#### FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Baseball season has begun and as the Cardinals play they have real people in the stands cheering them on. Unlike last year, when canned crowd noise came through the P.A. system, this year men and women, boys and girls, will clap their hands and raise their voices in encouragement. No fake applause in 2021. And no quiet, either, when a Cardinal doesn't play well. Some Cardinals may hear more than a few "boo's" this year. Some umpires, too.

Like last year, also, the famous song "Take Me Out to the Ball Game" will be played in the middle of the seventh inning. Cardinal fans will stand for the seventh inning stretch and with great gusto sing along, intoning that if the Cardinals don't win "it's a shame."

"Take Me Out to the Ball Game" may be the most famous song about baseball - or for that matter, any sport. What's curious about the song, though, is that it was writing by a man who had never seen a baseball game.

Jack Norworth composed the famous song in 1908 when he was thirty years old. Riding in New York City's subway, he saw a placard with the message, "Come to the Polo Grounds and enjoy a ball game."

"An idea flashed across my mind," he explained later. "I figured there never had been a baseball song, so I pulled a hunk of paper out of my pocket and started scribbling. The music and words came together. Thirty minutes later I had it."

It was thirty-four years later, however, before Norworth actually went to a game. In 1942 a friend finally convinced him to watch the Brooklyn Dodgers host the New York Giants at Ebbets Field. "I caught the fever," he said of that first game, and until his death in 1959, Norworth was a baseball fanatic.

How, people asked, could someone who didn't know a home run from a passed ball write the best known sports tune of all time? "Well," Jack Norworth pointed out, "Robert Louis Stevenson wrote *Treasure Island*, but there was no such place." It's simply a matter of using one's imagination.

Imagination and the use of it has led throughout history to amazing inventions, breathtaking art, soaring melodies, and outstanding architecture. It's worked pretty well in the field of faith, too. Certainly, the parables of Jesus were rooted in a fertile imagination. Christians in the early Church had to be imaginative just to stay alive, while still passing on the faith under the dreadful eye of the Roman empire. They weren't the last, either. Even in our own time Christians, living under the thumb of persecution in some countries, use their imagination to manifest the light and hope we find in the Resurrection of Christ. Imagination works!

Ignorance doesn't. This is the message we hear in today's First Reading. "I know, brothers, that you acted out of ignorance," declares St. Peter. What a disaster that was! Jesus was denied and handed over to Pilate. The people shouted for a murderer to be released while putting to death the author of life. Acting out of ignorance led to a multiplication of sin.

That danger still exists today. Ignorant people still try to thwart Christ and they still trade away Christ, and their religion along with him, for something that lasts about as long as the power of Pilate and the Roman Empire. That is, a power long gone.

Imagination, though, continues to inspire people of faith, whether it be teaching the faith in the family home, explaining the faith in a new book, enriching the faith in a new song, or bringing the faith to a new friend. Easter implores us to let, as the Gospel says, Jesus open our minds to understand the Scriptures. Such understanding leads to imagination, not ignorance. Ignorance takes us nowhere. Imagination produces things like a song sung thousands of times across this land 113 years after it ws written. Or a faith that continues to inspire 2,000 years after is was started.




# Friday, July 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>, 2021 at Missouri State University

Steubenville STL Mid-America is a high-energy youth conference where thousands of teens are invited to encounter Jesus Christ through dynamic speakers, engaging music, the Sacraments, small group discussions, and fellowship with other teens. Our conference is an outreach of Franciscan University in partnership with the Saint Louis Archdiocesan Office of Youth Ministry. Two conferences are held every year in July and take place on the campus of Missouri State University in Springfield, MO.

This retreat is open to all incoming freshman through graduated seniors!

We will depart from Saint Louis for Springfield via charter bus on Friday July 9th, 2021. Following the conclusion of the conference on Sunday July 11th, 2021, we will return to Saint Louis by late afternoon/early evening.

Event Begins: 7:45 AM Friday, July 9, 2021 -- we depart QAS following 8:15 Mass. Event Concludes: 5PM Sunday, July 11, 2021 -- we depart MO State around 12:30 p.m. Cost: \$275 - includes transportation, all on-site meals, housing, group t-shirt.



