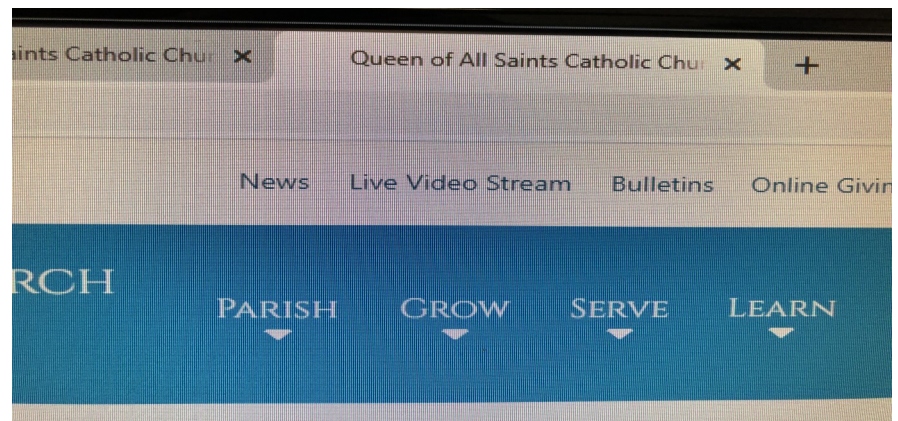
### LIVE VIDEO STREAMING MASS

It opens our hearts to see God's active presence in our daily lives.

## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In today's Gospel Jesus receives word from Lazarus' sister Mary that Lazarus is very ill. Commenting on this news Jesus declares, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Jesus then remained in the place where He was for two days before proceeding to Bethany, the home of the siblings Lazarus, Martha, and Mary.

Two days? I want to say to Jesus that we've been waiting for more than two days, or even the four days in which Lazarus was in his tomb. "Where's the glory, Lord? When is the time when this COVID-19 will end so that you may be glorified through it? Lord, we're waiting."

Of course, patience is needed. Patience, a virtue in short supply in some people, including, at times, me. So perhaps this story may be helpful:

On one occasion friends Pat and Mike were together and they decided to take a walk. As they proceeded down the path they met a man who had a quarrel with Pat. The man began to yell and shout and he abused Pat with a list of insults.

Pat remained quiet for a long time, proud that he was following the teaching of Jesus to turn the other cheek. At last, however, his patience wore out and Pat began trading insults with the man. At this point Mike walked away, a look of sadness on his face.

Later Pat found Mike and reproached Mike for leaving. "I needed a friend to support me," Pat exclaimed, "and you were nowhere to be found!" Mike explained, "My friend, while that rude man was insulting you so cruelly and you kept silent, I saw ten angels guarding you and answering him; but as soon as you began returning insults they left you, and I also walked away."

Ten angels, or more, is what we need now, along with the Queen of the Angels, our Blessed Mother, and the one through whom the angels were made, Jesus Christ. Each day I scan the internet and read the newspaper hoping to see a hint of positive news. Such news is hard to find. Our world is as gloomy as the weather. But if I can't find good news on iPhones or in newspapers, then I will find it in Scripture, in the Good News we call the Gospel, in sentences like "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

So I will wait for that glory, for Jesus Christ's choice of the best way to reveal His power, love, and glory; for Christ to choose the time and the person or people who will be His instrument. Patiently, I must trust Jesus Christ in this, as I read somewhere online, "the Lentiest of Lents." All of us must be patient and trust. Mary and Martha waited two days for Jesus to arrive. Lazarus waited four days to hear, "Come out." We may wait much longer. But angels will watch over us, saints will pray for us, and our Queen will bring maternal comfort, glory will come, and we will be untied from this virus and set free.

I thank all of you who have contributed online, through the mail, or through the slot in our front door. Our Parish still has financial responsibilities to our staff and faculty and to the upkeep of the parish property. Please make sure to fulfill the obligation we all have to assure the vitality of Queen of All Saints. Your generosity is a blessing to us all and it will help many people.

