Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Two men once visited a holy man to ask his advice.

"We have done wrong actions," they said, "we have sinned and our consciences are troubled. What must we do to be forgiven?" Looking at them with love, the holy man said, "Tell me of your wrongdoing, my sons." The first man said, "I committed a great and grievous sin." The second man said, "I have done a number of wrong things, but they are really not at all important."

"Go," said the holy man, "and bring me a stone for each sin."

The first man went looking for a large stone for his sin. He came back to the holy man, staggering due to the weight of the boulder.

The second man cheerfully walked along, picking up small rocks as he went, a rock here, a rock there, until he had a full bag of pebbles. He sauntered into the presence of the holy man and placed his bag of rocks next to the first man's boulder. "Now," said the holy man, "Go back and put the rocks back where you found them."

The first man shouldered his great rock again and staggered once more to the place from which he had brought it. What a relief he felt when at last he dropped the rock on that spot. But the second man could not remember where his pebbles originally had lain. He tried to recall, but he had not been paying close attention when he had gathered them. Now, he was growing frustrated, then angry, and he went back to the holy man saying the task was too difficult.

"Sins are like these stones," said the old man. If a man has committed a great sin, it lies like a heavy stone on his conscience; yet if he is truly sorry, he is truly forgiven and the load of guilt is taken away. But if a man is constantly doing small things that he knows to be wrong, he does not feel any great load of guilt, and so he is not sorry, and thus he remains a sinner. So, you see, my sons, it is as important to avoid little sins as well as big ones."

Jesus in today's Gospel gets hit with enormous temptations - making stones into bread, possessing all the kingdoms of the world, commanding angels to catch him as he soars through the air. Jesus resists these temptations, and the devil who made them.

The temptations that come our way, and the sins we commit, are more than pebble variety of temptations. We're not tempted to steal cars, rob banks, or sell dope. No, we get the tell lies, become impatient, curse drivers, gossip about the neighbor, or skip Mass now and then temptations. Some of these sins, true, are more serious than others, and all of them are rooted in the cunning of the devil. We may think that that lie doesn't matter or that driver doesn't know we yelled bad words or that God doesn't mind if we miss Mass while on vacation. Fine, but try putting those little rocks back where you found them. Have fun with the growing sense of frustration that produces a seething sense of anger because your life isn't going the way you planned. You may not stagger under the weight of one horrible sin, but you'll stagger while trying to correct a lot of smaller ones.

Lent is our time to be rid of all these sins and we turn to our Holy Man, Jesus Christ, to do so. As Christ grew powerful by His forty days in the desert, so do we in forty days of Lent. As Christ overcame temptation after His days of fasting, so do we in Lent. As the Holy Spirit guided Christ into and through the desert, so does the Holy Spirit guide us in Lent. We do not enter this Season with any sense of fear or dread. It is a sacred season. It will make us a Holy people, unburdened by the big or small weight of sin.

Each Lent we are invited into a season of spiritual reflection and renewal. CRS Rice Bowl is one way for families and faith communities to experience the season of Lent. Rice Bowl is a Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services and began on Ash Wednesday, and runs through Lent.

Jesus teaches us that when we help our sisters and brothers around the world, we are helping Him too.



ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! TIME TO PRAY AND FAST

In the Gospel reading today, we hear how Jesus went off alone in the desert for 40 days to pray and fast. This is a perfect opportunity for us to reflect on our busy lives filled with constant noise to determine how we can disconnect and take time alone in conversation with God. As adopted sons and daughters of God, we have been called to give of ourselves in many ways but when we give we also have to take time to replenish our spiritual resources as well. If we don't do this, we will find ourselves empty. Throughout the Gospels, we find many examples of Jesus taking time for silent mental prayer. That is what allowed Him to withstand the temptation of the devil in the desert. That is also what helped Him to endure His great suffering. Jesus stayed in a personal relationship with His Father and He trusted that His Father would be with Him throughout all of His tribulation. We, like Jesus, need to maintain our personal relationship with God and remember as Paul shared in his letter to the Romans. "(God) enriches all who call upon Him."

MISSION 31--WAVERLY, TN APRIL 24-29

On August 22, 2021, Humphrey County, TN received 20" of rain in less than 24 hrs. The city of Waverly was hit the hardest with 15 adult and 5 child fatalities. Two who lost their lives were toddler twins.

Hundreds of homes were totally destroyed and hundreds more sustained major damage.

THE RECOVERY: Combined organizations have 155 homes scheduled for rebuild and 50 new homes to be constructed. The effort will take years and many volunteers.

Our QAS St. Louis Sluggers, a Ministry of St. Vincent de Paul, has 23 men and 2 women scheduled to work the reconstruction April 24-29.

We could use a few additional ladies and gentlemen with repair-rebuild skills. You need not be be a Master Journeyman to assist, the team will match skills to the task.

Every day of labor we commit to the rebuild brings a family closer to returning home.

This work is not about us, its about them--families that have lost nearly everything they have ever had, including a family member or friend.



You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
