It is easy to say, "Here I am, Lord," when we are kneeling in church. But how easy is it to say "Here I am, Lord," when a neighbor needs our help, when we are invited to join a parish ministry, or when we are asked to provide financial support? Often times we are called when it's not convenient for us. Discipleship is not always easy, most of the time it will make us uncomfortable and vulnerable.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The noted Jewish rabbi and author Chaim Potok wrote:

Yahweh, Master of the Universe, blessed me with a brilliant son. And he cursed me with all the problems of raising him. Ah, what it is to have a brilliant son! Not a smart son, Yahweh, but a brilliant son. Joshua, a boy with a mind like a jewel. Ah, what a curse it is, what anguish it is to have a Josh whose mind is like a pearl, like a sun.

Yahweh, when my Joshua was six years old, I saw him reading a story, he swallowed it as one swallows food or water. There was no heart in my Joshua. He was a mind in a body without a heart. It was a story about a poor old man and his struggle to get to Jerusalem before he died. Ah, how that man suffered! And my Joshua enjoyed the story, he enjoyed the last terrible page because when he finished it he realized for the first time what a splendid memory he possessed. He looked at me proudly and retold the story from memory, and I cried inside my heart.

I went outside and shouted to the Master of the Universe, "Why? What have you done to me? A mind like this I need for a son? A heart I need for a son. A soul I need for a son. Compassion I want for my son. Righteousness, mercy, strength to suffer and carry pain, that I want from my son, not a mind without a soul, without a heart."

God our Father has such a Son and today we are commanded to listen to Him. The transfiguration scene included in today's Gospel comes at a critical time for Jesus and his apostles, represented here by Peter, James, and John. Peter has confessed his belief that Jesus is the Son of God, the Messiah. Jesus will fulfill that role as Messiah not by assembling an army and expelling the Romans from Israel. No, Jesus will accomplish salvation for all people from the most evil empire of all, that of the devil and his legions. This triumph comes through obedience to the Father and a love so immense that Jesus will give up his life so that sinners then, and sinners like you and me now, may live in hope and in the expectation that we are coheirs to the Kingdom of Heaven. Unlike Chaim, this Son of Yahweh does not bring tension and questions. Jesus bring eternal life.

And why wouldn't he? He has a heart, a Sacred Heart. Here there is compassion, righteousness, mercy, and strength. This one suffers and carries our pain. Jesus really is the jewel of His Father.

So are we. Lent is the sacred season in which we mend our hearts and cleanse our souls. We already have minds that can capture the meaning of stories, understand the powers of technology, or solve the most daunting of equations. But do we have a heart, a soul that thirsts for the blessings of God? Is our joy found in human accomplishments or in the Way, the Truth, and the Life? Lent is our time to answer that.

God had a Son and on a mountain top he was brilliant and dazzling. Legendary heroes of old accompanied him and apostles wondered what to do next. We know. God had a Son - and we listen to him.

A word of gratitude to all who expressed birthday wishes. Your words, cards, and gifts inspire me to prayer. I talk to God and thank God for my life and all the wonderful people he has put in it - people like you.



Jesus was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white.

Mark 9:2-3

THE BELOVED SON

Today's first reading, known as "the Binding of Isaac," refers to the way Isaac is bound and laid upon the wood of the altar of sacrifice. God directs Abraham to offer his son in sacrifice, killing the beloved son that had been a special gift to him and Sarah in their old age. How could God ask Abraham to do such a thing? Abraham offers no resistance, but in preparing for the sacrifice, Abraham may have agreed with the psalmist that he was "greatly afflicted." Saint Paul's letter to the Romans refers to Jesus as God's beloved Son, which is also how God identifies Jesus to Peter, James, and John at the Transfiguration. Afterward, Jesus tells those disciples not to mention the event to anyone until after his resurrection from the dead. The event, together with Jesus' comments, leaves the disciples thoroughly confused.

HOW COULD GOD ASK ABRAHAM TO DO THAT?

Through the centuries, Christians and Jews alike have found the Binding of Isaac one of the most difficult passages in the Bible. Even though God intervenes to save Isaac, the whole episode strikes some readers as cruel. However, Abraham, the ultimate man of faith, raises no objection, offers no resistance as he simply goes about preparing for the trip and the sacrifice.

