

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

The French Dominican priest of the 19th century, Jean Baptiste Henri Lacordaire, penned these famous words about his vocation, and mine:

To live in the midst of the world without wanting its pleasures; To be a member of each family, yet belonging to none; To shade all suffering; To penetrate all secrets; To heal all wounds; To go from men to God and offer Him their prayers; To return from God to men to bring pardon and hope; To have a heart of fire for Charity, and a heart of bronze for Chastity To teach and to pardon, Console and bless always. My God, what a life; And it is yours, O priest of Jesus Christ.

On this Feast of the Holy Trinity my thoughts evolve to God's call to the priesthood. Today is such a special day for Queen of All Saints as one of our native sons returns to our church to celebrate his First Mass. I remember the joy I felt years ago as I stood at the altar in my boyhood church and held in my hands the consecrated Host and the Chalice of eternal salvatioin. Today Fr. Joseph Detwiler will have the same privilege, and experience, as every priest has, the overwhelming immensity of the priesthood, profoundly manifested as he holds in his hands the same elements that Jesus held in his and utters the same words that Jesus spoke at the Last Supper.

Our prayer today for Fr. Detwiler is that the awesomeness of the priesthood is never lost to him. I have every confidence that it won't be, rather, as this new priest ministers in the decades ahead to the point where he is an old priest, he will have with him the joy and enthusiasm that he has today, the second day of his priesthood. May God bless and guide Fr. Detwiler as he begins his priestly life.

As we all know, part of the priesthood is moving to new assignments. Fr. Philipp prepares to do that next month. As he mentioned last week, a priest's first assignment profoundly impacts his future ministry. I know mine did, and I remain grateful to the people of St. Mary Parish in Bridgeton for the love, faith, and support they shared with me. I know Fr. Philipp will always be indebted to the people of this parish and I am sure that you will be in his prayers for the rest of his life. We are planning a time at the end of June for everyone to have a chance to say goodbye to Father.

Another facet of the priesthood is the preparation it takes to get to Ordination Day. Our seminarian, Jacob Braun, gets to experience more of that as he leaves QAS today. It has been wonderful to have Jacob here these past ten months. He has been a great help in many ways - Youth Group, Holy Haulers, PSR, in the school and at the Mass, to mention just some places where he has served. In August he will return to Kenrick-Glennon Seminary, where he will have to get used to doing homework and taking exams again. God will, Jacob will be ordained a priest in 2023.

You are blessed by God to have played a special part in the lives of Fr. Detwiler, Fr. Philipp, and Jacob Braun. I hope each one of them holds a sacred place in your heart. May God bless all of them as they continue to share the Gospel and truly say, "My God, what a life; and it is Yours, O priest of Jesus Christ!"

Dynamic Catholic, *Alive!* -- Most Holy Trinity

I have often heard priests tell me that this solemnity is one of the most difficult days in the liturgical year on which to preach a good homily. It is difficult to preach a homily on such a central mystery of our faith like the Trinity. What is essential to remember for all Catholics is to simply listen to the readings and each of the prayers today for the Mass. Within these texts we can find spiritual insights about the Trinity. For example, the preface for the Mass today provides a great summary of the Church's teaching on the mystery of the Trinity: "For what you have revealed to us of your glory we believe equally of your Son and of the Hoy Spirit, so that, in the confessing of the true and eternal Godhead, you might be adored in what is proper to each Person, their unity in substance, and their equality in majesty." One God in three Persons is always there for us.

The Queen of All Saints Activities Association is seeking multiple Concession Stand Lead Workers/Supervisors to operate St Louis County's finest sports concession stand.

QAS is seeking a Lead/Supervisor to operate the sports concession stand at the baseball-softball complex. The Lead/Supervisor will be able to coordinate the work schedule between themselves and existing management. Shifts are available Tuesday-Sunday in 4-8 hour increments. Ideally, the applicant will work one to three shifts per week, but this may vary depending on how many are hired.

WHERE ARE YOU GOING?

You are cordially invited by the King of Kings and the Queen of Heaven to an exciting, joy-filled wedding feast! With Jesus Christ in her womb, the Blessed Mother became the 'God-bearer', and following Davidic tradition, the king's mother is the queen. And this Queen of Heaven wants your presence at this heavenly banquet. At the banquet, you are guaranteed to have an amazing time and be filled with peace, love, and happiness – as much as your heart and soul can hold.

Most Christians realize the sober reality that rejecting this invitation leads to eternal loneliness, separation from love, unquenchable fire, and torment. In (Mark 9:43-48) and (Matthew 5:22), the message is clear, rejecting the free-saving gift of Christ by turning away in mortal sin through selfishness, pride, anger, or malice has consequences for all eternity.

Many Catholics are aware that those "who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo a purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (CCC 1030). This is similar to stepping outside to see a gorgeous starlit night sky; we want to see it, but our eyes are not yet capable. This teaching not only comes from the Councils of Florence and Trent but from Sacred Scripture (2 Mac 12:46) where Judas Maccabeus made atonement for the dead that they might be delivered from their sin. (See also 1 Cor. 3:11-15.)

Jesus called you to "be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mat 5:48). But did you know to the degree that you are perfect in your selflessness, compassion, forgiveness, and sacrificial love, you can achieve greater amounts of joy, happiness, peace, and love in heaven? It is like a cup or pitcher, both may be full to overflowing, but one holds vastly more than the other.

Similarly, you can develop degrees of perfection that will help you serve better on earth and hold more bliss in heaven. Of course, bliss alone is not the final aim.

As St. Augustine observed, "Our hearts are restless, Lord, until they rest in You."

So, here are the directions to the best party that never ends, some guideposts for your perfection:

- 1. Develop Purity of Conscience "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God." Nurture a conscience that never thinks ill of others, be childlike, and keep an unshakeable interior peace. Pure in heart strips away pretension and cynicism and restores childlike innocence and faith. Purgation is a necessary requisite for spiritual advancement as it involves first a renunciation of sin, rejection of temptation, and a development of charity.
- 2. Grow in Prayer and Authentic Christian Charity Deepen your prayer life. Return to the sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist. Pray daily as a family in praise and thanksgiving to God. Overcome mortal sin and sloth, envy, discord, and quarreling. Grow in the virtue of charity and forgiveness. Be overcome by the burning love of God and relinquish attachments to the world; surrender to God's Divine Will.
- 3. Take up Your Cross and Grow in the Cardinal Virtues Mortification is an important aspect of becoming truly holy. Sanctification does not occur without some suffering. Although it is a blow to one's ego and passions when you empty yourself of life's comforts and pleasures, self-love must completely die and fade into the love of Christ crucified. This is how life's sufferings can be turned into blessings.
- 4. Achieve Perfect Union with God on Earth and in Heaven Nearing Christian perfection, your soul achieves union with God and is not disturbed by failure or excited by accolades. Your soul is always serene and abandoned to God's providence and Holy Will. At this level of perfection, your soul constantly turns to God in thought and prayer. You hunger to hear the Word of God in meditation and prayer.

You have received the invitation. You have the directions. You are coming, right?


