about the heavy burdens they carried. The angel passed again, but left them with no gifts of seeds that would become wings. "Why did you leave them no wings?" he was asked. "They look so downcast and gloomy, surely they need wings to uplift them more than others." "Yes," the angel replied, "these seeds are special and they can become wings to help people carry the heavy burdens of life. But they will flourish only in the cheerful and helpful; they will perish at once in that atmosphere of grumbling."

The readings today give us hope as we walk the path God has traced for us. Through Christ, the Father has made every effort to make our journey easier. As in days of old, as in the days of the prophets, like Baruch in today's First Reading, God has gone to extraordinary lengths to smooth the road before us.

Baruch speaks for God as he addresses the people of Jerusalem. Oh, they have been an awful people - selfish, greedy, and disobedient. They deserve to be clothed in misery and mourning, their terrible behavior earned them a lousy wardrobe. Now, though, the splendor of God's glory is shining. Get rid of putrid clothing; be wrapped in a cloak of justice from God. Once properly dressed, the people are ready to go outside and wait for their fellow citizens to come home from exile.

They had been dragged away in shame and had made the tough journey on foot. Now, they come back borne aloft on royal thrones. No need to climb high mountains, God has made them low. Don't worry about losing footing and tumbling into a gorge, God has filled in the gorge. Forests provide shade and fragrant plants sweeten the journey. Surely, this would be a group traveling with a song in their hearts and on their lips. No grumbling amongst this crowd.

The journey through life that we make is not based on a prophecy anymore, it's based on a person - Jesus Christ. John the Baptist urged all to prepare for Jesus, emphasizing the words of Isaiah, who like Baruch told of valleys filling and mountains lowered and all people experiencing the salvation of God. We await this salvation with great hope. No grumbling here!

God has done His part to make this happen. What are you doing? Last week our 2nd grade parishioners received their second sacrament as they made their First Confession. To a person, they all agreed that it was a special moment for them and they felt fantastic afterwords. The same will be true for you if you go to Confession, especially if its been some years since you've gone. Remember the story of the guy who was asked how many it took to convert him. "Two," he replied. "Two? How could that be! Didn't God do it all? "The Almighty and myself converted me," he insisted, "I did all I could against it, and the Almighty did all he could for it, and God won."

Advent is a time to let God win, let God smooth the way and straighten the road to our heart. There Christ may dwell providing the love and strength we need to travel with Him to the Kingdom.



# ADVENT WREATH SYMBOLS

(1) **Evergreen Wreath** - The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God (the Alpha and Omega). The evergreen is chosen as the base because God is the foundation of all good. Green is the color that represents hope and new life.

**Four Candles** - represent the four (4) weeks of Advent. Traditionally, each week represents one thousand years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the Birth of the Savior. The first two purple candles symbolizes (2) hope and (3) love respectively. The (4) third candle (which is pink/rose) symbolizes joy. The fourth and last purple candle represents (5) peace.

The light of the candles signifies the light of Christ to mankind.
