"...He said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none.'" (Luke 13:7)

We can all be like the barren fig tree at times. Do you cling to what you have or do you generously share with others? How will you respond when God asks you what you have done with all He has given you? Remember, not only are we called to be generous, we are called to develop and nurture our gifts, and return them with increase. Remember, we are called to be generous with all of gifts, especially the ones that mean the most to you.



FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

A child asked the wise elder a question, “Why are only certain trees green during the winter?”

The elder nodded and began telling the story, “It seems that many, many years ago, the Lord, the Great and Almighty, allowed all things to roam freely on the face of the earth. Even as the elk, the bear, the deer, the fox, and yes, the humans could move from place to place, the trees could move, too. They could seek water, the warmth of the sun, and shade in the shadow of a hill when the heat was too intense.

They did not move quickly like a deer or a rabbit, of course. They would move slowly and laboriously - the giant elm, the poplar, and the mighty oak and the hickory. They would roam the valleys and the hillsides during the spring, summer and fall, then rest for the winter to await the coming of a new spring.

There came a time when those giants of the forests began a terrible quarrel. One was jealous of the other. The elm wanted the hillside, the poplar wanted the valley that was also wanted by the oak. The hickory wanted to be near the stream where the maple was standing already. Only the pines and firs seemed satisfied and did not quarrel. They were small trees, pushed around by the others, and they had tiny leaves, shaped like needles, which caused the other trees to heap ridicule upon them.

The Lord, the Great and Almighty, heard the clashing of trees in the forests. With a shattering thunderclap God shouted for them to stop. ‘I have given you the beauty of your leaves and fruit, and the ability to roam the earth, and you are not satisfied!’

There was another thunderclap as he further spoke, ‘From this day on, you will be rooted in the ground and not be able to move freely on the earth. Only your seeds will be able to roam. You will lose your leaves when the cold and snow and ice come, and shiver in the forests until spring, because you were not satisfied with what I had given you. Only the gentle pine and the firs shall keep their tiny green leaves throughout the year and be called evergreens. They will grow tall and straight, and they will be the ones who shall hold their heads above all the other trees in the forests.’

And so it came to pass many years ago. To this day, while walking through a forest in the winter, you can hear the moaning of the trees that have lost their leaves as they shiver in the cold, waiting for the spring.”

It wasn’t leaves the gardener expected to find falling from his tree, it was fruit. And as Jesus tells us in the Gospel, the owner was losing patience. Plenty of care had been offered, plenty of attention had been given. But, here there was no thunderclap of disappointment, only a firm resolve to cultivate and fertilize with the belief that good fruit would come forth.

The author Kurt Vonnegut said, “The philosopher Bertrand Russell declared that, in case he met God, he would say to him, ‘Sir, you did not give us enough information.’ I would add to that, ‘All the same, Sir, I’m not persuaded that we did the best we could with the information we had.’” Like the Lord, the Great and Almighty, in the story above, “I have given you the beauty of your leaves and fruit, and the ability to roam the earth, and you are not satisfied!” In Lent, we have to ask ourselves, “Are we satisfied?” “Are we doing the best we could with the information we have?” “Are we bearing the good fruit the gardener expects?”

Hopefully, cultivation and fertilizer will work for the fig tree. Hopefully, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving will work for us as we stay above the quarrels and fights over worldly matters and concentrate on the good things that come from God.

I thank the women who led and participated in last weekend’s ACTS retreat. What beautiful service you rendered. What great blessings you received. Thank you!

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

*“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.”
(John 3:16-17)*

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of **abstinence** (refraining from meat) for all Catholics **from age 14 onwards**. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), **fast** as well as **abstinence**, is also obligatory for those **from the ages of 18-59**. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.
