FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

Once there was a politician who did his best to serve the citizenry. But being human, he made mistakes and was criticized. Reporters repeated his errors in the newspaper. Commentators on news shows ripped into him, wondering how anyone could have voted for him. The office phone rang constantly, complaints poured in. The man was so upset that he hopped into his car, fled the city, and drove to a farm owned by an old friend. "I

just had to get away. I've tried so hard to represent the people. I'll bet nobody has tried harder than me to do more for the people, and look how they criticize me! What am I going to do?"

The old farmer, though, could barely hear the complaint of his friend because his hound dog was barking up a storm at the full moon. The farmer rebuked the dog several times but Fido just kept on barking. Exasperated at the dog, but illuminated by the barking, the farmer said to his politician friend, "You want to know how to handle your unfair critics? Here's how. Listen to Fido barking nonstop; now, look at the moon. Remember that people will keep yelling at you - they'll nip at your heels, they'll complain about every little thing. But here's your lesson: The dog keeps howling, but the moon keeps shining!"

In today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles we hear: "Paul moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him." That's far worse than a bruising editorial in the newspaper.

Paul, once a persecutor of Christians but now an avid believer in Christ, had a life of faith in which he was punched from all sides. All he wanted was to share the treasurers the Christian faith allowed him to enjoy. And what did he get? Debates, threats, beatings, expulsion from towns, and, eventually, death. Through it all, I'm sure, the moon or sun kept on shining.

Last Monday the eighth graders of our parish received the Sacrament of Confirmation; they were sealed with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. I'll bet they don't have to go far to find folks barking at them, criticizing their decision to follow Jesus, laughing at their commitment, and encouraging them to give up that "holy stuff" and do what they want to do, minus God. Pray for them that they don't ignore the Holy Spirit, that they don't go the way so many, too many, have gone, in the direction opposite of where Christ is calling them. Pray that they'll remember that dogs may howl, but the light still shines.

The Archdiocese has informed us that thus far Queen of All Saints parishioners have donated \$55,600 to the Annual Catholic Appeal. The parish goal is \$173,000. I express gratitude to all who have donated and I encourage all of you to participate in this important charity. If you did not receive a card in the mail, you can contact the parish office or you may donate online.

The only time cards will be cancelled on the 2nd Wednesday of each month is if there is a Funeral Luncheon in the Hall.


Co-Ed Young Adult Retreat



- *Non-Archdiocesan Organization

Select the specific location by name. (ex. Queen of All Saints)

Click the roles associated with your employment/service at that location.

If you are active at only one location, this will be your "primary" location.

If you are active at more than one location, click the ADD PARISH/LOCATION button and repeat the steps above.
