Then disaster strikes, we don't get the result that was intended or an unforeseen problem arises. Many times we may respond negatively and ask, "Why me? I did everything right!" Here's the thing -adversity humbles us and reminds us of our dependence on God and not on our own self-reliance. Rest assured, God has a better plan in store for you.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

The fourth century archbishop and Doctor of the Church St. John Chrysostom wrote:

"Therefore in order that we may become of His Body, not in desire only, but also in fact, let us become commingled with that Body. To show the love Christ had for us Jesus made it possible for those who desire, not merely to look upon him, but even to touch him and consume him and to fix their teeth in his flesh and to be commingled with him; in short, to fulfill all their love. Let us, then, come back from that table like lions breathing out fire, thus becoming terrifying to the Devil and remaining mindful of Christ our Head and of the love which Christ has shown us."

At long last permission has been granted by Archbishop Carlson for the celebration of public Masses. Beginning at 6:15 a.m. tomorrow, parishioners will be welcomed into the House of God to approach the Lord's table and be fed by Him. As the saint mentions above, you may become part of his Body, not in desire only, but in fact. The frequent Spiritual Communions which so many of you have made can now be replaced with the Eucharist, that you may actually fix your teeth in Christ's flesh and go back to your pew breathing fire, ready to terrify Satan himself. I'm sure you will be thrilled to be nourished again by the Bread of Life.

The information about the rules covering these public Masses just arrived via email about twenty minutes before I sat down to write this column on a Tuesday morning. I can tell you that there are pages of instructions which we have to implement and restrictions that we have to obey. A meeting with Fr. Philipp, our deacons, various staff members and myself is to take place on Wednesday morning. Information from that meeting may have arrived already at your home via email or the U.S. mail.

As you expected, worshipers will have to wear masks as they come into church, as they approach for Holy Communion, and as they depart church. Proper social distancing also must be observed. We will have sanitizer available and make sure that the pews are sanitized, too. Every effort will be made to assure the good health of all.

The Archbishop's letter and guidelines emphasize that those who are ill and those who have pre-existing conditions which make them susceptible to the virus should not come to Mass. It is not a sin to stay home and avoid any chance of contracting Covid-19! In these cases it is best to continue to pray while watching the Mass on live-stream.

As for the rest, we at the rectory look forward to seeing you again. The conditions for public Masses are not ideal, but it will be great to look out and see you and know that our family - this parish family - is once again coming together to lift our voices in praise of God. The Eucharist means so much to us and it will be a thrill for me to share Christ with you once again.

May God bless all of you.


LIVE VIDEO STREAMING MASS

STAYING AT HOME? GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederj@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

Tips for Married Couples

- •Pray as a couple. Remember that God is the third person in your relationship.
- •Listen to each other. Don't problem solve, don't think about your "to do" list, don't think about how you have heard it all before.

 Just pay attention and listen.
- •Be considerate of each other's feelings and needs.
- •Have fun with each other, even when performing everyday tasks.
- •Resolve disagreements. Don't go to bed angry.
- •Don't make promises you can't keep.
- •Keep little issues from building into big issues.
 Discuss hurts and issues and don't keep them bottled up inside.
- Remember you can't take back your words, so when you are angry, take time to cool off before speaking.
- •Don't be afraid or too proud to be the first to say "please forgive me" after a disagreement. It takes two to argue or fight,
- •Once you have forgiven, don't rehash the issue.
- •Share your feelings with each other. Don't just discuss the nuts and bolts of everyday life.
- •Compromise—sometimes we have to put our relationship first.
- •Schedule date nights and make them important enough to put them on the calendar.
- •Take the time to notice the nice things your spouse does for you, even if they are small things.
- •Affirm each other—remember it is always nice to hear we are doing something good.
- •Say "I love you" often. Don't just assume your spouse knows. It is always nice to hear.




