

FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

An old monk prayed many years for a vision from God to strengthen his faith, but it never came. The monk loved God, obviously, and had dedicated his life to the Lord. He had entered the monastery just after high school graduation and with great enthusiasm embraced the ebb and flow of monastic life. He didn't mind rising at 3:00 a.m. each day for the first of the community's offering of the Divine Office. He enjoyed chanting the Psalms with the other monks. He was grateful to receive Jesus every day in Holy Communion. He liked being outside, working in the fields of the monastery farm. It was all so exciting, so refreshing, so holy

exciting, so refreshing, so holy.

Time went by, though, and years passed. Much of the initial enthusiasm waned and monastic life became monotonous, even boring. If only God would come to him, if only he could have a vision of God. It would mean so much, it would restore the joy of his youth.

He had just about given up hope of such a thing ever happening when, suddenly, a vision appeared. The Lord was there! The old monk bowed reverently and smiled broadly. God was magnificent, yet spoke to the monk like an old friend. It was all so amazing. But, then, right in the middle of this sacred vision, the monastery bell rang. The ringing of the bell meant it was time to feed the poor who gathered daily at the monastery gate. And, darn it, today was the old monk's turn to feed them. If he failed to show up with food, the poor would leave quietly - and hungry - thinking the monks had nothing to give them that day.

The old monk was torn between his earthly duty and his heavenly vision. However, before the bell stopped tolling, the monk made his decision. With a heavy heart he turned his back on God and went to the pantry to gather food for the poor. Nearly an hour later, the old monk returned his back on God and went to the pantry to gather food for the poor. Nearly an hour later, the old monk returned to his room. When he opened his door he could hardly believe his eyes. There in the room was the vision. There was God! As the monk dropped to his knees in thanksgiving, the Lord said to him, "My son, had you not gone off to feed the poor, I would not have stayed."

Visions may be fantastic, amazing and wonderful, but the best way to keep God present in our lives is to reach out in service to our brothers and sisters, especially those less gifted than ourselves.

As I write this on a Wednesday morning, I'm sitting in a building that has a door bell constantly ringing. The rectory office is a busy place these days as many people come by with raffle tickets or to collect ride bracelets, among other things associated with the Parish Picnic. The weather promises to be nice this weekend and I look forward with anticipation to enjoying the food, the games, and especially, the people who will be coming. (I think I'm too old for the rides).

Assuredly, in the midst of all this, God will be present. Who but the Lord could inspire so many people to work so hard to put on this picnic? Who but God could bless such an occasion, making it not only fun, but holy? We have many reasons to fall on our knees in thanksgiving.

Today we celebrate God as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. How great it is to honor God our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. How good God is to us!

We could, I suppose, pray for a vision. A vision could help us grow in faith. But like the old monk learned, God absolutely is present in prayer, especially and most beautifully at Mass, but God is there, too, as we serve one another, whether it be the poor at the gates or the patrons at a picnic. God is very good at surrounding us with His love. Thus, with enthusiasm we praise God on this Holy Trinity Sunday.




