FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

One of the favorite shows in my youth was Saturday afternoon's Wide World of Sports, televising games and contests from across the globe, oftentimes sports unfamiliar to Americans. Some of you may remember that the lead-in to the show promised "the thrill of victory," accompanied by a clip of some team celebrating its triumph, and "the agony of defeat," which for years showed a skier heading down a ski jump in good form, and just before he was to lift off, he veered off the edge of the ski jump and took a nasty fall, the type of fall that made one flinch every time it was seen. How awful "the agony of defeat!"

What most people never knew, however, was that this particular skier chose to fall rather than finish the jump. He explained later that the jump surface had become slick with ice - much too fast for jumping. Midway down the ramp he realized that he was picking up so much speed that if he completed the jump he would very likely land beyond the sloped landing area and hit level ground, which may very well have been fatal. Although it looked terrible and painful on TV, by taking the alternative of going over the side, the skier actually suffered no more than a headache.

Changing directions in mid-course sometimes may be painful for us, too. Putting on the brakes or jumping over the side may be challenging and stressful, but sometimes it's the best and wisest thing to do. The alternative is to keep going and really mess things up.

Lent is our time to stop barreling down the slope with the potential of incurring great harm. Through Moses, God made known the way to stay free of such tragedy. The Ten Commandments provide information on how we should live. First, always first, we give honor and glory to God. We don't profane his name or his day - both are far too sacred to do such a thing. Having given God his due, we then turn to God's people. They also deserve our respect, love, and honesty. Lent is a good time to evaluate our attitude toward God and others.

It's also a good time to examine our prayer life. Jesus informs us through today's Gospel that prayer is important and should be done correctly, especially when it's done in God's House. Too many people in Jerusalem had turned the temple into a marketplace, they paid more attention to the coins in their hands than the Lord in their hearts. Big mistake! They quickly felt the wrath of Jesus. Selfishness, especially when exercised in place of prayer, was unacceptable. Lent is the time to make sure our prayer life is pleasing to God.

It may be difficult. It may take some work. It should require we make use of the Sacrament of Confession, not always the easiest thing to do. But it's better than charging down the ski jump knowing you're going to get hurt after you take off. Jump over the side now and endure whatever pain or embarrassment a good Confession may entail. Because, in this case, it won't lead to the "agony of defeat," but to the "thrill of victory," a victory brought to us by Jesus Christ.

The Heresy of Apollinaris

Often in the early Church, heresies crop up in reaction to other heresies, with initially well-meaning teachers

of the faith attempting to rescue Church doctrine from the clutches of some other error. With notable heretics like Apollinaris and Nestorius, this is no less the case, as the Nestorian heresy emerged from Nestorius' own attempts to ensure an erudite understanding of Trinitarian and Christological realities. In this article, I will explore Apollinaris' Christological errors in preparation for an overview of the Nestorian heresy next week.

The heresy of Apollinaris was an error regarding the human and Divine natures of the Second Person of the Trinity. Because the words nature (which denotes what a thing is) and person (which denotes who someone is) were not yet used in a clear and uniform manner, it was difficult to understand to virtually any degree how the Second Person of the Trinity might be both God and Man. This difficulty is the main impetus for many of the early heresies regarding Christ, as it led to oversimplifications of a mystery that can never be perfectly grasped by our feeble human minds. For Apollinaris, this took an interesting form: claiming that the Divine Nature of the Second Person of the Trinity replaced the mind and will of the Christ. As St. Gregory of Nazianzen says, "He assumes that the man who came down

from heaven above is without a mind, but that the Godhead of the only-begotten fulfills the function of mind, and is the third part of this human composite, inasmuch as soul and body are in it on its human side, but not mind, the place of which is taken by God the Word." This means that the human nature of Jesus Christ would be some kind of amalgam of Divine and human parts, stitched together to form a new, third thing. According to this view, Jesus would have had only a partial human soul, roughly equivalent to an animal soul, while the Divine Intellect would have taken the place of a human intellect. The problems with this view are many and varied.

In this Apollinarian view of Jesus, problematic theological conclusions are immediately apparent. First, it could not properly be said that the Second Person of the Trinity *became man* in any real sense. Rather, one would have to hold that the Word merely *inhabited flesh*, leaving out the most crucial parts of human nature, which are the intellect and will. Consequently, any suffering undergone by Jesus Christ, including his death, becomes attributable to the Godhead, the Second Person of the Trinity, who is Life and Goodness and Truth Himself. All of these errors become targets for later theologians, some for better and some for worse. Next week, I will explain the reaction of the heretic Nestorius to some of these claims.

First, we can reflect on the Ten Commandments in the proper way and what their true nature is: they are guideposts to living in authentic freedom for goodness. They are not mere restrictions against fun as the world often tells us. Second, Paul reminds us that we must preach Christ crucified and never offer less than the truth about our faith to others. Christ's Passion shows us that we too must endure suffering in order to enter into glory. Finally, the Gospel shows the righteous anger of Christ and foreshadows His Resurrection from the dead. We are called to walk the road to Calvary with Christ and enter into the mystery of His suffering.



You will then be prompted to <u>submit information for a background screening, register for a **Protecting God's Children workshop, view TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete ALL steps to complete the process.</u>

**If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, you will need your User name and Password. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
