FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The New York Times has a weekly feature called "Metropolitan Diary." In the "Diary" residents of New York neighborhoods share stories of the touching, the unusual and the amusing that makes life in that city interesting.

One correspondent reported observing this scene:

While waiting for the neighborhood parking garage to open one evening, the writer saw a gang of five young men hanging out. On the trunk of their car were two large pizza boxes and five Snapple bottles. The lads were having a great time for a while, but then their behavior turned ugly. The leftover pizza slices were being tossed, then squished, on the sidewalk.

The empty bottles were slammed on the pavement, broken glass landing everywhere. The writer noted that he was getting angry at the mess and the noise, but he did not want to leave the safety of his car. Who wants to confront five unruly teenagers?

That's when the clown appeared. A real clown, probably walking to a child's birthday party. A clown with all the clown stuff on - greasepaint, big rubber nose, colorful baggy clothes, big floppy shoes. He looked as if he jumped off an advertisement for the circus.

When the clown came upon the scene, he said nothing. He walked to the trunk of the teen's car, picked up one of the empty boxes, and stooped to pick up the broken glass and globs of pizza. The clown then walked to the corner and deposited the mess in the trash can. The young men just watched silently, dumbfounded. When the clown had finished, he walked over to the five, took off his hat, and held it before them. Sheepishly, they dug in their pockets and gave him their change. The clown bowed and went on his way.

In today's Second Reading, St. Paul reminds us, "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance." In the Gospel, Jesus tells us, "But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that their works may be clearly seen as done in God."

Sometimes, those good works will be done in surprising ways by unexpected individuals, such as a clown on a city street. More often those works will be done by those whose calling was prepared by God in advance. These types of works are most evident as we live in response to the vocation God gave to us, in the priestly and religious life, in the single life, and, most popularly, in the life of marriage and parenthood. How beautiful it is to experience the handiwork of God in the love and generosity we find in the people around us. How inspiring it is to live in God's light, to know that the goodness we experience has it's roots in God and can be clearly seen as done in God. By their response, these people allow us to experience the love of God; truly, they are messengers of God and, unlike the people mentioned in today's First Reading, we dare not mock these messengers, but thank God for them.

This week we celebrate the fesast of one of God's great messenger's, and one close to my heart, St. Patrick. This enthusiastic missionary at times was mocked by many, even threatened with death. But he persevered. Bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to a people who had never heard of Jesus, Patrick was determined that the Irish people would hear this Good News. As Jesus would say to Nicodemus, darkness only leads to condemnation. For St Patrick, that was unacceptable. His care for the people and his zeal for salvation motivated him to serve the people. Through his prayers, may we have the same motivation.

I offer to you one of his quotes:

"I arise today through God's strength to pilot me;

God's might to uphold me,

God's wisdom to guide me,

God's ear to hear me,

God's word to speak to me,

God's hand to guard me,

God's way to lie before me,

God's shield to protect me afar and anear,

Alone or in a multitude."

May God bless all of you.



FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN



Mary: God-Bearer

In the time after the Heresy of Apollinaris, which claimed that God never became truly man, a different sort of heresy emerged in response:

Nestorianism. Disturbed by Apollinaris' mutilation of the humanity of the Messiah, Nestorius made a different claim. In his view, the person known as Jesus was merely joined to the Second Person of the Trinity by way of some special cooperation of their respective human and Divine wills, leading to a

virtual third, composite person known as the Christ.

Unfortunately, this position led directly to an extraordinary theological assault on the piety of the lay faithful, especially regarding Marian devotion.

To understand this heresy well, it is necessary to have a clear view of the terms that are used to describe it. As mentioned last week, *person* is understood to be the *subject* of a particular action. In other words, in answer to the question, "*Who* killed Abraham Lincoln?" one would answer with the name of the *person* responsible: John Wilkes Booth. The second important term to know is *nature*, which denotes *what* some thing is. For

denotes *what* some thing is. For example, if we were to ask what

kind of thing Abraham Lincoln is, the best answer would be to say that he is a human being. Another way to express that answer is to say that Abraham possesses a human *nature*, which simply means that he has all the qualities of a human being, i.e., he is a rational animal. Notice that *nature* is a term that is used in a more universal manner, precisely because it is a definitional sort of term. In answer to the question about *who* killed President Lincoln, it would be insufficient to say, "Someone with a human nature killed him." Such an answer only allows one to rule out rocks, plants, animals, and angels as potential culprits, while leaving innumerable human *persons* as potential suspects.

With Jesus Christ, born of the Virgin Mary, claiming to be also the Son of God, the Second Person of the Trinity, we begin to see why it was so difficult for the early Church to clarify what that could mean.

The specific error of Nestorius is to introduce an extra *person* into the Christological equation, mainly out of fear of disparaging the Godhead by attributing

to Him human birth and suffering and death – a problem we have seen before. Nestorius' solution to this problem is subtle in its error: Jesus Christ and The Second Person of the Trinity are different persons. In this way, Nestorius sought to attribute to the Divine Person all miracles and Divine titles found in scripture, while all human actions and human titles would be associated only with the man known as Jesus. Consequently, Nestorius began to refute beloved titles of the Blessed Virgin Mary, with his chief target being the title Theotokos, which means "God-bearer" or "Mother of God" in Greek. Instead,



Nestorius claimed that Mary should be regarded only as *Anthropotokos*, meaning "mother of the man," which fits his claim that Jesus is a different *person* than the Second Person of the Trinity. The Catechism says, in response to this, "Christ's humanity has no other subject than the divine person of the Son of God, who assumed it and made it his own, from his conception. For this reason the Council of Ephesus proclaimed in 431 that Mary truly became the Mother of God by the human conception of the Son of God in her womb..." The outrage of the laity was instrumental in bringing about the condemnation of Nestorius' heretical claims about Jesus.

DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! - LIGHT AND DARKNESS

Every single day of our lives, we have a great number of choices to make. We can choose God in various situations, making the conscious decision to choose goodness and light. On the other hand, we can choose to reject God as the ancient Israelites did before going into exile. The lay faithful have the beautiful blessing of sanctifying the world. While priests and religious sanctify the Church, the lay faithful can sanctify the world in its increasing secularity. What does this mean for us? It means choosing prayer, silence, patience, compassion, and selfess love over unnecessary noise, anger, self-gratification, and individualism. Choose wisely in each situation and help lead people to encounter God through you.



**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