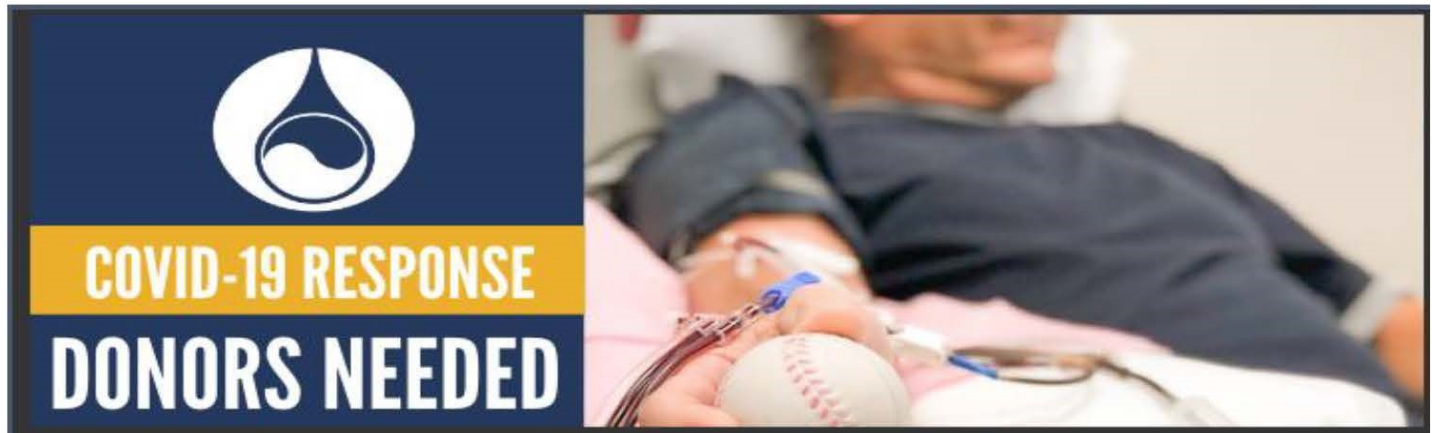

**Dear Queen of All Saints Parishioners,**

As a Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center (MVRBC) blood drive sponsor, we greatly value your support in providing our region's blood supply. Nationally, and here in our region, the blood supply is being adversely impacted by the outbreak of COVID-19. In some places, elective surgery is already being cancelled for blood availability. Businesses are urging employees to work from home, schools are changing schedules, and major sporting events, concerts, and conferences have been cancelled. The pandemic is having a significant impact on participation in blood drives.

The ongoing impact of COVID-19 is unclear, but no matter what happens, we must come through for the patients and hospitals that depend on our Blood Center. Given these challenges, we want to express our appreciation for our partnership and to ask that you consider ways to help support the blood supply even as your own organization might be making changes to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

**QAS Has a Blood Drive Scheduled for SUN MAR 29 from 8a – 1:30p in the School Cafeteria**

Louis Katz, M.D. Chief Medical Officer, MVRBC notes that, "Blood drives and donor centers are probably one of the safest places you can go right now because staff and donors are required to be healthy. Blood drives are not mass gatherings and do not put people at greater risk for transmitting or contracting COVID-19."

To keep you informed, MVRBC has created a COVID-19 information [page on our website](#). As a member of America's Blood Centers, we would also like to share a [news release issued by the AABB Inter-organizational Task Force on Disasters](#), which has been meeting to ensure the blood industry is prepared for the potential impact of the COVID-19 outbreak. You may also wish to review a statement on COVID-19 issued earlier by America's Blood Centers: <https://americasblood.org/news/abc-statement-on-the-coronavirus-covid19/>.

We would emphasize COVID-19 presents no known risk to the safety of the nation's blood supply, only the adequacy of the supply at this time. Individuals are not at risk of contracting COVID-19 from donating blood. We are concerned, however, that misinformation and fear could negatively impact our ability to support the patients whose lives depend on blood (i.e. if donors refrain from blood donation over fear of contracting the virus).

We urge everyone to prevent the spread of COVID-19, influenza, and other viral infections, with widely recommended common-sense measures such as frequent handwashing, cleaning work surfaces, using proper cough etiquette, and avoiding close contact with those who are ill.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE

## NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called **Prevent and Protect STL**. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete **ALL** modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

## MAKING AN ALTAR OR PRAYER SPACE IN YOUR HOME

In these coming weeks as we are kept from worshipping together at the church building itself, you might be searching for some ways to enter more fully into the Livestream of Mass. One way that might help you get into the right frame of mind is creating a designated place for prayer in your home. Sometimes these can be corners of rooms, infrequently used rooms, or maybe just an end table or dresser that becomes a gathering place to pray.

A number of years ago when altar rails were in every church, people came to kneel at them to receive the Eucharist. Over those altar rails was a white cloth that ran the entire length of the sanctuary. It was meant to be a symbolic reminder that *there* at *that* rail, receiving the Eucharist, we were united to the altar, that the white cloth they were touching was an extension of the white cloth covering the altar itself.

In your homes in these coming weeks, you might want to think about creating a little altar of your own, putting a white cloth over an end table or dresser. Put your crucifix, your Bible, your statues, or images of Our Lord or Mary on it. Gather there to pray each day (and especially on Sunday) by yourself or with your family as a reminder that you are united to the white marble altar in the church at Queen of All Saints which is also covered with a white altar cloth.
