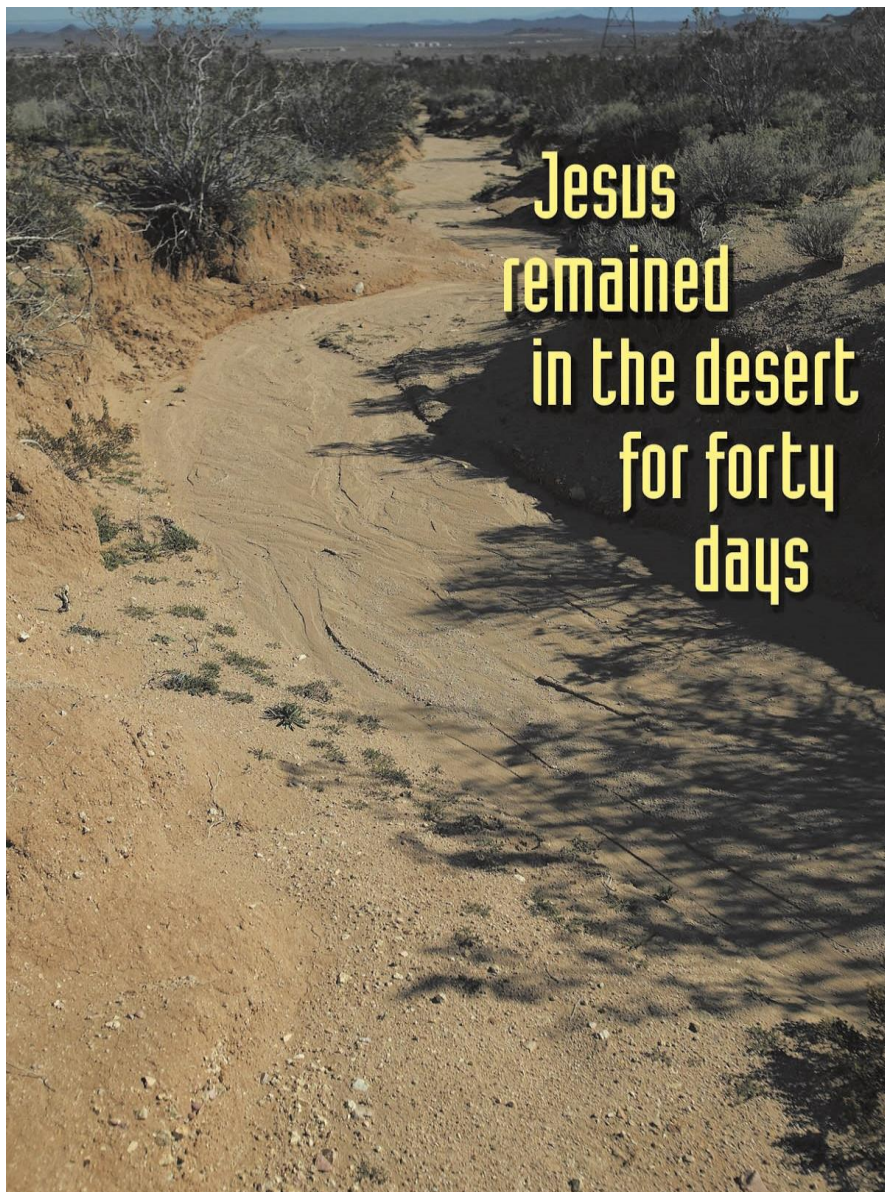

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The story goes of a young certified public accountant who was given the opportunity to make over \$26,000 in a few months' time by participating in a deal that was not quite legal, but also not so bad that anyone would be ruined financially. He thought it over, wasn't sure what to do, so he asked the opinion of his wife. Silently, she considered his situation and then replied to her beloved, "Honey, you know when I come to wake you in the morning I shake you hard and you don't stir. And I shake you even harder and you give a little moan. Then, I begin shouting your name as I continue shaking you as hard as I can and finally you open one sleepy eye."

The husband replied, "Yes, I know that. I know it's difficult to get me up in the morning. What's that have to do with this job offer?"

"Well," she said, "I'd hate to come in morning after morning and find you awake."

He turned down the job and has been sleeping soundly ever since.

Jesus was in the desert for forty days. He fasted, he was tempted by the devil, and he prayed. It was hot during the day and very cold at night. His stomach was growling. A lot was going on in his life as he made final preparations for his public ministry. But, I'll bet he slept soundly. Maybe one of those angels which St. Mark mentions as ministering to Jesus had the ministry of shaking Jesus to awaken him. Such would be the comfortable sleep of one who doesn't give in to temptations. No tossing and turning here due to guilt, only fitful sleep.

