FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Thomas Friedman won a Pulitzer Prize while writing on foreign affairs for the New York Times. In a 2006 column he shared with his readers this incident that began at Charles de Gaulle Airport in Paris.

Arriving in the city, Friedman was met by a taxi driver carrying a sign with Friedman's name on it. Signaling the man that he was the fare, the driver grabbed Friedman's luggage and

placed it in the trunk, all the while conversing with someone over the Bluetooth phone clipped to his ear. Without speaking, Friedman handed the driver a piece of paper with the desired address in Paris.

Setting off, the driver continued his conversation while also watching a movie that was playing on the screen that usually displays a GPS map. Friedman, figuring there would be no friendly banter with the fellow, got out his own device and began listening to music, which he did while he unfolded his laptop and began to type some ideas about a future column.

Later, he remembered this about the trip to the hotel:

"The driver and I had been together for an hour, and between the two of us we had been doing six different things. He was driving, talking on the phone and watching a movie. I was riding, working on my laptop and listening to music. There was only one thing we never did: Talk to each other...I relate all this because it illustrates something I've been feeling more and more lately - that technology is dividing us as much as uniting us."

The problem in the days of the prophet Jeremiah wasn't technology. No, rather, it was disobedience to the covenant, it was forgetfulness of what God had done for his chosen people; it was unclasping themselves from the hand of the God who had led them forth from the land of Egypt. Jeremiah was speaking to a people who did not acknowledge God's word, and technology wasn't available to help them.

Always wise, though, God had a solution. He would place the law within them and write it upon their hearts. As the First Reading tells us, "No longer will they have need to teach their friends and relatives how to know the Lord. All, from least to greatest, shall know me, says the Lord... "No excuses now. No more "I'm too young, too old, too simple, too great, to know the Lord." No more protesting that the Law can't be found, no more whining that it can't be read. No more excuses.

Even now, in a world sometimes strangled by technology, God continues to write his law upon our heart. And, aware of that, Jesus could give the command to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbor as ourself.

Lent is our time to imitate the Greeks mentioned in today's Gospel, the ones who spoke to the Apostle Philip and said, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." So would we, not so we can ride along paying little attention to what Jesus has to say, but that he may press deeper into our hearts the law of God, making it possible for us to know him and follow him.

I encourage all of you to come to church Wednesday night for a special, sacred evening. We will begin with Mass, followed by a talk by our seminarian Jacob, and the Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available, too. It promises to be a time of nearness to Christ. Come join us.

May God bless all of you.

Christ: Pantocrator

Since we have taken some time to examine some of the errors that have cropped up in our understanding of Jesus, it is fitting to dive into some of the truths regarding our Incarnate Lord. While this task is by

no means an easy one, as history and its heretics have shown, there is much that we can positively say, regarding the nature and identity of Jesus Christ. Now, armed with some terminological precision and historical awareness, not to mention two thousand years of Catholic theological thought on the matter, this task becomes less intimidating.

First, it is important to emphasize that Jesus' human nature does not constitute a human person. While, yes, the Second Person of the Trinity possesses a full human nature, with a soul and body like ours, his personhood subsists wholly in his Divinity. As mentioned last week, the word person denotes who someone is. To say that Jesus is a human person and a Divine Person would be to say that there are two different answers to the question, "Who is the Second Person of the Trinity?" and "Who is Jesus Christ?" By clarifying that there is only one person in the Incarnational equation, namely the


Second Person of the Trinity, we are able to better understand how Jesus Christ, a human being, is Truly God. All of this is simply to say that *the Word became Flesh*, but he did not become a different person by doing so. This seems to be a source of error for many who struggled to understand Jesus in the Early Church.

The next issue to tackle in Christological thought is the question of the two natures of the Word Incarnate. The image included in this article is called *Christ Pantocrator*, which means "Christ All-

powerful," and it is the oldest known image with that title. The purpose of the icon is to symbolize the two natures possessed by the Second Person of the Trinity, with the features on one side representing his human nature, and the other side representing his Divine Nature. The theological point it makes is relatively simple (though getting there took many heresies and a few Ecumenical Councils): The Second Person of the Trinity, who has a Divine Nature from all eternity, assumed a human nature at the Incarnation. While he acts through both natures in the Gospels, there are certainly moments where it is clear that the human nature is emphasized, like when Jesus exhibits strong emotions, such as anger or sadness. Likewise, Christ's miracles make the

involvement of his Divine Nature apparent. Yet all of these actions, enacted through two natures, are attributable to the same person.

To sum up, it may be said with greater clarity there is only one person, but two natures in our Incarnate Lord. I hope that this has helped you to grow in understanding of Jesus.





**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
