FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A couple of stories about shepherds in Scotland.

Back in the 19th century British Prime Minister William Gladstone was on vacation in Scotland. As he walked along a country lane a storm came up. The snow began to fall and the wind howled. He noticed the sheep in the area coming up from the hollows and from underneath the trees, going to stand on the bare hillside facing the storm. A little later Gladstone met an old shepherd and said to him, "Are not sheep the most foolish animals? Here is a storm pending and instead of remaining in shelter they are courting the fury of the icy blast. If I were a sheep I would remain in the shelter of the hollow." The shepherd replied, "Sir, if you were a sheep you'd have more sense." Then the shepherd pointed out that down in the hollow snow drifts come, and death. Instinctively the sheep know that their only safety is on the hill, facing the storm.

Another shepherd in Scotland was asked if his sheep would follow the voice of a stranger. He replied, "Yes, when they are sick, but never when they are well. A sick sheep will follow anybody."

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday. Today we are assured by our Savior that He is both the gate and the shepherd. As gate, Christ keeps us safe and protects us from all that could harm us, especially temptation and sin. As shepherd, Jesus leads us to that which gives us nourishment and strength, even if we have to stand on the hill, facing the storm, as we have been these past several weeks. Our shepherd is with us throughout, sending grace into our hearts and glory into our souls.

These events do not cause our souls to sicken nor make us want to follow anybody, even if led astray. No, we stand with our Shepherd we hear his voice, and dutifully we follow Jesus.

Throughout the centuries our Shepherd has chosen others to represent Him in caring for the flock, his priests. "Pastor" finds its roots in the Latin word for shepherd. Today, Queen of All Saints rejoices that one of her sons has moved closer to that role in the Church. The newly-ordained Rev. Mr. Joseph Detwiler now begins his final preparation for the priesthood. Ordained yesterday, Deacon Detwiler soon will begin a parish assignment which will coincide eventually with his academic studies, leading to his priestly ordination one year from now. Please keep the new deacon in your prayers, along with our parish's other seminarian, Adam Pleimann, and all those called to the priesthood.

As you probably know, the U.S. government has approved of the allowance of loans to be made to any small business or non-profit organization. This Paycheck Protection Act applies to churches. Accordingly, the great members of our Finance Council were all over it. Working with our assigned accountant from the Archdiocesan Shared Accounting program, our council members gathered the figures, completed the application, worked with the bank, and submitted the request. The Paycheck Protection Act allows for a forgivable loan to be made to cover payroll expenses through June, along with as much as 25% of utility costs. So, last week I went to Belleville (we used a bank in Illinois) and came home with a check for \$379,750. This will certainly help our parish, for, as you may expect, our weekly revenue is down. Thus, I want to offer a huge word of gratitude to our Finance Council for their wonderful effort.

May God bless all of you.





*A Convert Through Genuflection

In a small work entitled *Genuflection before the Most Blessed Sacrament*, the well-known writer, Gaume, writes:

"You are well acquainted with the Most Reverend Mermillod, that saintly Archbishop and eloquent apostle. He told me that while he was still vicar at Geneva he converted a Protestant without knowing it, by merely making the genuflection reverently before the Most Blessed Sacrament.

"He had the pious custom of paying a last visit to the Most Blessed Sacrament every evening in order to attend to the perpetual light and to see if the doors were locked and to assure himself that no one was hidden in the church, for he feared that a sacrilegious robbery might be committed. When he had carefully looked after everything, he knelt on the altar steps for a short time, after which he made a reverent genuflection, kissed the floor as a sign of profound reverence before the Most Holy Sacrament and then returned home.

"One evening, believing himself to be alone in the church, he finished his devotions as usual. Upon rising from his knees, he was startled by a noise. Suddenly the door of a confessional opened and a very distinguished lady came forth. 'What are you doing here at this hour, Lady?' asked Mermillod.

"'I am a Protestant, as you know,' she answered. I have been present at the sermons you have given during Lent on the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Altar. Your arguments have convinced me of the truth of this doctrine. Only one doubt remained, and that was—pardon me for saying it—does he himself believe what he says? I wished to see if, when alone or in secret, you would conduct yourself before the Holy Eucharist as one who believes in It, and I had firmly resolved to be converted if your conduct corresponded with your words. I came, I have seen, I believe... '

"This lady became one of the most zealous Catholics of Geneva."

On passing the Tabernacle, let us **genuflect devoutly: Genuflecting is not nodding nor curtseying, it is bending the knee. Our right knee should touch the floor when we genuflect before the Blessed Sacrament. One's reverence for the Most Blessed Sacrament may often be judged by the way one makes the genuflection. Holy Church, in her great desire that the Faithful devoutly perform this act of reverence toward our hidden God, grants an indulgence for every time we make a genuflection, and at the same time utter an ejaculatory prayer such as:

"Jesus, my God, I adore Thee here present in the Sacrament of Thy Love."

STAYING AT HOME? GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS



The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. EVERYONE (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)