Today's other readings might help us see that text differently. In Mark's description of the Transfiguration, Jesus' clothes become white and shining, and Moses and Elijah appear with him. Moses was the great liberator and lawgiver who led the Jews out of bondage in Egypt and into the wilderness, forming them into the people of Israel by giving them the Law he received from God. Elijah was among Israel's greatest prophets, so close to God that, at the end of his life, he was taken up into heaven by a fiery chariot. Together, Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, the ultimate authority for the Jews in the conduct of their daily lives.

LOVE AND GENEROSITY

The Law, the Prophets—and Jesus. For Paul, Jesus is someone quite different from the other two. The reading from his letter to the Romans is short, but rich in meaning. When Paul declares that God "did not spare his own Son," and when God praises Abraham "who did not withhold from me your own beloved son," it is the same Greek word for "spare" and "withhold." God's voice at the Transfiguration identifies Jesus as his "beloved Son"—the same way God refers to Isaac as Abraham's beloved son. Ultimately, God spares Isaac but not his own Son, whom he "handed over for us."

Even if we are disturbed that God tested Abraham like this, Paul says we should be overwhelmingly grateful that God did for us what, in the end, he did not require of Abraham. Jesus, God's Son "handed over to us" in love and generosity, is already a sacrificial gift, signifying that God wants to give us "everything else along with him."

All for the Glory of God

When Pope St. John Paul II was approached by a young couple who had five children and an extremely busy schedule, they asked him a question. It was a question they had been asking themselves, but to which they could find no answer, "How can we possibly find time for prayer?" they said. "Our days area so full." They never forgot the Holy Father's answer. "By beginning each day with the morning offering," he said, "so that your whole life can become a prayer, just as the whole life of Jesus was a prayer, because he offered up everything he said and did to his Father in heaven."

Less than 10 years before Constantine granted religious tolerance to all in the Roman empire, one of the last of the early martyrs, St. Euplius, was tortured and scourged like Christ, and finally beheaded. In his interrogation he was asked why he would not offer sacrifices to the gods. He said that the whole of his life was a sacrifice to his God, just as Jesus had offered his all to God every moment of his life. Christ's followers were asked to do the same, and that means us too. It means offering everything we say or do no matter how great or small. St. Paul put it this way: "Whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God" (1 Cor 10:31)

6 TIPS FOR STICKING WITH A DAILY LENTEN ROSARY

- 1. Choose a time... Then Stick With It Set a reminder on your phone. Elect a special time to gather as a family - like after dinner or in the morning before the day gets hectic. The important thing is to find a time that works for you and then stick to it.
- 2. Find a Prayerful Place to Pray Some families choose to gather at the table, or in a special prayer corner or at a home altar. Gathering on the sofa or another seating area is perfectly acceptable, as long as the TV and all devices are switched off and put away.
- 3. Choose Your Mysteries

The Sorrowful Mysteries are ideal Lenten meditation material. Because Lent is a journey to Christ's passion and death, contemplating the Sorrowful Mysteries will keep you focused on the extent to which He suffered and died for your salvation - and thus how greatly He must love you.

- 4. Select a Bible Passage for Each Mystery Here are some suggestions:
 - a. The First Sorrowful Mystery: **The Agony in the Garden** ~ *Matthew 26:36-46; Luke 22:39-46*
- b. The Second Sorrowful Mystery: **The Scourging** at the Pillar ~ *Matthew 27:15-26*
- c. The Third Sorrowful Mystery: **The Crowning With Thorns** ~ *Matthew 27:27-29*
- d. The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery: **The Carrying of the Cross** ~ Luke 23:26-31
- e. The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery: **The Crucifixion**~ *Matthew 27:35-66; Mark 15:25-47;*~ *Luke 23:33-56; John 19:18-42*
- 5. Make Your Rosary a Part of Your Everyday Carry Challenge yourself to pray it daily and also keep it on your person as a reminder to pray it. This will habituate you to pull it out in times of stress and anxiety.
- 6. Give Your Prayer a Spine

A "spine," or a "through line," is a device that provides structure to a story, talk, or article - it binds the whole thing together. What is your reason for committing to praying a Lenten Rosary? Write it down. Try to answer these questions:

- a. For whom am I praying?
- b. Why am I praying for them?
- c. What changes do I want to see in them, or for them, on the other side of Lent?

Let the answers be the "spine" for your prayers. Let them guide your reflections and the way in which you pray.



**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
