

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I wonder what it tasted like? This food unknown to their fathers, manna come down from heaven. I wonder if it tasted better or worse than the Bread of Life that sustains us today?

The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, popularly known as Corpus Christi, is a great feast that celebrates an unremarkable food, at least as far as taste is concerned. I can't imagine that the manna that was the diet of freed slaves had much taste to it. How could it? They were in a desert. Where were the spices that could enhance the taste or the salt that could flavor the food? I imagine the manna was very bland. But the Lord didn't supply it, so that the flavors would burst in their mouth. God gave it to sustain them on a journey, to empower them to keep on walking to the Promised Land, even if it took forty years.

The Eucharistic Food we share today likewise is not known for its taste and we are forbidden to try to make it more palatable. Who cares? This true food, this true drink, was not given to satisfy taste buds. It was given to sustain, to empower, to keep each one of us moving toward the Kingdom, toward the Everlasting Banquet. Jesus Christ wants us to be with him forever and with great love he provides the nourishment to make that happen. Holy Communion may not look impressive, it may not taste good, but it is a fantastic feast provided by a caring King. May the richness of this food and drink never be lost on us. Instead, may it strengthen us for the journey.

Elsewhere in this bulletin you will read about the Annual Catholic Appeal. I encourage you to consider prayerfully your participation in this important endeavor. Throughout the years the Appeal has helped tens of thousands of people, including every priest who has served here. Please join me in contributing to the Appeal this year.




The 8:15 a.m. Mass on Monday through Saturday continues to be available as well as the 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday.

DYNAMIC CATHOLIC, ALIVE! THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST
(CORPUS CHRISTI) -THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is celebrated on the first Sunday after the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast began with St. Juliana, a young Belgian nun in the thirteenth century, who received in prayer an inspiration for a feast that would celebrate and promote the gift of the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This feast would eventually spread throughout the province, continent, and world. Corpus Christi and its accompanying procession with the Blessed Sacrament, celebrating the sacrament and signifying God's presence in our world and in our lives and reminding us of our common pilgrimage to Heaven, is a prayerful and edifying act of the entire Church. As a general rule, devotions are not mentioned in the Code of Canon Law. However, because of the importance of this devotion in the life of the Church, canon 944 mentions it: "When it can be done in the judgment of the diocesan bishop, as a public witness of the veneration toward the Most Holy Eucharist, a procession is to be conducted through the public streets, especially the solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ." On this feast we can express our gratitude for the opportunity to receive our Lord every Sunday in the Eucharist, to adore Him in prayer, and to show Him to the rest of the world in the streets of our archdiocese.



STAYING AT HOME? GREAT TIME TO REGISTER FOR PREVENT AND PROTECT STL

NEW SAFE ENVIRONMENT REOUIREMENTS

PLEASE NOTE

Due to the pandemic, the Archdiocesan Office has started offering a Zoom Live Session of the original, mandatory Protecting God's Children Workshop to first time people while the stay-athome and social distancing orders are in place. They will continue to add Zoom classes as needed. This is yet another reason to register now in the new system, Prevent and Protect STL, while you may have some time on your hands. If you need assistance, feel free to call me at home at 314-221-3352 or email me at schroederi@qasstl.org.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis has developed a new system for safe environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL. **EVERYONE** (clergy, employees, and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese are required and asked to register in the new system **ASAP**. This includes those new to service and those who are currently in service. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. However, in addition to attending a live Protecting God's Children workshop, all clergy, volunteers, and employees will register for an updated background screening, view two new online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Ethical Conduct. Please read all instructions before beginning. Please allow about 1 hour of your time to complete ALL modules. (You may log in and out at your convenience, if desired.)

NATIONAL FLAG DAY

JUNE 14, 2020

U.S. Flag Behind Statue of Liberty

11 Facts about the American Flag in celebration of Flag Day:

- 1. The American flag's original design lasted from 1777 to 1795
- 2. Flag Day celebrates the day the nation adopted the American flag in the First Flag Act. The date is marked June 14, 1777.
- 3. The First Flag Act declares the flag has, "13 stripes alternate red and white: that the union of thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."
- 4. The 13 stripes on the American flag represent the 13 colonies, and the 50 starts represent the 50 states in the Union.
- 5. The American flag isn't the only thing celebrated on June 14. The date also hold a great significance to the U.S. Army, as it was founded on June 14 just two years prior to the flag's adoption.
- 6. Although nationwide, Flag Day is not a federal holiday because it was left out of the 1986 Uniform Holiday Act. This act established the 11 official federal holidays and three-day weekend holidays nationwide.
- 7. The current star pattern was designed in 1958 by a 16 -year-old student named Robert G. Heft. The design was submitted as a history project, but was later sent to Congress and accepted by President Eisenhower himself.
- 8. Flag Day wasn't celebrated for nearly 100 years after the First Flag Act was established.
- 9. Bernard Cigrant is regarded as the "Father of Flag Day" due to his article "The Fourteenth of June" in the Chicago Argus newspaper. He was the first to propose the flag be observed each year.
- 10. Pennsylvania was the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday in 1937.
- 11. Nicknames of the flag include: "Old Glory," "Star-Spangled Banner," "Red, White and Blue," and "Stars and Stripes."