I pray you and I have restful sleep during Lent. Using these forty days well, steering our way clear of sin by the time-honored practices of fasting, prayer, and charity, will allow us to be comfortable night and day, unaffected by guilt and secure in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The Russian author Leo Tolstoy said, "Everybody thinks of changing humanity; nobody thinks of changing themselves." Hopefully, in Lent, we do and we will. During this sacred season let us seek the forgiveness of our sins in the Sacrament of Confession. Perhaps time could be spent on Tuesday's in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Extra donations to our St. Vincent de Paul Society or another charitable organization would be a sign of almsgiving and sacrifice for the love of others, imitating the sacrificial love of Jesus. Gestures like this, commitments like this, prove that we are willing to change ourselves. Such changes will bring us closer to Christ, which is always wonderful, as is sleeping soundly every night.

Like one of our parishioners who sent a letter to me last week, I was dismayed by the Post-Dispatch article headlined "Catholic dioceses amassed at least \$10 billion in taxpayer aid." What a shock! Not. Another anti-Catholic article published by our local paper. Without even reading the article, I knew it would be slanted against the Church, poorly researched, and evidence of a poor understanding of civil and canon law. Basically, the AP reporters who wrote the story looked at financial reports from several dioceses and concluded that the Catholic Church was abusing a one-time gift from the government, that is, money given to employers at the start of the pandemic. The reports showed no knowledge of restricted funds, individual parish accounts, or how diocesans assets are determined. Further more, they showed no appreciation of the work of the Church in helping so many people negatively affected by this pandemic, work which still goes on. Be assured, my brothers and sisters, that our Church is not defrauding the government, or anybody else.

