FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

People who went to Catholic schools prior to the late 1960's remember the Religious Sisters who taught us wearing the long, traditional habits. You may remember also the custom - at least at St. Gregory School, where I went - of being sent in pairs to deliver a message from the teacher to the principal. In the primary grades we were told to hold hands as we walked - one boy and one girl. Upon arrival at the office we were to stand quietly and respectfully while Sister read the

message.

On one occasion a girl and I were selected to deliver a message to Sister Mary Emma, C.S.J., the school principal. I looked at her closely as she sat behind a big desk reading the note. She looked so imposing. The veil covered her head, the wimple surrounded her face, and she peered at us through her spectacles. She was downright intimidating and I couldn't wait to get out of there.

About twenty years later I stood outside the St. Louis Cathedral greeting parishioners as the newly-assigned deacon. Aided by a cane, a short, thin, elderly woman wearing a veil hobbled up to me and welcomed me to the parish, introducing herself as Sister Mary Emma, the same woman who once scared me just by sitting behind a big desk! After we had discussed our time together at St. Gregory's and she walked into church I thought to myself, "I was afraid of you? I was intimidated by you? So small, so thin, so frail?"

In discussing today's Feast of the Ascension, St. Leo the Great wrote:

"As the two Emmaus companions shared their meal with Jesus, their eyes were opened in the breaking of bread, opened far more happily to the sight of their own glorified humanity than were the eyes of our first parents, Adam and Eve, to the shame of their sin.

"Throughout the whole period between the Resurrection and Ascension, God's providence was at work to instill this one lesson into the hearts of the disciples, to set this one truth before their eyes, that our Lord Jesus Christ, who was truly born, suffered, and died, should be recognized as truly risen from the dead. The blessed apostles together with all the others had been intimidated by the catastrophe of the cross, and their faith in the resurrection had been uncertain; but now they were so strengthened by the evident truth that when their Lord ascended into Heaven, far from feeling any sadness, they were filled with great joy.

"Indeed that blessed company had a great cause for joy when they saw human nature rise above the dignity of the whole heavenly creation, above the ranks of angels, above the exalted status of archangels."

Like the younger version of me being unduly intimidated by Sr. Mary Emma, so the fearful apostles and disciples learned they needn't be intimidated by the catastrophe of the cross. Why would they be? Why would we? Not when we realize that our nature is way, way up there in the heavenly realms, even above archangels! How can we be afraid of anything when we realize that one like us, Jesus Christ, sits at the right hand of the Father, praying for us. Today's Feast of the Ascension fills us with great joy and makes us a people who are many things - forgiven, saved, raised up, but never intimidated.

It was great to have Archbishop Rozanski here last Saturday. The archbishop was pleased with his visit and commented on the friendliness of those who greeted him. He told me to assure all of our parishioners that he will be praying for us daily.

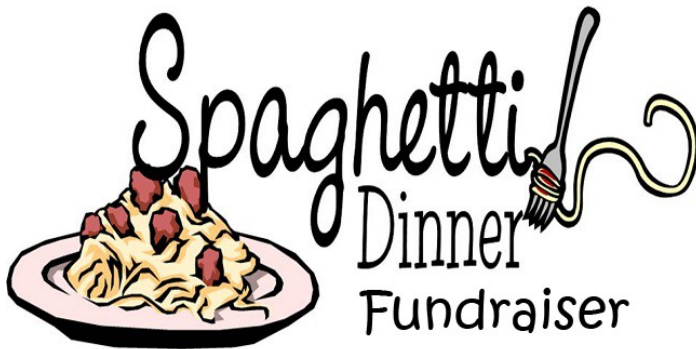

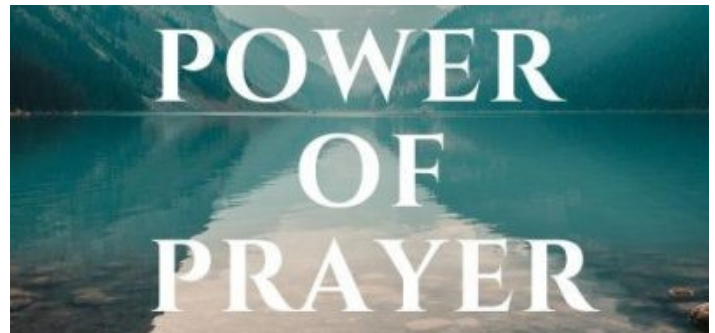

The Queen of All Saints Activities Association is seeking multiple Concession Stand Lead Workers/Supervisors to operate St Louis County's finest sports concession stand.

QAS is seeking a Lead/Supervisor to operate the sports concession stand at the baseball-softball complex. The Lead/Supervisor will be able to coordinate the work schedule between themselves and existing management. Shifts are available Tuesday-Sunday in 4-8 hour increments. Ideally, the applicant will work one to three shifts per week, but this may vary depending on how many are hired.

The concession stand is heated and air conditioned. The stand operates during outdoor sports seasons and shifts are dependent upon the weather; if games are cancelled, then the shift is cancelled.

This position will report to the Concession Manager and the five members of the Queen of All Saints Activities Association Executive Board.

This is a paid position at a rate of \$14.00 per hour, plus one free meal per shift!

Primary duties include:

- Opening/closing of the concession stand for each game day,
- Setting up cash at each register,
- Maintaining a clean facility and exemplary customer service for guests,
- Managing volunteer workers to ensure smooth operations, and
- Ensuring revenues are deposited safely at close each night.

This is the perfect opportunity for someone who enjoys interacting with people, having friendly conversations with members of a parish community and visitors from surrounding parishes and communities.

- Must be at least 18 years of age,
- Previous food service experience preferred,
- Able to lead or supervise employees,
- Effectively delegates tasks and ensures they are completed,
- Knows how to problem solve,
- Ability to count cash and operate a cash register,
- Enjoys a fast paced and social work environment, and is capable of lifting heavy loads up to 50 pounds.

Selected applicants will be required to:

- Complete a Serve Safe Food Safety Class through St. Louis County Dept. of Health.
- Pass a Missouri Background Check.
- Complete the Archdiocese of St. Louis Prevent and Protect course and abide by the Archdiocese of St. Louis Code of Ethical Conduct.

You will then be prompted to submit information for a background screening, register for a ****Protecting God's Children workshop**, view **TWO ONLINE TRAINING MODULES** and agree to the Code of Ethical Conduct. You have to complete **ALL** steps to complete the process.

****If you have previously attended a PGC workshop, the system will find and ask you to confirm your previous record of attendance. You will not be prompted to register for an upcoming workshop.**

You may use the links in your approval checklist to access these requirements. These steps may be completed all at once or may be completed separately at your convenience. Please note: if you do not complete all modules and decide to finish at a later date, **you will need your User name and Password**. You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding. When all compliance requirements have been completed, your account will be approved and you will be clear to work with minors and vulnerable adults.
