

Praying for our enemies doesn't change them, it changes us. Mercy and compassion will keep us on the path to holiness.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

One of the things our 50th Anniversary Committee want to do is invite priests once assigned to Queen of All Saints to come back and offer a Sunday Mass and then have a chance to reconnect with parishioners at coffee and donuts. These priests gave so much of themselves while assigned here and in return received so much from so many of you. That's how it works in Christianity, right? That's what happens when one follows the Lord's example of service. Blessings are returned—thirty, sixty, and a hundred fold. I'm

sure any priest assigned here would testify that he received such blessings during the ministry.

Thus, today we welcome back to QAS Father Brian Roeseler. While Father Roeseler did not serve here as a priest, he grew up in this parish, lived for a time in our rectory, and was ordained to the priesthood in June 2011 for service in the Diocese of Colorado Springs. He currently is Pastor of Corpus Christi Parish in that city. Please join me in welcoming Father Roeseler back to the parish that helped him to listen to the voice of Christ calling him to the priesthood.

Once upon a time in an Eastern city, there was a riot. The people were hungry and they blamed the Caliph for their plight. When he rode through the streets of the city, some of the citizens mobbed him, and one man, more desperate than the rest, caught him by his beard and yanked it hard, causing the Caliph to cry out in pain. Soldiers rushed to help the ruler, stopping the crowd which wished to inflict more harm.

Order was restored, and eventually food was distributed, and the people went on with their lives. But, a certain shopkeeper—Hassan by name—wanted to curry favor with the Caliph. He secretly sought an audience and when in the Caliph's presence he told him the name of the man who had pulled the Caliph's beard so violently. "His name is Khasim," tattled the shopkeeper.

The ruler sent for him. Khasim arrived at the palace trembling with fear. He threw himself at the Caliph's feet, begging for mercy. "Get up, Khasim. I did not send for you to punish you, but to warn you that Hassan is a bad neighbor; for it was he that told me that you were my chief assailant during the riot. Go in peace," said the Caliph, "and never trust one who tells tales to curry favor."

One person in this story knows how to make enemies, one person knows how to forgive them. Benjamin Franklin said: "Doing an injury puts you below your enemy,

Revenging one makes you but even with him,

Forgiving it sets you above him."

This is the place Christ wants us to be. In today's Gospel, Jesus encourages His disciples to love their enemies, certainly a startling thing for them to hear. Enemies should be crushed. Enemies should be destroyed. This is the kind of wisdom shared with the disciples by the elders when they were youngsters. Now, they surely thought, "we're supposed to love them?" Absurd.

Of course, so much of what Jesus taught sounded absurd or astonishing. Today's teaching would be one example. Jesus would counter that loving others is what everybody else does, but His disciples are not to be like everybody else, they're suppose to be like Him. Jesus came to love the just and the unjust, the saint and the sinner, the ones who followed Him and the ones who didn't. He expects His disciples to love others in the same way. This is no easy task, but our Lord promises to help us, for we are not tattletales seeking favor, nor doers of injury, nor hungry for revenge. We are people of mercy above all that, right next to Jesus Christ.

Our next ACTS retreat is next weekend and I'm sure the retreat team will welcome you if you want to go. Ask God about it. Give yourself a few days to deepen your relationship with Jesus. You'll be glad you did.



With more than one location, please click the "This is my main/primary location" circle to indicate where you are employed or, if you are a volunteer, where most of your ministry or service is performed.

Complete your personal information. Please enter your legal first name (no nicknames) for the purpose of the background screening.

Agree to the Terms of Use and click SUBMIT.

You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
