FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

There's an old story that, when the Battle of Waterloo was being fought in 1815, the people in England were dependent upon a system of signals using flags to learn news of the battle being fought across the English Channel in Belgium - against the French army led by Napoleon Bonaparte. One of these signals was on the tower of Winchester Cathedral.

Late in the day a disheartening signal was flashed - "General Wellington defeated." Just at that moment one of those sudden English clouds of the fog obscured the signal, and the whole countryside was plunged into deep despair. Suddenly the fog lifted and the remainder of the message became clearly visible: "General Wellington defeated... the enemy." Within a matter of several minutes sorrow was turned into joy, and defeat was swallowed up in victory.

How many walked down the hill from Calvary convinced Jesus had been defeated? How heavy was the pall of grief that descended upon the eleven remaining Apostles? How giddy was the laughter of those who had shouted "Crucify Him!" Why wouldn't they laugh? After all, the message was clear - Jesus defeated. He had to be because they put his dead body in a tomb.

Terrible the sorrow for those who trusted Jesus. Wide the smiles for those who wanted him killed. Deep the despair that settled over those in Jerusalem who had pinned their hopes on Jesus.

But then this day arrived - This Easter Day, This Day of the Resurrection. Good news begins to circulate, relayed not by flags but by Jesus himself - resurrected and alive. This message also was clear - Jesus defeated... the enemy.

For too long, for centuries, sin and death had had their way with humanity. Sin always seemed to win, plunging humanity into sorrow and guilt. Death was unavoidable and final. Men and women could do nothing to stop it. They could only wait forlornly for its arrival. The signal was clear.

Not anymore. Jesus has been raised up. Prophecies have been fulfilled, promises have been kept. All God's children have been given hope. In the time between Good Friday and Easter Sunday sorrow has been turned to joy and death has been swallowed up in victory.

This is fantastic news for us who continue to live in a time of pandemic, and a time of increasing moral and political turbulence. Oh, how we need this Easter Day! How we need to share in this victory and revel in this triumph. Worry? Fatigue? Fear? We have no use for any of that. Why would we? Jesus defeated ... the enemy.

I am thankful to all who made Holy Week and Easter Day beautiful expressions of our faith through music, song, and praise. Our church was wonderfully decorated and our volunteers admirably carried out their task. Their service helped us all.

May this Easter Day bring to you much happiness. May the Resurrection of Jesus Christ inspire you to follow Jesus always. May God bless all of you now and forever.

Registration is now open for the 2021 - 2022 PSR School Year.

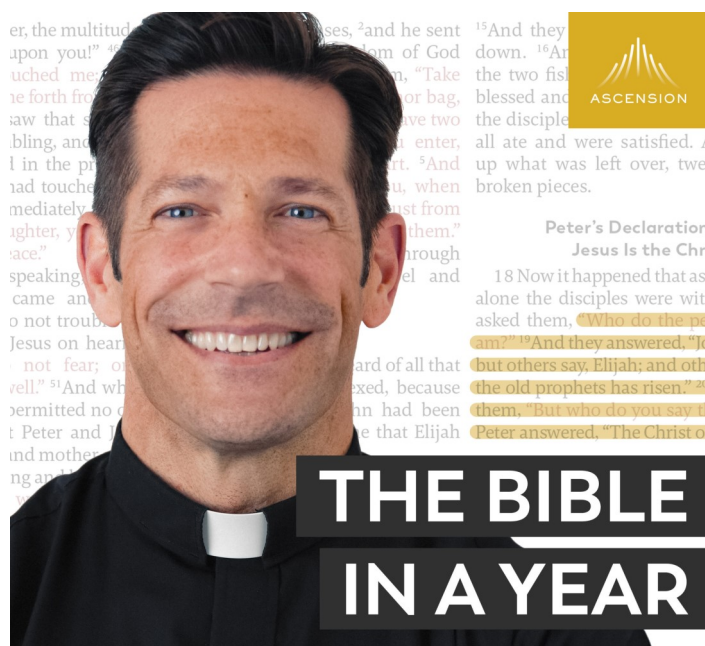

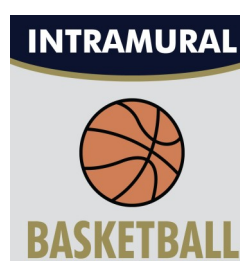

It was Mary. Who saved his life? It was Joseph."

~Blessed William Joseph Chaminade

What Did St. Joseph Say?

If actions speak louder than words, then St. Joseph needs to learn to use his "inside voice." In contrast to the lack of St. Joseph quotes in the Gospels, the actions of St. Joseph speak volumes about how each of us should live. In Pope Francis' apostolic letter *Patris Corde*, we remember the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church and usher in the Year of St. Joseph. But more importantly, we see the critical role fathers have in the life of the family, the Domestic Church.

Like us, St. Joseph experienced worry, fear, anguish, and struggles. He managed these feelings with faith, hope, and charity. He was trusting, courageous, selfless, compassionate, obedient, dedicated, and just. As the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the legal adoptive father of Jesus, St. Joseph was their companion, protector, witness, teacher, guide, and support.

Imagine Mary betrothed (married but not yet living together) telling Joseph that she was going to have a baby but he was not the father. Joseph's first thought was to not hurt or expose her but divorce her quietly. This thought dissipated when the angel told Joseph to take Mary into his home as his wife. In faith and without hesitation, he 'did'. What a small word with big consequences. Joseph accepted as his vocation to love with all of his heart and all his abilities and place everything at the service of the Messiah and Mary (cf *Patris Corde*, 1.). Joseph truly loved Mary unconditionally. As husbands we, too, are called to love our spouses with unconditional, sacrificial love giving them all the dignity and respect we should give our Blessed Mother.

Just before the birth of Jesus, as the family complied with the census decree, Joseph showed his strength as guardian and guide as he led the family to Bethlehem, a distance of nearly 90 miles. Staying at Mary's side, he protected them. Forty days later, with strong religious faith, Joseph presented the newborn Savior in the temple in obedience to the Torah. There we learn that Mary and Joseph were not wealthy offering only two turtle doves; but Joseph worked hard to support his family (cf. Lev 12:8, Lk 2:22). Also during the presentation in the temple, we hear Simeon tell them of the glories to come but foretells to Mary "and a sword will pierce through your soul also" (Lk 2:35). Again, Joseph is there to protect and console his wife. What a terrific value there is in being present for our family.

Soon after the presentation in the temple, St. Joseph is told by an angel to flee to Egypt for the safety of his family. Quickly, with faith and courage, Joseph and his family became migrant refugees obeying God's word. Are we prepared to give up our comforts, our hobbies, and our time for the good of our wife and children? And, do we treat immigrants, like Mary and Joseph, with dignity and respect as God's children?

The last time we encounter St. Joseph in the Gospels is during the annual 64-mile trip to Jerusalem for the Passover. Young Jesus is separated from Mary and Joseph. For three agonizing days they anxiously searched for Jesus. Afterward, they returned to Nazareth where "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man" (Lk 2:52). As Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, St. Joseph was by His side teaching, giving good example, working, and praying as a family.

St. Joseph is a great intercessor and the perfect dad. So, how are we doing? Do we cherish our wife as the greatest gift on earth? Do we see our children as our most priceless gifts from God? Do we spend quality time together as a family? Does our family see us on our knees in prayer? Do we, as a family, pray together and receive the sacraments regularly? Do we see our primary goal in life as helping our wife and children enjoy total happiness with an intimate relationship with God in Heaven? What is St. Joseph telling us right now?

It's not too late. Act.
