Likewise, God's blessings to us may change over the years but it is important to trust that God will always provide us with all that we need.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

What would you say to your loved ones if you knew the end was near? What message would you want them to hear? What words would you want them to remember?

One of the great authors in Russian history, Fyodor Dostoevsky, had to make such a decision from his deathbed in 1881. When he knew his time on earth was short, he had his wife bring their four children into his bedroom. Once there, he begged his wife to read aloud the parable of the Prodigal Son. He listened with his eyes closed, absorbed in his

thoughts. He heard a final time as Jesus told the story of the selfish, disrespectful son and the loving, forgiving Father. He contemplated the lowliness of a son who had chosen sin and the exaltation of one who had received mercy, a mercy undeserved, yet abundant.

When the Gospel reading was completed, Fyodor opened his eyes and whispered with a feeble voice, "My children, never forget what you have just heard. Have absolute faith in God, and never despair of His pardon. I love you dearly, but my love is nothing compared with the love of God for all He has created. Even if you should be so unhappy as to commit a crime in the course of your life, never despair of God. You are His children; humble yourselves before Him as before your own father now, implore His pardon, and He will rejoice over your repentance, as the father rejoiced over that of the Prodigal Son."

I don't know what happened to Mrs. Dostoevsky and her four children, but I'll bet they never forgot that time around the father's deathbed nor the parable of the Prodigal Son. All their lives they surely understood the beauty of the insulted father's willingness to forgive. Certainly, throughout their lives they knew they could turn to the Heavenly Father with great hope, even if they had committed a sin, even if they had committed hundreds of them. What joy they must have known!

This same joy awaits us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. During the Season of Lent, we priests are privileged to celebrate the sacrament with as many as 1,000 people in the variety of places - our parish, other parishes, other schools - both elementary and secondary. What an honor it is to listen as one sorrowfully confesses sins; what delight to be an instrument of God's mercy, wholeheartedly believing that every single sin is wiped away.

Thus, I encourage each one of you who has not been to Confession during the Lenten Season to celebrate the Sacrament soon. This Friday or Saturday would be a good time to do so as our parish joins with St. Francis of Assisi and St. Margaret Mary for a Reconciliation Weekend. Over the course of several hours on Friday evening or Saturday morning and afternoon, you will have the opportunity to have your sins forgiven to be embraced by the loving Father.

Almost hidden, in a secluded corner of a New York cemetery is a small gravestone polished smooth by the wind and weather of many years. The stone bears no name nor is there any date inscribed on it. Still legible on the face of the stone, however, in letters that neither wind nor weather has been able to erase is one, solitary word, 'Forgiven'. No monument, no tower, no fancy mausoleum marks the final resting place of the anonymous person who lies buried there - only a simple stone and a single word - 'Forgiven'.

That's all anyone really needs. That love, that mercy. That's why we should go to Confession. For Dostoevsky had it right, God "will rejoice over your repentance, as the father rejoiced over that of the Prodigal Son."

A word of thanks to the members of the Variety Guild who hosted last Sunday's Coffee and Donuts. I am looking forward to my first Variety Guild Show and I'm grateful for all they do.

May God bless all of you.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.




