"...For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things and I consider them so much rubbish, that I may gain Christ..." (Philippians 3:8)

Sharing all of our gifts - our time in prayer, our talent in charitable works and our treasure to support the Church helps us keep God first in everything. It helps us from putting other gods before God. It helps us from becoming a slave to our possessions. It helps us to use our gifts for the glory of God and not for the glory of ourselves.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

In June of 1963, while still a teenager, Brian Sternberg, of the University of Washington, broke the world record in the pole vault. A month later he broke it again. Not only was he the world's best pole vaulter, he also was America's Trampoline champion, doing all sorts of flips and somersaults while high in the air.

Grant Teaff, a former college football coach, writes about Sternberg in his book, I Believe. Teaff comments how he watched Brian perform the day he set his second world record. "The thing that caught my eye," Teaff penned, "was his poise and confidence, and the fact that he

never smiled."

A month after that second fantastic record Brian went to a gym to practice the trampoline. He did a triple somersault and landed badly on the trampoline. His neck hit the edge, snapping it and leaving him totally paralyzed, able to move only his eyes and his mouth. Brian was left a helpless, hopeless cripple and a very bitter young man.

Five years later, Coach Teaff saw Sternberg again at a convention of coaches and athletes in Colorado. The auditorium was totally dark. Suddenly a projector lit up a screen, and there was Brian Sternberg racing down a runway executing that record-breaking pole vault. Every coach and athlete oohed and aahed.

Then the auditorium went totally dark again, except for a single spotlight shining on a single chair on the empty stage. Out of the shadows emerged a huge football player carrying in his arms what looked like a big rag doll. Its long arms and legs hung limp at its sides and flopped this way and that. The rag doll was six-feet, three inch Brian Sternberg who now weighed just eighty-seven pounds.

Brian was placed in the chair and propped up with pillows to keep him from falling over. Then in a raspy voice he began to speak. "My friends," he began, "I pray to God that what happened to me will never happen to one of you. Oh, I pray that you will never know the humiliation, the shame of not being able to perform one human

"Yes, I pray to God you will never know the pain I live with daily. It is my hope and my prayers that what has happened to me will never happen to you." And he paused, and collecting himself continued, "Unless, my friends, this is what it takes to put God in the center of your life."

His words were electrifying. No one there would ever forget them.

Before his accident, Brian had been agnostic, he had no use for prayer. But, a college friend visited him every day in the hospital and she introduced him to Jesus Christ. The introduction went terribly, Brian in his bitterness was in no mood to meet, learn, or pray to anyone, even the Son of God. Eventually, though, the Spirit worked in Brian's heart and a smile came to his face; Jesus was with him. Sure, he'd rather be anyplace but a wheelchair, but he rejoiced that it led him to Christ.

That woman caught in adultery, I'm sure, would rather have been anywhere rather than standing in the middle of that angry crowd. How humiliated and embarrassed she must have been; shame flowed from every pore. But it brought her to Jesus Christ. The crowd may have wanted her dead, Jesus promised life. The crowd could only accuse, Jesus could only forgive. The crowd drifted away, Jesus stayed near her. Surely, she had regrets, but, like Brian Sternberg, she possessed joy. She encountered Jesus Christ.

Who is Jesus Christ to you? How would you answer his question, "Who do you say that I am?" Come this week to hear the answers of four wonderful priests. All once assigned here, Frs. Stanger, Vien, Fallon and Fonseca will, through their words, guide us in our own relationship with our Lord. Don't let this special week pass by. Discover the joy of having Jesus at the center of your life.

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(John 3:16-17)

The Church has always helped us fulfill these words of Jesus by prescribing very definite penance for all Catholics, so that we too might have Eternal life. Accordingly, the Pope and the American Bishops have outlined obligatory fast and abstinence as follows:

Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022), all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (April 15, 2022) are days of abstinence (refraining from meat) for all Catholics from age 14 onwards. On these two days, (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday), fast as well as abstinence, is also obligatory for those from the ages of 18-59. Abstinence means refraining from meat. Fast means one full meal a day, with two smaller meals and nothing between meals (liquids are permitted). No Catholic will lightly excuse himself or herself from this obligation.

We should strive to make all days of Lent a time of prayer and penance.




