FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear Parishioners,

The following letter was received by priests and deacons last week:

A decision has been reached regarding the date for the lifting of the dispensation of the faithful to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. Archbishop Rozanski is lifting the dispensation as of July 1, 2021.

We understand that these continue to be uncertain times for everyone, and we want all to feel safe returning to Mass. Please note that parishioners who are sick, homebound, immune-compromised and gravely concerned for their health retain the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass, which has always been the case in normal times.

In other words, those who have serious illness or extreme difficulty in moving about, do not incur sin by failing to come to Mass after July 1st. If you, or someone you know, would like to receive Holy Communion in their home, please contact the rectory. For the rest, failure to come to Mass on a Saturday night or Sunday morning brings upon them a serious sin, a severe separation from the grace of God, a breach that can only be healed in the Sacrament of Confession. This serious sin becomes more awful when a person, e.g., a parent, teaches younger Catholics to disobey the commands of God. Pray that this does not happen any longer. Rather, let all of us gather around the table of the Lord in thanksgiving for all God has done, especially in helping lessen the scourge of the coronavirus.

With the full re-opening of the churches comes permission for missalettes to be placed in the pews and for all doors to be used for entering and exiting. Choirs may begin to sing at Mass and extraordinary ministers may distribute Holy Communion (at QAS, we will need one extraordinary minister at the Saturday evening Mass and at each Sunday morning Mass).

Until further notice from the United States Bishop's Conference, it is prohibited to offer the Precious Blood to the faithful. It also is recommended not to allow handshakes at the Sign of Peace, so we will not have the Sign of Peace here for the time being.

The number of people attending Mass has been increasing slowly. It will be wonderful to see even more parishioners at Mass. As we celebrated last week in the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we are a people who hunger and thirst for Eucharistic food. The Blessed Sacrament of Holy Communion enriches our lives, nourishes our souls, and compels us to serve others, learning the lesson of service Christ taught when he washed the feet of the Apostles at the Last Supper. This is a better parish and Oakville is a better community when our parishioners hear the Word and swallow the Food offered at Mass.

It is not uncommon for people of faith to wonder why we go to church. What's the use? The world doesn't seem to improve ever. Can't I stay home and pray to God there? Sure, I'd say, if you want the seed of faith to die within you, or die with you. Planted in us at baptism was that tiny seed of faith, like the mustard seed of which Jesus speaks in today's Gospel. But seeds don't grow unless they are nourished and Jesus determined that his Body and Blood would be the nourishment. "Real food and real drink," Jesus said in St. John's Gospel. And this tiny mustard seed of faith will blossom into the largest of plants. It will provide comforting shade to all who come within. After July 1, that comfort is available to everybody. Let us thank God for such a great day.

May God bless all of you.

The Queen of All Saints Activities Association is seeking multiple Concession Stand Lead Workers/Supervisors to operate St Louis County's finest sports concession stand.

QAS is seeking a Lead/Supervisor to operate the sports concession stand at the baseball-softball complex. The Lead/Supervisor will be able to coordinate the work schedule between themselves and existing management. Shifts are available Tuesday-Sunday in 4-8 hour increments. Ideally, the applicant will work one to three shifts per week, but this may vary depending on how many are hired.

The concession stand is heated and air conditioned. The stand operates during outdoor sports seasons and shifts are dependent upon the weather; if games are cancelled, then the shift is cancelled.

PRAY FOR OUR PRIESTS

On June 13, the Church celebrates the memorial of St. Anthony of Padua, a 13th century priest and Doctor of the Church. While he is known as the patron of lost items (and those who seek them), he is also one of the patron saints of travelers. St. Anthony certainly knew all about arduous journeys. In 1221, as he sailed from Morocco to his native Portugal, his ship wrecked off the coast of Sicily.

St. Anthony once wrote: "Christians must lean on the cross of Christ just as travelers lean on a staff when they begin a long journey. They must have the passion of Christ deeply embedded in their minds and hearts, because only from it can they derive peace, grace and truth."

All of the faithful today can take solace in the words of St. Anthony, as we are all in the middle of a long journey in some form or fashion. But even more so, as spring gives way to summer, today's priests can take the words of St. Anthony to heart, as many this time of year are preparing for a difficult journey that is unique to their priestly vocation, transitioning from one parish to another. Beginning a new assignment brings mixed emotions - the excitement of taking on the challenge of ministering to new people in a new place, but also the sadness that comes with leaving a beloved flock of friends and family.



You will receive an automated email weekly to remind you which requirements are outstanding.
