Dear Parishioners,

A Mother's Day story.

#### An Ancient Optimism

In the fourth and fifth centuries, a Christian theologian name Pelagius put forward a new and exciting notion of human nature and the life of grace. The syllogism used to arrive at his conclusion was very simple: 1. Jesus commanded Christians to be perfect as the Heavenly Father is perfect. 2. A just God would not command human beings to do something that is impossible for them to do. 3. Thus, it must be possible for man to attain salvation by his own will. The consequences of this argument are numerous, and its view of creation takes on a similarly optimistic view: Man is not broken or fallen, but simply surrounded by societies that exert negative influences; Jesus' primary mission was to be the perfect example of holiness for man, a counterexample to Adam, who sinned; The path to heaven is within our grasp, if only we would decide to take it by following Jesus' noble example. This fresh view of Christian life spread rapidly throughout the Christian world, with its inhabitants exhibiting extreme discipline and natural virtue. It is not difficult to see how such a view would be attractive in the twilight of the Roman Empire, whose moral and political decay would soon be compounded by the sacking of the Eternal City itself.


Today, this view is known officially as the heresy of Pelagianism. I suspect most Americans have in fact subscribed to this view at one time or another — though not with an intent to be in error. Even a cursory glance at the culture yields an example, from

Few were able to see the wolf hiding beneath the

sheepskin.

Sen. Raphael Warnock, who tweeted on Easter Sunday: "The meaning of Easter is more transcendent than the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Whether you are Christian or not, through a commitment to helping others we are able to save ourselves." Putting aside the apparent contradiction of St. Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians (If Christ did not rise, your faith is vain), we see in the second half of the Baptist preacher's comment the core of Pelagianism: the claim that we are able to save ourselves. This view permeates much of modernity's mistaken idea that utopia can be found here on earth if we just eradicate all sources of evil influence. Marxism, Nazism, and even the neo-puritanism that is invading our culture today, rest on the notion that earthly paradise is not illusory, but real and within reach. To that end, they cry out: "Tear down the statues of Washington and Jefferson! Destroy Lincoln's memorials! No honor for slaveholders and bigots. There ought to be no record of sin or of evil to stain future generations' minds." Of course, this does not end with presidents; soon enough, they will find that no man leaves this world without the scars of his own sins. What happens then, I do not know. Perhaps we will realize how crazy our culture is becoming before we tip into oblivion. One thing I do know is that the Church is built on a solid foundation, and the gates of hell will not prevail against it. She has battled these errors countless times and will always win. Saints are made in times like these, and I expect to see many in my lifetime. All by the grace of God.

#### **ABOUT OUR LADY OF FATIMA**

They were Lucia Santos, Blessed Jacinta Marto and Blessed Francisco Marto. Our Lady appeared to the children seven times and performed a miracle making the sun dance in the sky, which thousands of people witnessed.

She told the children to say the Rosary every day to bring peace to the world and the end of war. This is why Our Lady of Fatima is also called Our Lady of the Rosary. She also requested us to pray the Fatima prayer after each mystery or decade of the Rosary.

This Marian Apparition was approved by the Holy See in 1930.




