FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

The basketball game I was watching in our gymnasium Monday night past was coming to a conclusion as the clock approached 9:00 p.m. A parishioner came and sat next to me on the bleachers and I asked him if he was related to one of the players, was that why he was there? No, he told me, he was there to clean the gym and the bathrooms. This man was old enough to be retired, as were two other men - even older - who arrived to help with the cleaning, they were all Knights of Columbus. Their willingness to work and clean in part was to relieve all the other parishioners who over the past two weeks donated many hours of time to conduct the Third Grade Basketball Tournament. At 9:00 p.m. one could expect these first three men to be at home, watching a TV show or a game, or reading a book, comfortably ensconced in their recliner. But there they were, up at the gym, cleaning bathrooms and sweeping popcorn, helping those who had already helped a bunch of youngsters enjoy tournament basketball. And I sat there thanking God that I'm assigned to this parish.

For almost fifty years this sort of thing has been going on around here and I'm sure many other priests have been inspired by the faith that is lived before their eyes. As you know, we are planning a few activities to celebrate this special anniversary. The first of these is approaching quickly. Our Parish Mission occurs during the first week of April. We are blessed that four former associate pastors are returning and helping us grow in our appreciation for Jesus Christ. Please make time to be here each night.

You will also see in today's bulletin that we have a special 50th Anniversary logo, designed by parishioner Howard Schroeder, and we have been working with parishioner Don Beile's Left Hand Promotions to put that logo on shirts, jackets, tumblers, etc... I'm going to order some new clothes and I hope you do, too. This is a great way to promote our parish, celebrate our anniversary, and look good while doing it.

You can also see in today's bulletin the financial details of Queen of All Saints. I'm thankful that we have such a terrific Finance Council. They know so much more about financial matters than I do and their advice to me is rooted first in faith and prayer. Their work on the Council is not a favor, it's a mission from God, an expression of their willingness to use the gifts of God to serve others. You can see in all those figures that our parish is doing well financially, partly because we received some government funding, but mostly because of the generosity of so many parishioners. This generosity has allowed us to hire the staff necessary to have a fantastic school, and also to have funds set aside to make some improvements in church. (We have hopes to replace the pews and install different flooring, but those plans have been put on hold while the Archdiocese goes through the All Things New Initiative. The Archbishop has disallowed any spending for improvements until next year.)

Speaking of the All Things New Initiative, I invite and encourage you to complete the survey, called the Disciple Maker Index. As of March 8th, nearly 30,000 people have completed it. I ask you to do so, too, either by computer, or print, the latter of which we will have available next week. Your thoughts and answers are important as the Archdiocese collects as much information as it can over the next few months. Aided by prayer, and using the data collected, the diocese wants to publish some preliminary ideas about our future by this Autumn.

John Newton, the composer of "Amazing Grace" once said: "If two angels came down from heaven to execute a divine command, and one was appointed to sweep the streets, they would feel no inclination to change employments. And why not? Because each would have the sure conviction that he was doing what his Lord had asked him to do and that by his service, great or humble, he was glorifying God."

For fifty years that's been happening around here - sweeping, popcorn, cleaning toilets, assembling figures, calculating costs, frying fish, running tournaments, and so much more. And all of it glorifying God. How blessed we are!

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."
(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of ***abstinence*** (refraining from meat) for all Catholics ***from age 14 onwards***. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), ***fast*** as well as ***abstinence***, is also obligatory for those ***from the ages of 18-59***. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.



WHAT YOU GIVE UP FOR LENT CHANGES LIVES

Each Lent we are invited into a season of spiritual reflection and renewal. CRS Rice Bowl is one way for families and faith communities to experience the season of Lent. Rice Bowl is a Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services and began on Ash Wednesday, and runs through Lent.

Jesus teaches us that when we help our sisters and brothers around the world, we are helping Him too.

