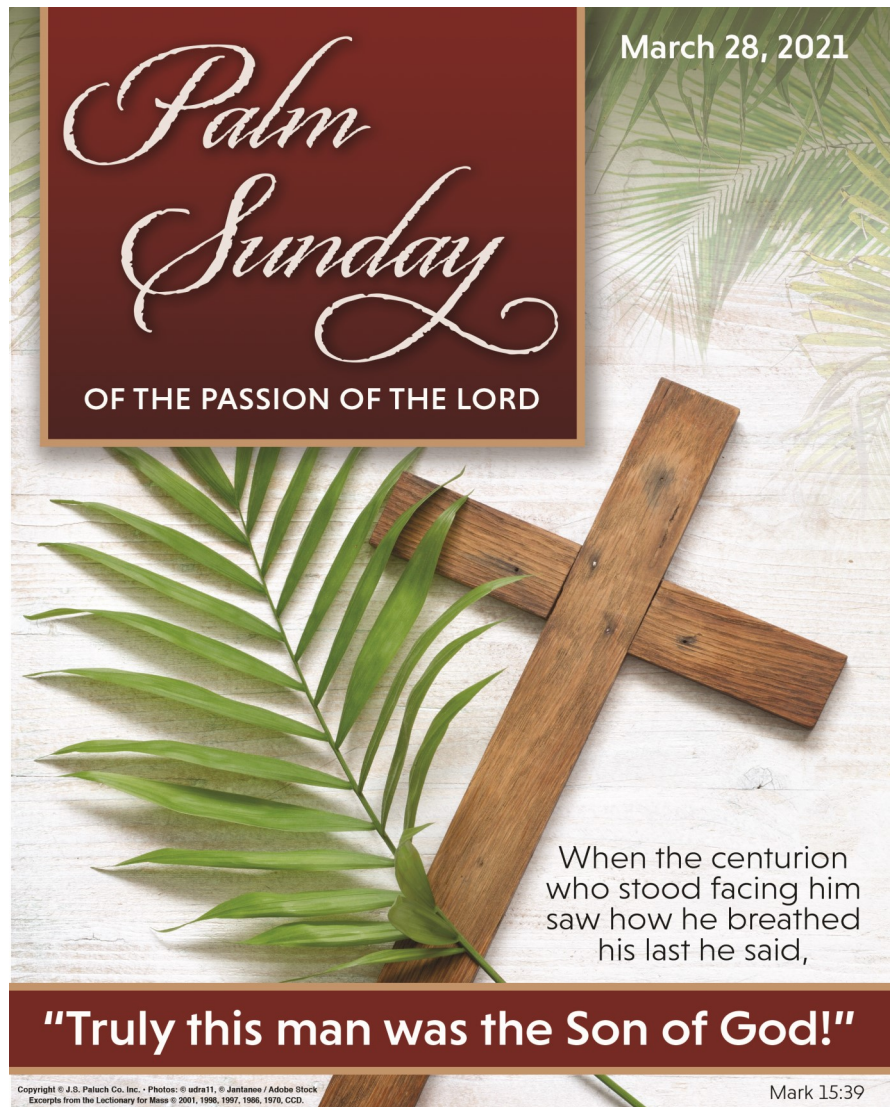

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

A pastor tells of the experience of a young woman working at a children's hospital. She was asked by a teacher from her church to tutor a boy with some schoolwork while he was in the hospital. The woman didn't realize until she got to the hospital that the boy was in the burn unit, in considerable pain and barely able to respond. She tried to tutor, stumbling through a grammar lesson, ashamed at putting the lad through such a senseless exercise.

The next day, when she returned to the hospital, a nurse asked her, "What did you do to that boy?" The tutor wasn't sure what she had done wrong, but began to apologize anyway. The nurse interrupted, "You don't understand. His entire attitude has changed. It's as though he has decided to live!"

A few weeks later, the patient explained that he had completely given up hope until the young woman arrived. Disinterested in her lesson plan initially, it suddenly struck him that one day he would be well. "After all," he joyfully explained, "they wouldn't send a tutor to work on nouns and verbs with a dying boy, would they?"

Today we begin Holy Week, the greatest week of the year. Through the triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, the solemnity of the Last Supper, the humiliating and painful Death at Calvary, and the glorious Resurrection, we trace the steps of Jesus, steps taken not to benefit Jesus, but to save us. Obedience offered to the Father not to help himself, but to help us. A deadly price paid not for his sins, but for ours.

God wouldn't send His Son to us if He wanted us to die, would He? Here the joy of the young burn patient is applied to us. Holy Week can be grueling, shocking, and troubling. Holy Week can be exciting, invigorating, and overwhelming. In it, we come face-to-face with the mortality of Jesus, and ours. Because of it, we are uplifted in victory, now co-heirs to Eternal Life. All done by the Lord God, who is our help. All accomplished by Jesus Christ, who emptied himself and humbled himself to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Do not miss the beauty of the Liturgy during Holy Week. This is the Church at her best, a most wonderful time for praise, adoration, and thanksgiving. Come, and see the drama of our salvation unfold before you. Come, experience again the depth of Jesus' love for you. Join Christ at the Last Supper. Stand before Christ dead on the cross. Be awestruck while peering into Christ's empty tomb.

