FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In her book "The Saints of Ireland" author Mary D'Arcy wrote of St. Patrick, "Beautiful and touching words attest to a nobility of mind and heart and soul, and a great abiding charity, especially toward those who had injured him. From first to last he is a missionary with an insatiable desire for souls. The conversion of the Irish is the 'Epistle of salvation' which he had written by deeds, not by words, 'not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God."

Did you catch that about my patron Saint, "an insatiable desire for souls," not beer. Always I am befuddled by people who honor a holy man, a Saint, by going crazy and getting drunk. How is St. Patrick honored by such behavior?

Growing up in a family full of Irish immigrants we never went overboard expressing our heritage. We don't have corned beef and cabbage (on any of my trips to Ireland I've never been served corned beef, or even seen it). The adults did not drink to the point of drunkenness. We didn't wear green. "You don't have to wear green to prove your Irish," said my mother. Instead, she would pin to our shirts a religious medal of St. Patrick and emphasize that in Ireland March 17th was a holyday of obligation, meaning all the pubs were closed. The faithfulness of the Bishop Patrick was important, the fact that his efforts led to our being Catholics was the big deal.

Sadly, many forget the faith on St. Patrick's Day, even in Ireland, and instead parade around dressed in green and acting silly. Please don't act like that. Rather, if you truly want to honor St. Patrick, begin your day at Mass; pray as he once did at the altar of God. Imitate St. Patrick's devotion to prayer and his zeal in passing on the blessings of God. Have, as noted above, nobility of mind and heart and soul, and great charity. Do a good deed for someone on March 17th; I'm sure that would be pleasing to Ireland's great missionary.

Note, please, that I am not saying a person can't go to the parade or have fun on Tuesday. I am saying that one should be reasonable, proper, and sober. The Saint was a priest of God and what God wanted was important to him, it should be important to us, too.

What Jesus wants is our faith. Today's Gospel of the encounter of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well prompts us to thirst for "living water," that is, for faith, for Christ. Jesus lovingly leads this woman to that wonderful conclusion by the long conversation He has with her. She came to the well thirsting for water, she left satisfied by Christ. Of course, Jesus thirsts for our faith, too, for our realizing His identity and sharing in the salvation He longs to give us. Jesus was first to have "an insatiable desire for souls." St. Patrick copied that example. May we do the same.

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

Dynamic Catholic, *Alive!* - Thirsting for God

Perhaps there is no better example for the universal human thirst for God than the Samaritan woman at the well. The Samaritan woman has been living a sinful life and has struggled to live the virtue of chastity. Her reaction is typical and resembles most individuals' reactions to the truth of Christianity today, namely, rejection and anger. Over time, though, she realizes that Jesus is genuinely seeking her salvation and He longs to satisfy the desires of her heart. Just as Jesus sought the eternal salvation of the Samaritan woman, He seeks us out as well. He continually reaches out to us and desires our eternal salvation. Paragraph 27 of the Catechism provides us with a beautiful summary of the Gospel today: "The desire for God is written in the human heart, because man is created by God and for God; and God never ceases to draw man to himself. Only in God will he find the truth and happiness he never stops searching for." Will we allow God to draw us to Him?




