FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Salvatorian Brother Silas Henderson wrote an interesting article about the importance of young people. Referencing ideas that came from the Rule of St. Benedict, the guidebook for monasteries all over the world, Br. Silas told of the very practical wisdom of St. Benedict, including the saint's balanced understanding of the human person living in a community dynamic. In his "Rule," St. Benedict insisted that the abbot call all the monks together whenever there was important business to discuss: "Let the Abbot call together the whole community and state the matter to be acted upon. . . . The reason we have said that all should be called for counsel is that the Lord often reveals to the younger what is best."

It is my hope that the Lord has done so to our younger parishioners as they finish another school year this week. One can easily tell the excitement is brewing as the final days count down, and surely there will be an explosion of joy following a special 10:30 Mass Friday morning. The beautiful prayer that is the Mass is the last act of the school year and a perfect send-off into summer. May the Lord's blessings and protection surround each student and teacher as they enjoy their vacation.

Of course, by that time our 8th grade students will have already left us. A special graduation Mass will be celebrated Tuesday night for our departing students, some of whom have traversed our school hallways for eleven years. They're ready to go! They will leave, I'm sure, as most of us left our schools, no matter what level of education. They will not miss us too much, they're ready for high school. They will carry wonderful memories. They will grow in their appreciation of the work of their teachers. They will be grateful for the parishioners who sacrificed so much so that they could get an education. And, hopefully, they will have made lifelong friends, people who will laugh with them, support them, and pray with them for years to come. Please keep our graduates in your prayers.

As graduates they will have that bond that graduates always have, that common link to a special place, a special time in our lives. In a similar context it goes like this:

A woman named Ann Weems is a Southerner who happened to be in Wisconsin giving a talk. Before supper on the first night she was there, a man with a Southern accent came up and asked her, "Where are you from?" When she said, "I'm from Nashville," he smiled and said, "I thought so. Who are your people?" And Ann recalls a surge of memories that swept over her. She saw faces and names and smelt the aromas of special food and meals. A simple question brought a flood of recollections.

"I knew what he meant," she said, "'To whom do I belong?' is an ancient question." She continued, "It's a means of identification, a claiming of ties. It can instantly open or shut doors in your face."

Ann told the man about her relatives and he immediately told those near him what she said. There was a recognition, an awareness of community, a remarkable history. They sat and they talked and they remembered. Ann concluded, "We dashed back in time and it felt right. I belonged. I was accepted. I know who my people are."

All graduates know it, too. So do all Christians. We know our people - the saints. We share a common history, one rooted in Jesus Christ. We are endowed with many gifts flowing to us from the Holy Spirit. We can tell tales of sacrifice and mercy and hope. We long to live forever in the same place - Heaven. We are part of a marvelous Church marching through history with a saving message. We do it like it's been done for centuries; because we know who our people are.

LUX - Teen Talk