After all, God wouldn't send His Son to a people who would die and stay dead, would He?

May God bless all of you.

**ARCHDIOCESAN GOOD FRIDAY
REGULATIONS**

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Abstinence means refraining from meat. **Fast** means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted).

All Catholics **from age 14 onward** (with no upper limit) are required to maintain **abstinence** on **Good Friday (April 2, 2021)**.

On **Good Friday**, **fasting** is obligatory for Catholics **from the ages of 18-59**. This fast is in addition to the abstinence from meat on those two days. No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation. Even if one were beyond the ages required to fast but are still capable of fasting, it is right to still join in the Church's penitential practices.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

All Fridays throughout the Church year, in a lesser way, participate in this Lenten practice of penance. Every Catholic is required to do some penance on every Friday. The normal penance is abstinence from meat, but it can be substituted with some other penitential practice (e.g., extra prayer, exercises of piety, works of charity, etc.).

FROM OUR SEMINARIAN JAKE BRAUN

**What is a Heretic?**

I realize that I have bandied about terms like “heresy” and “heretic” rather frequently in my bulletin articles these last couple of months. However, I never offered an explanation of the word, and its consequences. So, I just want to briefly expound upon the very definition of a heretic with this article.

The *Code of Canon Law*, which is the book that contains Ecclesial Laws, gives a definition of heresy that is pretty clear. As Canon 751 states: “Heresy is the obstinate denial or obstinate doubt after the reception of baptism of some truth which is to be believed by divine and Catholic faith...” Notice that the *denial* or *doubt* in question must be *obstinate*, must pertain to matters of *divine and Catholic Faith*, and applies only to persons who are baptized. That is a pretty specific set of conditions.

Given the specificity of conditions for formal heresy, it is safe to say that most people do not fall into that category. Rather, most baptized Christians, I daresay all of them – you and I included – are material heretics on one issue or another. This simply means that we are, not necessarily by any real fault of our own, ignorant of some truth of the faith.

There is no penalty for being a material heretic, it just means that we do not know perfectly the truth of Divine Revelation, and hold theological opinions that are contrary to it, often without knowing it. But by submitting our intellects in faith and humility to the authority of God’s Church, we avoid moral culpability for errant opinions.

Formal heresy, the type mentioned in the Canon above, is quite rare. The reason for this is that it requires a person to not just be *wrong* about some part of Divine Revelation, but to also refuse to amend their error when the Church asks them to. Obstinate refusal to submit one’s intellect to the infallibility of the Church, which is guided by the Holy Spirit, becomes a sin not only of disobedience, but of pride. In some ways, it even approaches idolatry, as the heretic places his own *idea* of God above the *Reality* of God, who has entrusted his Divine Revelation to the Catholic Church for proper interpretation. While most heretics likely begin by trying to understand God more, which is good, they only receive the title of heretic after a laborious process of warnings, corrections, censure, and other penalties have taken place. I hope this is a helpful clarification on heresy!

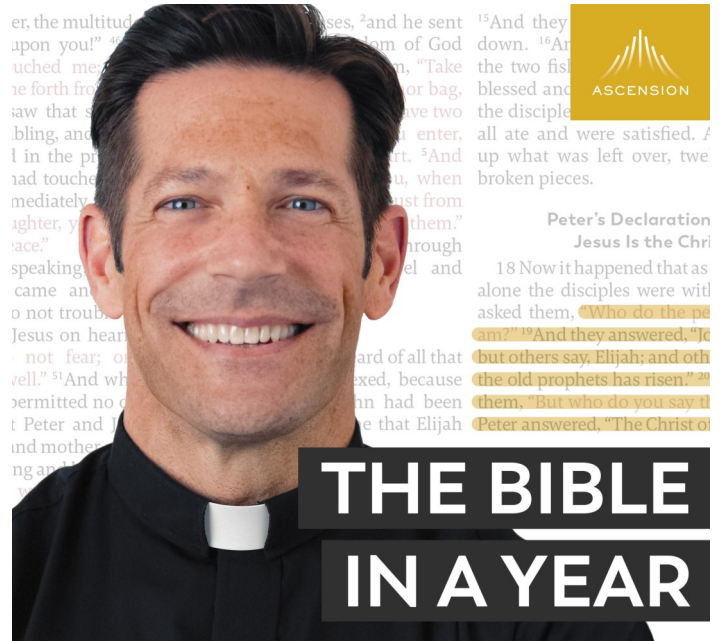

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, **you will need your User name and Password**. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