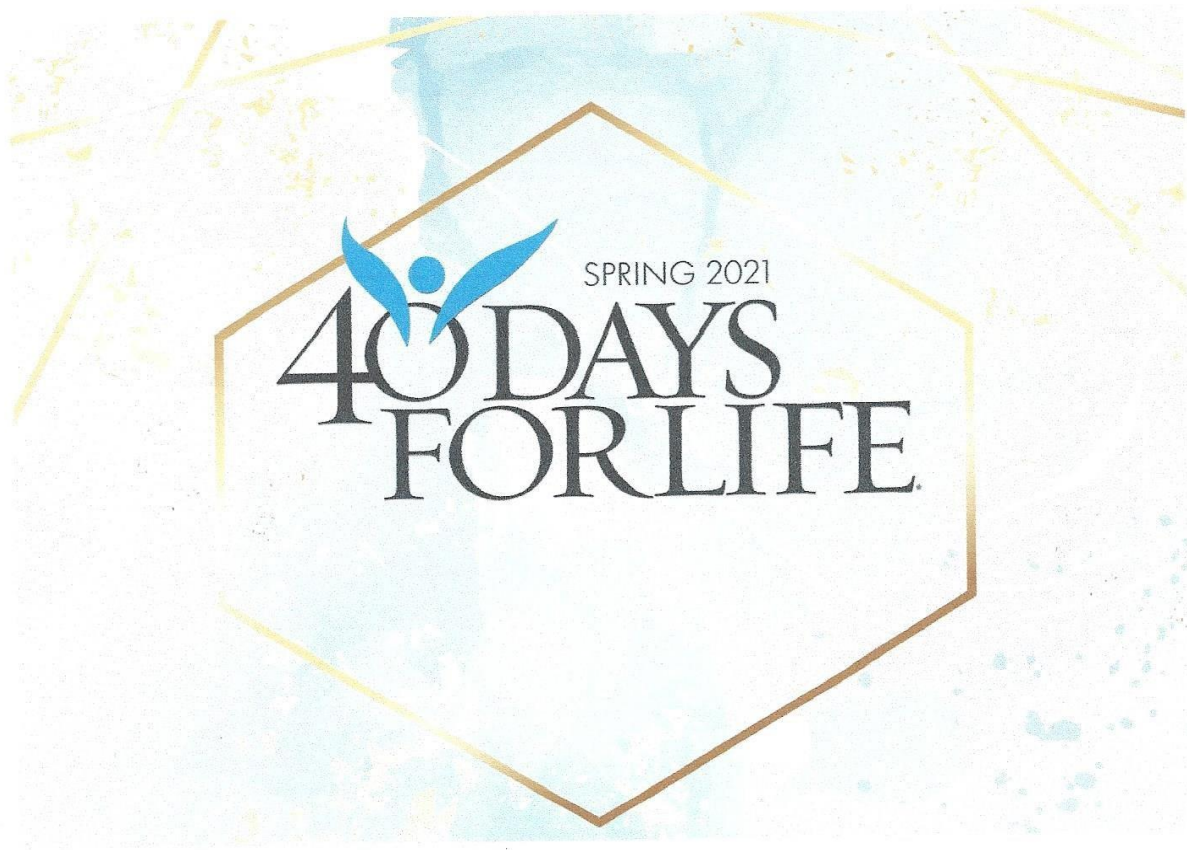

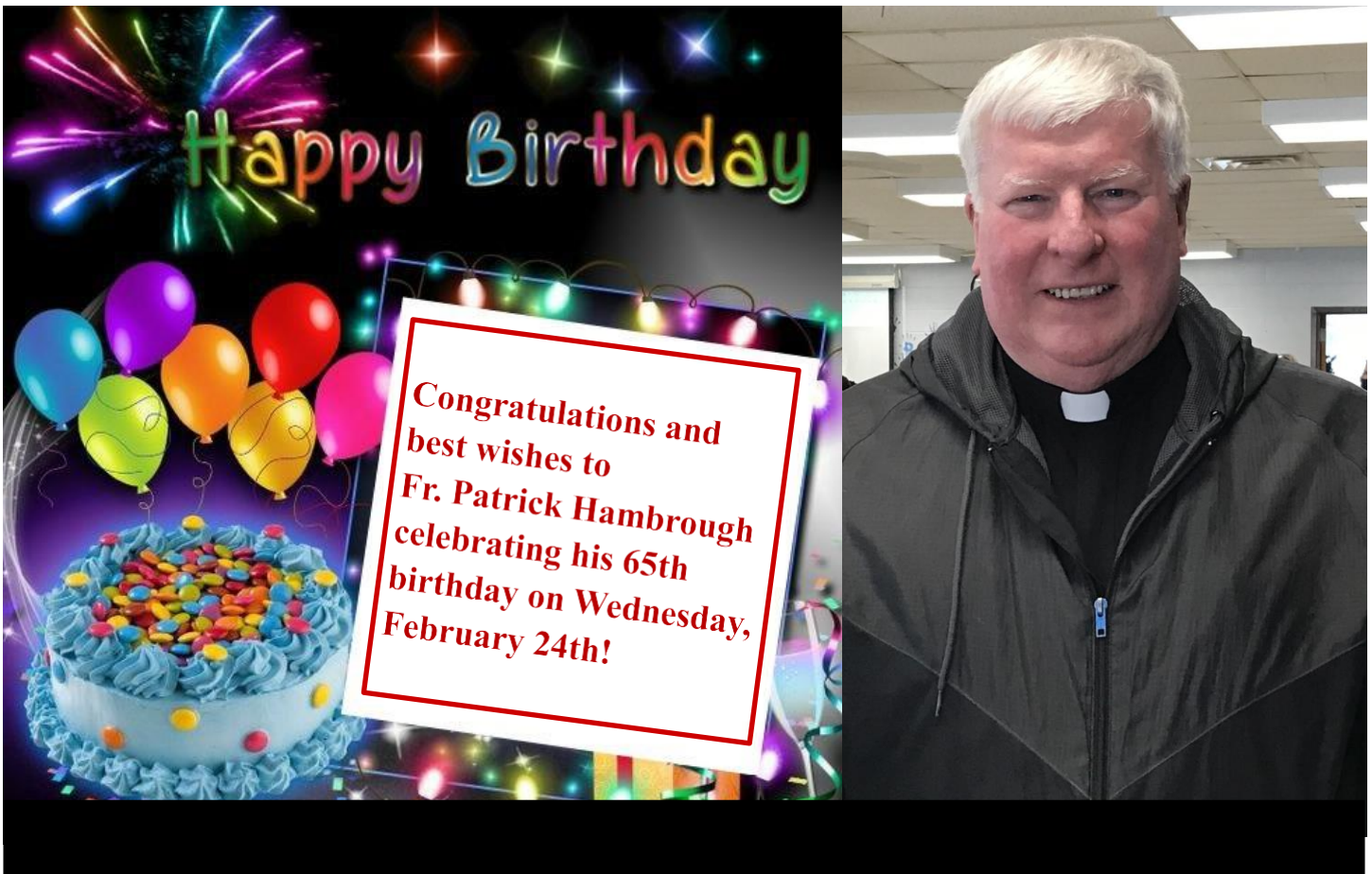

FORTY DAYS OF ENDURANCE

It may feel like the longest Lent ever, but let's commit to enduring this penitential season with hearts filled with joy.

