For God's plan to work, each must do what we are called to do. Guess what? We are not all called to do the same thing! For God's plan to work you have to do what God is calling you to do and I have to do what God is calling me to do.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In an instruction about the Holy Spirit, the fourth century bishop St. Cyril of Jerusalem quotes Jesus' words as recorded in the Gospel of John, "The water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of living water, welling up into eternal life." (Jn. 4:14)

St. Cyril then wrote: "This is a new kind of water, a living, leaping water, welling up for those who are worthy. But why did Christ call the grace of the Spirit water? Because all things are dependent on water; plants and animals have their origin in water. Water comes down from heaven as rain, and although it is always the same in itself, it produces many different effects, one in the palm tree, another in the vine, and so on throughout the whole of creation. It does not come down, now as one thing, now as another, but while remaining essentially the same, it adapts itself to the needs of every creature that receives it.

"The Spirit makes one person a teacher of divine truth, inspires another to prophesy, gives another the power of casting out devils, enables another to interpret holy Scripture. The Spirit strengthens one person's self-control, shows another how to help the poor, teaches another to fast and lead a life of asceticism, makes another oblivious to the needs of the body, trains another for martyrdom. The Spirit's action is different in different people, but the Spirit itself is always the same. In each person, Scripture says, 'the Spirit reveals its presence in a particular way for the common good."

Jesus many times promised his followers that he would send the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, to guide and direct them, to remind them of all Jesus had to say. Empowered by so great a gift, and beginning on that first Pentecost day, the Apostles began to make known the message of salvation while at the same time teaching through word and action how beautiful the love of Christ can be. What a privilege it is for each one of us to receive that same Spirit and to be fired up with that same faith. We pray to do our part to make our Church a wonderful vessel from from which the greatness of Christ is poured upon every person.

One manifestation of the Holy Spirit that brings much joy and a little suffering is when the Spirit inspires a person to be a school principal. Queen of All Saints has been blessed that for the past few years, Mrs. Gayle Millburg has been relying on the Holy Spirit for wisdom as she has served the staff, students, and parents of our school. A principal's job is no easy task even in non-Covid years, and the work certainly multiplied this year. Being a woman of prayer helped Mrs. Millburg have a steady hand as she steered the school through some choppy water. I know I am not alone as I thank God for her ministry here and wish her well in retirement.

Taking the mantle as our new principal is Mrs. Bethany Beumer, whom we welcome today. As I mentioned here two months ago, our seach committee was very impressed with Mrs. Beumer and quite pleased when she accepted the position. Please welcome Mrs. Beumer to QAS and keep her in your prayers as she prepares to lead our school.

Pray also for the students of the school as they finish this strenuous year on Friday. May God keep them happy and safe while on summer vacation. In a special way, ask the Holy Spirit to direct those leaving our school, especially the eighth graders, who graduate Tuesday night. May they carry the education and the blessings they received at our school to their respective high schools.

The Queen of All Saints Activities Association is seeking multiple Concession Stand Lead Workers/Supervisors to operate St Louis County's finest sports concession stand.

QAS is seeking a Lead/Supervisor to operate the sports concession stand at the baseball-softball complex. The Lead/Supervisor will be able to coordinate the work schedule between themselves and existing management. Shifts are available Tuesday-Sunday in 4-8 hour increments. Ideally, the applicant will work one to three shifts per week, but this may vary depending on how many are hired.

The concession stand is heated and air conditioned. The stand operates during outdoor sports seasons and shifts are dependent upon the weather; if games are cancelled, then the shift is cancelled.




From our Seminarian Jake Braun

My time at Queen of All Saints is coming to an end. As such, this will be my last bulletin entry for the year. It has been fun writing these articles, and I hope that they have been helpful and interesting. For my final article, I want to leave you with some book suggestions. These are texts that have been interesting and helpful for my growth, both intellectually and spiritually.




The Discernment of Spirits: An Ignatian Guide to Everyday Living

This book, by Fr. Timothy Gallagher, O.M.V., served as the basis for my Lenten reflection on finding God in our crazy world. Fr. Gallagher makes Ignatius' Rules for the Discernment of Spirits very easy to understand and employ by giving real-world examples from the lives of the saints. If you are interested in learning more about Ignatius' Rules, this is a perfect text to start with. I go back to this book often when I need to brush up on the Rules.



Augustine's Confessions, Translated by F.J. Sheed

I read the Confessions for the first time during my first semester of seminary. Part theology, part prayer, and part personal witness, this book is St. Augustine's most famous work, his spiritual magnus opus, in which he evaluates his own life, from birth to conversion, and more. I was deeply impacted by this book when I read it, both intellectually and spiritually. It is a book to be read slowly, but still has passages that draw you in by their beauty or tragedy



The Great Heresies

Hilaire Belloc was a historian and Catholic who wrote in the early 20th Century, a contemporary and friend of G.K. Chesterton. This book, which I read before seminary, was what gave me the idea of writing about heresies for part of the year. In it, Belloc covers heresies that I did not have time to write about, such as Arianism, Albigensianism, and Islam (Yes, Belloc argues that Islam is a heretical religion), before turning to the Protestant Reformation and Modernism. For those interested in history and controversial religious topics, this is a fascinating read.




