FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

An unknown mother writes, "Some years ago, after a vigorous sibling disagreement, our three children went to bed, still angry, and determined to resume the argument in the morning. Everybody was awakened at 2 a.m. by a terrific thunderstorm, lightning streaking across the sky, thunder booming, seemingly shaking the entire house. Hearing an unusual noise upstairs I called to find out what was going on. A little voice answered, 'We are in the closet forgiving each other.'"

We're not in the process of enduring a thunderstorm, but we have entered the Season of Lent. Here is our time to seek mercy from our loving God. Here is our time to share our blessings and resources with the poor, to practice almsgiving. Here is our time to sacrifice for the benefit of our Church as well as for our own individual lives. We do all this as the Gospel of Ash Wednesday told us, not to gain the cheers and approval of humans, but to be repaid by God, who sees what we do in secret and rewards us.

These Forty Days come to us as a gift from God. Pray to use the gift well. Christ did. Today's Gospel informs us that Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert. In other words, this was God's idea. Faithful as ever to the Father, Jesus followed the promptings of the Spirit and endured the temptations the devil tried to foist upon Him. Jesus, of course, remained steadfast, completely committed to obeying the will of the Father. Christ's dependence on the Father and His reliance on the power of prayer enabled Jesus to chase away Satan.

Lent is our time to grow in prayer, especially at Mass. The Mass is the best prayer we have, and I encourage all of you to increase the times you come to Mass. Mass at the start of the day is a beautiful way to be aware of God's blessings throughout a day. Additionally, during Lent we have an extra Mass one evening, Wednesday, 7:00 p.m., which could be for you a good way to bring a day to a holy conclusion. In this sacred season one should not let pass by the Wisdom of the Gospel or the Food of the Eucharist.

The Stations of the Cross, too, enable us to appreciate further the loving actions of Christ; to see the extent of Christ's suffering for our salvation. Why not top off your delicious Fish Fry meal by going to Church and walking in the footsteps of Jesus?

St. Francis de Sales wrote long ago:

"Prayer brings our mind into the brightness of Divine Light, and exposes our will to the warmth of Divine Love. It is a Blessed Fountain which, as it flows, revives our good desires and causes them to bring forth fruit, washes away the stains of infirmity from our soul, and calms the passions of our hearts."

Those are special things to gain in Lent - good desires, unstained souls, and calm hearts. May that be what we have when Easter arrives.

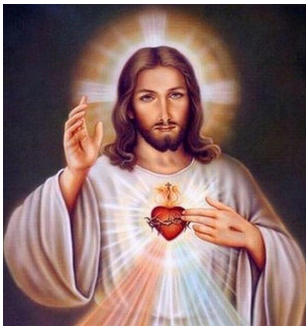

FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION TO THE SACRED HEART



According to the words of Christ through His apparitions to [Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque](#), there are several promises to those who practice the First Friday Devotions:

"In the excess of the mercy of My Heart, I promise you that My all powerful love will grant

to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in My displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and My Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour."^[2]

The devotion consists of several practices that are performed on the first Fridays of nine consecutive months. On these days, a person is to attend [Mass](#) and receive [Communion](#).^[3] If the need arises, in order to receive Communion in a state of grace, a person should also make use of the [Sacrament of Penance](#) before attending Mass. In many Catholic communities the practice of the [Holy Hour](#) of meditation during the [Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament](#) during the First Fridays is encouraged.^[4]

12 Promises of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary

1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
2. I will give peace in their families.
3. I will console them in all their troubles.
4. I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
5. I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
9. I will bless those places wherein the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
11. Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.
12. In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in

ATTENTION: IMPORTANT NOTICE

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called **Prevent and Protect STL**. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please go to www.preventandprotectstl.org to register, enter the pass code, **stlprotect**, when prompted. Contact your parish Child Safety Coordinator with any questions or for further assistance.