#### THE MOST PRECIOUS GIFT YOU MIGHT SELDOM USE

You say to yourself: I know I would be much happier if I could just figure out the struggles in my life and if I could find a little more peace. You want peace, so receive peace. After Christ's Resurrection, the apostles were still in fear and behind locked doors when Jesus stood among them and said, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And then Christ breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit" (John 20:21-22). In a sense, as the wind carries the spoken word, the Word (Logos, Christ) is revealed through the Breath (Holy Spirit). And, far more than a wisp or drifting wind, the Holy Spirit is a person prepared to give you real gifts that you can use today.

God is Love and the virtue of love is the first gift of the Holy Spirit (CCC 733). The first effect of the gift of love is forgiveness of sins. By the virtue of faith, we are able to recognize and believe in God. We live out our faith through charity. Through hope, we desire eternal life with our Creator as our happiness. Hope inspires our actions and helps purify our life. And so, through the power of the Spirit and these theological virtues we can enjoy the fruits of the Spirit which are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Gal 5:22-23).

The sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation collectively are the "sacraments of Christian initiation." The sacrament of Confirmation is essential for the completion of Baptismal grace by which we are more deeply rooted in divine filiation, incorporated more firmly into Christ, and enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit (CCC 1285, 1316).

While you may recall the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, have you ever considered how they can help in everyday life? In the *Summa Theologiae*, St. Thomas Aquinas explores the practical realm of moral theology for the Holy Spirit's gifts.

- Wisdom is the knowledge and judgement about 'divine things' and the ability to judge and direct human affairs according to divine truth.
- Understanding is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our salvation.
- **Counsel** allows us to be directed by God in matters necessary for our salvation.
- **Fortitude** is a firmness of mind in doing good and in avoiding evil, especially when it is difficult or dangerous to do so, and the confidence to overcome all obstacles, even deadly ones, by virtue of the assurance of everlasting life.
- **Knowledge** is the ability to judge correctly about matters of faith and right action, so as to never wander from the path of justice.
- **Piety** is, principally, revering God with filial affection, paying worship and duty to God, paying due duty to all people on account of their relationship to God, and honoring the saints, and not contradicting Scripture.
- Fear of God is a 'filial' fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from Him, not out of fear of punishment but out of love.

Aquinas explains that the virtue of charity is the key that unlocks the potential power of the seven gifts, which will remain dormant in the soul after baptism unless acted upon. St. Augustine of Hippo famously stated, "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You." And, the goal of these virtues, gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit is the attainment of the beatitudes described by Christ in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5: 3-11). If you want to experience mercy, to be comforted, to feel peace, and to be satisfied, turn to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity. The Church, therefore, invites us to call upon the Holy Spirit every day, especially at the beginning and the end of every important task (CCC 2670). "Come, Holy Spirit."

So, which gifts of the Holy Spirit do you want to use today?

On Easter Sunday worshipers were given a bottle of holy water to take home. (We have more bottles available so feel free to take another one). We also have a silver container along the back wall of church which has holy water within. When you have used the holy water you took home, you may refill your bottle from that container.



#### 80 YEARS STRONG

Back when I was in fifth grade, many moons ago, my CYC soccer team played in the Archdiocesan City/County playoffs. I remember playing on Aviation Field in Forest Park. We played St Philip Neri. People said they were good. People were right. I didn't know it then, but St Philip Neri had an impressive CYC soccer history. Soccer games in horrid weather, rivalries with a neighboring parish, the really good player on your team, or the really goofy guy who made it fun for all.

Often times, we recall a CYC coach who made an impact on our life. They were the coach who made the CYC experience fun. They always cared about how you were doing. They took the time to teach the game the right way. They made you feel special, even if you were the last kid to get in the game.

The CYC mission is *Building Communities of Faith Through Sports*. Over the years, CYC has given us the opportunity to be connected to our faith community; our parish. For many, that connection is strengthened by playing sports at the parish. Coaching CYC sports is a ministry in your parish. We are teaching our kids through the CYC core values of *faith*, *sportsmanship and service*. Our athletes are given the opportunity to learn valuable life lessons through sports.

This year, we would like to do some fun things to commemorate our 80th anniversary. Here are a few things we would like to do:


- Recognize three generation families who have participated in CYC sports.
