

From our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Franciscan Sister Jose Hobday died in Arizona on Palm Sunday, 2009. For more than 50 years she had been a dedicated teacher, pastoral associate, author, storyteller, and Religious Sister. One of the stories was called The Sacrifice Flower. It went like this:

My mother, who was a Native American, taught me all kinds of wonderful ways to pray when I was a child. A very special one was the Sacrifice Flower prayer, which she adopted from the heritage of her people, the Seneca Iroquois.

Like all mothers, she could always tell when something was bothering me. She'd say to me, "All right, Jo, I think it's time you went outside and found yourself a Sacrifice Flower. It's time you get your burden lifted from your heart and give it to God."

So, I would go looking for a flower. Mother would sometimes come with me to find the flower and while doing so talk with me about my burden. I would look for the flower, a special one that meant a lot to me. As a girl, I liked dandelions, hollyhocks, and daisies. I would pick the flower and hold it very carefully, for Mother said the flower had a holy purpose. I lovingly cupped it in my hands so nothing would happen to it.

When I got it home, I did as my mother instructed and told the flower what burden I wanted lifted and taken to God. How was the flower to do this? Remember, this was a Sacrifice Flower, one that was going to die. The idea was that as life went out of the flower, it would carry my prayer to God. That meant, of course, the flower was not to be placed in water.

I had a shelf in my room that I liked to use for my Sacrifice Flower because it was sort of private and yet I could see it as I went in and out. Every time I saw the flower, I could see it giving its life for me, and I could imagine my prayer being carried to God. I had a strong sense my prayer was being heard.

My flower and I were in union. Sometimes it took a few days, sometimes a few weeks. When the flower finally died, I would take it outside, say good-bye to it, and thank it for giving its life for me and delivering my prayer.

Then I would bury it so it would have a chance to come back as an even nicer flower. In this simple, graphic way my mother taught me how uplifting prayer can be. And, in the process, she taught me about life too. She taught me how basic dying and rising are to living, and how important it is that we become Sacrifice Flowers for each other.


Today it's not Sacrifice Flowers that we cherish, but blessed palms. These plants, too, have already given their lives for us. They, too, serve as reminders of sacrifice, not primarily of a plant, but of our Savior, Jesus Christ. As life flows from his body until he is dead, so he takes to the Heavenly Father the needs and desires of us all, especially our desire for mercy. Sin is our burden. Sin weighs heavy on our shoulders. Sin makes difficult our journey to the Kingdom. How we wish not to have it.

We enter today the greatest of all weeks, Holy Week. Here is the week where we recall the betrayal of Judas Iscariot, the denial of Peter, and the treachery of the crowd. Here we recall the Institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood, along with Christ's beautiful example of service with the Washing of the Feet. During this sacred week we are repulsed as we remember that our sins put Christ on the Cross and we are relieved that through Christ's sacrifice our sins may be forgiven. With all of the Church we wait in expectant silence during Holy Saturday; with all of the Church we rejoice on Easter Sunday. Don't miss the awesome beauty of this Holy Week. Be present for each celebration, be drawn in to the glory of the Resurrection.

As for those palms? Take them home and don't put them in water. Watch them die. Watch the green turn to brown. And know that as it happens your prayers are being heard by God; your burdens are being lifted by our triumphant Savior.

May God bless all of you.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.

MISSION 31--WAVERLY, TN APRIL 24-29

On August 22, 2021, Humphrey County, TN received 20" of rain in less than 24 hrs. The city of Waverly was hit the hardest with 15 adult and 5 child fatalities. Two who lost their lives were toddler twins.

Hundreds of homes were totally destroyed and hundreds more sustained major damage.

THE RECOVERY: Combined organizations have 155 homes scheduled for rebuild and 50 new homes to be constructed. The effort will take years and many volunteers.

Our QAS St. Louis Sluggers, a Ministry of St. Vincent de Paul, has 23 men and 2 women scheduled to work the reconstruction April 24-29.

We could use a few additional ladies and gentlemen with repair-rebuild skills. You need not be be a Master Journeyman to assist, the team will match skills to the task.

Every day of labor we commit to the rebuild brings a family closer to returning home.

This work is not about us, its about them--families that have lost nearly everything they have ever had, including a family member or friend.




