FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I packed up my things last summer. I put books into boxes and hauled clothing and vestments to my car. I carefully placed pictures, photographs, and chalices into containers in a way that they would not be broken and scratched. I did this knowing all the while exactly where I was going, here, to Queen of All Saints. I did that knowing that I had an advantage that Abraham did not have. At least the Archbishop did not say to me, "Go forth from your rectory to a parish I will show you."

Yet, that's what God said to Abram, already an old man at the time. Already a man of prestige in his homeland with a family and property, with everything set and going well. It's tough enough, I'm sure, to leave your native place after many years there; even harder to set out not knowing when or where your journey will end. Could one blame Abraham if he asked God for more information than "a land I will show you"?

This, though, is what it means to trust. This old man, who would become "our Father in Faith" started exercising that Faith on the spot. He and his family set out for the unknown, believing in the care and providence of God.

We are called to do the same. St. Francis de Sales put it this way:

"In all your affairs rely wholly on God's providence. Intimate little children, who with one hand hold fast to their Father, and with the other hand gather strawberries along the hedges. So, too, as you gather and handle the goods of this world with one hand, you must with the other always hold fast the hand of your Heavenly Father, turning yourself towards Him from time to time to see if your actions or occupations are pleasing to Him. About all things, take heed that you never leave His hand or think to gather more or to gain some advantage. For should God forsake you, you will not be able to go a step further without falling to the ground."

Abraham trusted, and went many steps; we admire his faithfulness. In this sacred Season of Lent let us also put our hand into that of the Father, with prayer and sacrifice, as God takes us to a place He will show us. We will receive great blessings throughout these 40 days, and we won't end up on the ground.

May God bless all of you!

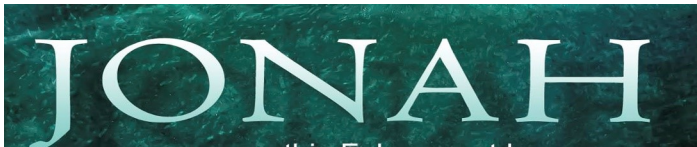

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called **Prevent and Protect STL**. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete **ALL** modules. You may log in and out at your convenience if desired. Then please go to www.preventandprotectstl.org to register, enter the pass code, **stlprotect**, when prompted. 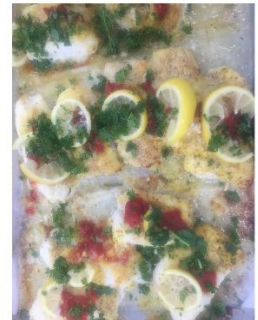
