FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Ted Engstrom wrote a book called "Integrity" in which he included this story:

'For Coach Cleveland Stroud and the Bulldogs of Rockdale County High school in Conyers, Georgia, it was their championship season: 21 wins and 5 losses on the way to the Georgia boys' state basketball championship tournament, where they won five more games, including a dramatic come-from-behind victory in the state finals.

'But now the new glass trophy case outside the school gymnasium is bare. Earlier this month the Georgia High school Association deprived Rockdale County of the championship after school officials reported that a player who was scholastically ineligible had played 45 seconds in the first of the school's five postseason games.

"We didn't know he was ineligible at the time; we didn't know it until a few weeks ago," Coach Stroud said. "Some people have said that we should have just kept quiet about it, that it was just 45 seconds and the player wasn't an impact player. But you've got to do what's honest and right and what the rules say. I told my team that people forget the scores of basketball games; they don't ever forget what you're made of."

This Wednesday - Ash Wednesday - we will be reminded what we're made of - dust. "Remember, you are dust, and to dust you shall return." it's a sentence made to strike us in the face with more than ashes. It's a sober sentence, filled with a stark reminder of our own frailty and mortality. It's meant to wake us up, uttered at the start of a season that's meant to wake us up. You are dust - don't ever forget what you're made of.

So, we start Lent with this grim reminder but we end it with the hope of what we can become by virtue of Christ's Death and Resurrection; not frail, but mighty; not mortal, but immortal; not dust, but saints. The philosopher Soren Kierkegaard put it this way in a prayer:

God in heaven, Let me feel my nothingness, Not in order to despair over it, But in order to feel more powerfully The greatness of your goodness.

Surely, this is a prayer we may offer to God. The ashes make us feel our nothingness; the Son of God brings us powerful goodness. Prayer, fasting, and charity secretly serve as our guide. The Father who sees in secret will repay us, and it will be in the greatness of His goodness.

Be excited, then, to enter into this Season that one of our prayers calls a "gracious gift." Be thankful for this gift and ready to make good use of it. Lent is not a gift that we place on a shelf. It must be important in our lives, bringing us closer to Christ, filling us with integrity. People may forget our actual practices of Lent, but they will not forget what we're made of - first dust, then glory.

May God bless all of you.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Abstinence means refraining from meat. **Fast** means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted).

All Catholics *from age 14 onward* (with no upper limit) are required to maintain *abstinence* on Ash Wednesday (February 17, 2021), all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday (April 2, 2021).

On **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**, *fasting* is obligatory for Catholics *from the ages of 18-59*. This fast is in addition to the abstinence from meat on those two days. No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation. Even if one were beyond the ages required to fast but are still capable of fasting, it is right to still join in the Church's penitential practices.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

All Fridays throughout the Church year, in a lesser way, participate in this Lenten practice of penance. Every Catholic is required to do some penance on every Friday. The normal penance is abstinence from meat, but it can be substituted with some other penitential practice (e.g., extra prayer, exercises of piety, works of charity, etc.).
