#### FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A visitor to the Philippines once wrote of an extraordinary man he met at an Easter Vigil Mass. The encounter happened after the Mass, in which 23 people had been baptized, received Confirmation, and had partaken for the first time of the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion. After the Mass, the visitor congratulated the priest on the large number of catechumens. The pastor waved off the compliment. "I appreciate your words," he said, and pointing to a man seated in the rear of the church, "but you should be talking to him. Most of the people baptized tonight came here because he invited them, and they stayed here because of the faith he shared with them."

The visitor went to the back of the church to talk with the man and immediately noticed that one of the man's legs was several times its normal size. Amazed that the man could have visited so many people, people whose homes were located in steep mountain regions, he asked, "How can you manage with that leg?"

"Oh," came the humble reply, "God gives me the strength to drag it along."

"But I hiked up the mountains," the visitor exclaimed, "I know how steep the trails are."

The man explained, "Then you can understand how God provides us with roots and saplings to pull ourselves along."

Isaiah in today's First Reading cries out, "Go up on a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news! ..Here comes with power the Lord God...."

This message, given so long ago, is delivered to us today so that we, too, as it were, climb the mountain to announce the coming of our Savior, even if we drag ourselves along to do so. The missionary mentioned above had a wounded leg. We have wounded souls, infected by the sins we have committed. (Which makes Advent a good time to go to Confession). However, these wounds don't prevent us from making known Jesus Christ, assuring a confused and frustrated world that there is still reason to hope, for as St. John the Baptist would say, "One mightier than us is coming." Jesus Christ will shepherd us. Jesus Christ will gather us into his arms, even if we've had to drag ourselves along to get to him.

I want to extend a word of thanks to the Knights of Columbus for erecting the manger scene on the front lawn. Your efforts are most appreciated.




### PRO LIFE CHRISTMAS CARDS




#### ADVENT RECONCILIATION WEEKEND



# FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN

#### **Holy Orders**

To conclude this bulletin series on the Sacraments, I would like to write briefly on the Sacrament of Holy Orders. While the whole Church is, as the Catechism states, "a priestly people," which shares in the priesthood of Christ, there exists a unique Sacrament by which some men, called gratuitously by God, are tasked with serving the Mystical Body of Christ, "in the name and in the person of Christ the Head." This Sacramental Priesthood, which differs in essence from the common priesthood of the faithful, exists in three degrees and entails three duties (munera). As Holy Orders can be neither earned nor deserved by those who receive it, and because the duties of ordination are beyond the strength of fallen creatures, recipients of Holy Orders also receive the aid of both special graces and an indelible character. I will touch on all of this in this week's column.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders includes three degrees of ordination to apostolic ministry: the episcopate, presbyterate, and diaconate. While only the episcopate and presbyterate entail ministerial participation in the priesthood of Christ, the deaconate is the degree of Holy Orders that serves the other two. Still, all three of these degrees are, "conferred by... the sacrament of Holy Orders." So, even though it is only priests and bishops who are sacerdotes, priests, St. Ignatius of Antioch says, "Let everyone revere the deacons as Jesus Christ, the bishop as the image of the Father and the presbyters as the senate of God and the assembly of the apostles. For without them one cannot speak of the Church." The ministerial priesthood is "a means by which Christ unceasingly builds up and leads his Church," oriented to serving the common priesthood of the faithful by helping to unfurl and cultivate the baptismal grace of all Christians. But none of this can be accomplished without the special effects of Holy Orders.

The effects of the Sacrament of Holy Orders are twofold: special character and grace. As with Baptism and Confirmation, Holy Orders imprints upon the soul of the recipient an indelible spiritual mark which configures the man to Christ, the Head of the Church. This permanent character, or mark, further enables the man "to act as a representative of Christ... in his triple office of priest, prophet, and king." In addition to this indelible mark, the man who receives Holy Orders is granted special graces, not only to be configured to Christ as Priest, Teacher and Pastor, but also according to the degree of his ordination. Bishops, for example, receive the grace of strength, so that he may be for his local church "a father and pastor, with gratuitous love for all and a preferential love for the poor, the sick, and the needy... identifying himself in the Eucharist with Christ the priest and victim, not fearing to give his life for his sheep." Priests are "united with the bishops in [priestly] dignity and at the same time depend on them in the exercise of their pastoral functions," as "prudent co-workers." Sacramental grace also ensures that deacons are "dedicated to the People of God, in conjunction with the bishop and his body of priests, in the service (diakonia) of the liturgy, of the Gospel, and of works of charity." The Sacrament of Holy Orders is impossible to write about in only a few hundred words, but hopefully you have found some helpful information here.

I will be taking a break from writing on the Sacraments for a time, but there is plenty to be covered in the weeks to come. Have a blessed Advent!