It's too easy to feel sorry for ourselves during the pandemic. Those are the words of Father Don Wester, our Sunday Scriptures columnist, who reflected on Lent in the edition this week.

While we've made sacrifices in the past 11 months - including restrictions on public activities and even forgoing sacraments for some time - we can still live deeply what God asks us to do during Lent, Father Wester wrote.

It's an important reminder as we enter the desert for these 40 days, reflecting on the Paschal Mystery - the suffering, death, resurrection and ascension of our Lord. This journey incorporates prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

This year, endurance and resilience also deserve reflection. We find these in the example of St. Paul, who struggled to overcome obstacles in preaching the Gospel of Christ to others in the first century. He noted that it was the grace of God that enabled him to do so: "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith" (2 Timothy 4:7).

Just as an athlete trains and competes for a prize, we, too, are called - even in the midst of a pandemic - to train ourselves to keep focused on another-worldly prize: eternal life in God's Kingdom.

"Do you not know the runners in the stadium all run in the race, but only one wins the prize?" St. Paul wrote in a letter to the Corinthians, "Run so as to win. Every athlete exercises discipline in every way. They do it to win a perishable crown, but we an imperishable one" (1 Corinthians 9:24-25).

It also is important to look for the joyful signs of this otherwise penitential season. One of those ways is to seek out through Christ's own suffering for the joyful signs and the bigger picture of what God has planned for us.

We can achieve personal spiritual growth through acts of penance and the joy that comes with thinking of and doing for others; uniting ourselves with Christ's sufferings, and living out the Gospel message in our thoughts, words and actions.

We can start by shifting our lens of the Good News on the small things in life. Lent is a time for reflection, which helps us grow. It's a time for reconciliation, and forgiveness comes with an overwhelming feeling of joy. It's a time of reaching out to others who might have different views than us, and finding commonalities.

This is the year to hit the reset button - to refocus and brush aside what may be preventing us from following Jesus. Our Lord is waiting for us everyday to accept His invitation to know and love Him. All spiritual growth is rooted in prayer and the sacraments and drawing closer to Him.

10. Jesus is stripped of His garments.
11. Jesus is nailed to the cross.
12. Jesus dies on the cross.
13. Jesus is taken down from the cross.
14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.

Heavenly Father, You delivered your Son to death on the Cross to save us from evil. Grant us the grace of the Resurrection. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

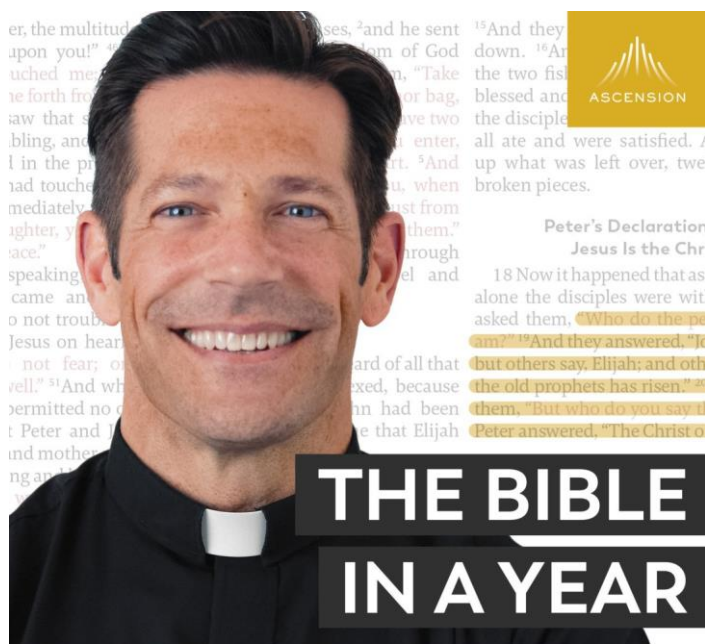
DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, *ALIVE!* - THE DESERT

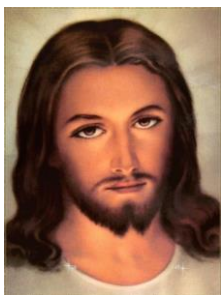