Annual Parish Financial Statement for Queen of All Saints Parish, 2020 - 2021

The QAS Finance Council would like to thank the parishioners, ministries and organizations for the generous contributions which supported the parish and school this past fiscal year ending June 30, 2021. We are extremely grateful for your support and consider it a privilege to serve you. The Finance Council recognizes its responsibility to be good stewards of the gifts presented to us and maintain a healthy financial environment for both the parish and school. This process includes reviewing financial reports, assessing expenses and managing capital projects as well as making adjustments as required to maintain a positive financial position. As a result of your support, you created a surplus for the parish of \$788,000 this past fiscal year. This surplus is a result of several positive and negative factors:

1. Offertory giving decreased to \$1,260,000 as compared to \$1,308,000 the previous year and \$1,421,000 two years prior. We believe this reduction is a result of COVID impacting both church attendance and personal finances of many parishioners.
2. QAS requested and received a forgivable loan of \$379,000 under the US Government Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). This PPP money was used to offset the loss of offertory and fundraising due to COVID.
3. The Parish received \$198,000 from the Beyond Sunday *Growing in Christ!* Campaign as we prepare for the next major upgrades.
4. We received a \$100,000 one-time gift from a parishioner.
5. We received \$24,000 from the CARES Act funding for COVID expenses such as disinfecting the church and school, masks, Clorox wipes, etc.

Some of these revenue sources are one-time occurrences and removing them would reduce the \$788,000 surplus to \$284,000. We were particularly appreciative there was not a larger dip in the offertory gifts and would like to thank the parishioners for their consistent donations through electronic giving, offertory basket collection or simply stopping by the office to deliver their gift. This surplus will be used to improve our cash reserves and for future planned improvements to the church campus. The next round of improvements will focus on the church interior with new pews, kneelers and flooring. We will also continue to replace aging HVAC systems, roofs, fire alarm systems and windows in accordance with our original *Growing in Christ!* plan.

The Finance Council recognizes the importance of a vibrant school as part of a healthy parish and your generosity allowed us to add a permanent substitute teacher, reading aid and two part-time math aides to help with COVID-generated educational demands driven by the overall disruption of our teaching routine. We are thankful to have the flexibility to do this.

Here are some highlights from the Fiscal year ending June 30, 2021. You will note in the financial statement that we also included the 2019-2020 final revenues and expenses for comparison:

Revenues:

- Decrease in offertory by \$48,000 primarily attributed to absence of loose change in our typical Sunday offertory basket.
- Decrease in unrestricted gifts by \$109,000 mostly due to a one-time gift made the previous year.
- School enrollment increase resulting in additional tuition revenue of \$66,000, but partially offset by Chromebook fees (\$8,500) and Pre-K aftercare expenses (\$17,000).

Operating Expenses:

- Personnel costs slightly increased due to costs to supplement the teaching staff.
- Decrease in school supplies, fees and service expenses. While some COVID related expenses increased, these are more than offset by lower expenses in other areas.
- Decrease in occupancy costs by (\$24,000) due to reduced repairs and HVAC maintenance.

Other Non-recurring items:

- Increase in Bad Debt expense by \$30,000 to assist families in financial hardship.
- Decrease in capital expenditures by (\$83,000) due to delaying capital projects during COVID.
- St. Louis Archdiocesan Fund (SLAF) loan elimination - this represents our loan taken as part of the mold mitigation and required HVAC improvements from previous years. You can see that as of June 30, 2019, we owed \$108,662. By June 30, 2020 that was reduced to \$11,033 and was completely paid in full by September 2020. This is a tremendous achievement for our parish and we thank you for this.

Note 1. SLAF: The Archdiocese requires each parish to deposit its excess funds each year to the St. Louis Archdiocesan Fund. Excess funds are those that are not needed for a parish's normal operating needs. The Archdiocese holds a portion of all parish deposits in cash and invests the rest. Each parish account is then credited with interest and dividends that are earned on the assets plus credited or debited with its portion of the increase or decrease in the market value of the investments. Parishes can apply for loans from the SLAF to cover the cost of extraordinary expenses and capital improvements such as new buildings, etc. QAS used a SLAF loan to pay for the mold remediation efforts several years ago. The SLAF is a separate charitable trust that is managed by an independent Board of Trustees (13 trustees and an investment committee).

Note 2. School Funds: Tuition money is held by the parish to pay teachers and staff salaries when those salaries are earned, plus the operating expenses of our school for the coming school year.

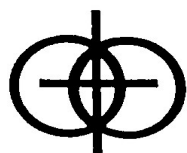
