From our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Say this aloud, "I am going to die." Say it again, slowly, "I am going to die." There you have it, the message of Ash Wednesday and the Season of Lent. We are going to die. We best prepare for it.

Lent begins with ashes on our forehead and startling words spoken to us as they're put there, "Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return." In other words, we are going to die. The Season of Lent provides forty days to consider our mortality and by fasting, prayer, and charity draw closer to the One whose death and resurrection brings us immortality, Jesus Christ. Following the instruction of Jesus in the Ash Wednesday Gospel to fast, pray, and give alms allows us to discover in Lent not the dismal prospect of death but the joyful life of faith. Lent is not gloom and doom. It's a great season of grace.

Consider this story from Tanzania. Many years ago, two brothers prepared to leave their village to make their fortune in a distant country. Their father gave them his blessing, with this advice, "On your journey, mark your way lest you get lost."

The two brothers set off, the first brother entered the forest and, as he made his way, marked many trees with deep gashes; he even cut several trees down. He did this the whole length of his journey.

The second brother took a different route. Each evening as he came to a house, he would stop and knock on the door. He would be invited in and he made friends with the family. He would help with the work and contribute to the family table. Then he would continue on his journey, making friends aplenty along the way.

Finally, the two brothers returned home and their father warmly welcomed them. He then asked his sons to show him the marks they had made on their journeys.

The first son showed his father the trees with the deep gashes, along with the trees he had cut down. Father and son struggled going through the forest, tripping frequently on felled branches. They returned home hungry and exhausted.

The next day the father set out with his other son. Retracing his route, the son returned to the homes he had visited and both father and son were welcomed with good food and drink and comfortable places to sleep.

When they returned to their own home, the father called the two sons. To the first he said, "You completed the journey, this is true, but you did so by way of destruction. You offered nothing, you gained nothing."

But he praised the second son, "You left important marks on your journey. You made friendships and established relationships of trust and generosity. These will serve you well."


Lent can be a dreary time if we only focus on cutting down or removing sin from our life. Of course, Confession is an important part of the Season; God's mercy is necessary and beautiful. But Lent is so much more. It is also about our relationship with Christ. It's knocking on His door through prayer. It's opening our door to Him especially as He appears to us in the poor. Friendship with Christ and contributing to His table, that is, in assuring that we do our best to help others, makes our journey over these next 40 days one that will bring great happiness, in our prayer and good deeds now, and at the end of the Season on Easter Day.

On that glorious day, we will utter much different words than we offer on Ash Wednesday- "I am going to die." On Easter we will say "No, I'm not." For the Resurrection wins for us admittance to our true home, our everlasting home, in Heaven.

I want to thank the men of ACTS for hosting last week's Coffee and Donuts, a job well done. Keep these men in your prayers as they finish their retreat today. May the goodness of Christ which they experienced this weekend bear fruit for years to come.

WHAT YOU GIVE UP FOR LENT CHANGES LIVES

Each Lent we are invited into a season of spiritual reflection and renewal. CRS Rice Bowl is one way for families and faith communities to experience the season of Lent. Rice Bowl is a Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services and begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2.

Jesus teaches us that when we help our sisters and brothers around the world, we are helping Him too.

PLEASE RETURN LAST YEARS PALMS

With the Season of Lent quickly approaching, all parishioners are urged to return the palms they received last year. Receptacles will be placed next weekend at all three doors. Please return only the palms. We don't need plastic bags, rubber bands, paper clips etc....



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.



Dynamic Catholic, Alive! - Listen

The Apostles actually hear God speak to them in today's Gospel. The exciting part for us is that God's message is not just for the Apostles. It is for each and every one of us as well. We have been instructed by God, "This is My chosen Son, listen to Him." This was not framed in the form of a request. This was an instruction. Most of us have difficulty hearing Jesus's voice, and many would ask, "How do I even do that?" We will never hear the voice of Jesus if we don't listen for it or if we do all the talking during our prayer time. Prayer is meant to be a conversation and in a conversation we are challenged to balance the amount of time we speak with the amount of time we listen. The easiest way to hear Jesus speak to us is through the Scriptures, but we can also hear Him through others, through creation, through music, etc. The most important part of this is the actual listening. "Jesus, during this Lenten journey please help us to open our hearts and minds so that we can hear Your voice and listen to what You are saying to us. Then please give us the courage to follow any directions You give us. Amen."



You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. 
