

In today's Gospel reading we see a perfect example of stewardship. Jesus gives His time to do all that God wishes - healing the sick and preaching. But before He begins, Jesus makes time to be alone with God in prayer. It is through prayer, spending time with God, that we find the strength to do what He wishes us to do. Be sure to find time every day to be with God.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In 1864, during a crises at the Telegu Mission in India, a civil engineer named John Clouch offered to go to the mission to help. The missionary board considered his request, wondering if they should send a layman educated in engineering, not theology. Additionally, John had never been to India. Could he handle its culture? Its climate? Questions abounded, but so did John's zeal, so the board authorized his trip.

Over time, it became apparent that the Holy Spirit had been involved in this decision. During the great famine of 1876-77, John supervised the digging of the Buckingham Canal. His position enabled him to hire thousands of starving people, and thus secure them wages and a means to buy food.

Because of this practical but lifesaving act the Telegus were open to receiving not only the benefits of John's engineering skills, but also what he really wanted to share, the Word of God. John began to give the workers the Bible and the Good News contained therein and started changing lives. Baptism was sought, Christ was proclaimed, the Eucharist was shared. John Clouch had offered a chance beyond a salary; Christ worked through him to offer salvation.

God alone can see the beginning and the end of any situation and circumstance. And God knows the very best person for each job in His Kingdom. Then, in India, it was John Clouch. Today, here, it's you and me.

As has been said, God is always in the process of preparing each of us for the next step. From where you are, it may not look like the logical way to go, but once you take the step, it will become apparent why you're there.

Jesus in today's Gospel proves this. Logically, one could say that Jesus should just stay in Capernaum where everybody could come to him and be cured. But Jesus came for more than curing bodies, he came to set fire to souls, to light up the world with his love. That's why he had to move on to neighboring villages and preach the hope of redemption. I'm sure it didn't make sense to many people then why Jesus would flee his new-found popularity, but it sure brings benefits to us now, for his Gospel still assures us of the presence and power of Jesus in our lives. Possessing that power, and with lots of zeal, may we present ourselves to God and thus make it apparent why God has chosen us to be his disciples.

"What is Truth?"

While looking into the face of a man who could still the wind and sea with a word, and whose authority reached beyond even life

and death, Pontius Pilate asked with all the cynicism of a shrewd politician, "What is truth?" This question, and the man who asked it, stands as an archetype of modernity, modeling the kind of relativism that would plague mankind after Christ's Ascension. Today, we are at a tipping point. Where many once saw plainly that "truth does not change according to our ability to stomach it," the morally expedient claim that truth is simply opinion is now more common than ever. In this era of "my truth" against reality, the moral backbone of society is found to have been eroded and the feckless mass that remains is unable to resist the fickle pressures of a fallen world. This week, I want to explore relativism and its dire consequences.

Given its prevalence, one might think that relativism is a sophisticated philosophical claim arrived at via erudite reasoning, as many philosophies are – even many of the worst ones. However, further examination tends to show that the conclusion of relativism, namely that truth is not dependent on a reality that exists outside of our minds, but on our own subjective experience, is asserted without any sort of argument. The reason for this is that relativism is not really about truth, so much as it is about freedom. That is, relativism is an error rooted primarily in the fallen human being's will, which seeks in its fallenness to be utterly unrestrained, and consequently undirected. Thus, all notions of man as intended for beatitude with God, as called from the chaos of vice to the order of virtue, as imbued with purpose and meaning beyond himself, are

dispensed with. In pursuit of the claim that morality is nothing more than an arbitrary set of rules that have been invented and agreed upon by this or that group of people, the destruction of truth is collateral damage. For those who desire to live a vicious life, the rejection of objective truth becomes a necessary first step in the process of eliminating the religious strictures that prevent man from acting on every fleeting whim. One need not look long or hard see how destructive this worldview is.

On the issue of religion in the public square, especially, we begin to see the effects of relativism. In Western culture, there is no such thing as "truth," or "goodness," or "morality," as such. Instead, there is only what is moral, good, or true for you, which may be altogether different from or opposite to what is moral, good, or true for me. In this vague, nebulous, constantly-shifting vision of reality, the only universal truth is that there is no universal truth. It is a claim that is absurd on its face, and it leads to the kind of pseudo-moral posturing that says, "I am personally opposed to this or that evil act, but I would never force my beliefs on someone else." Ven. Archbishop Fulton Sheen once wrote, "The ungodly like religion in the same way that they like lions, either dead or behind bars; they fear religion when it breaks loose and begins to challenge their consciences." Relativists will say out loud, "Have any religion you want!" but they also whisper under their breath, "Only if you lock it away, out of sight. Keep it to yourself, lest my conscience be twinged by your oppressive ideas." In the end, such relativism is a rejection of both sound reason and morality, leading only to the corrosion of virtuous societies.




